Behold, the Lamb of God.

John the Baptist points to where the eyes of our hearts must be focused, the Lamb of God. He points to the Way, the Truth and the Life. The Lamb of God is the one who rescues us from sin, both personal and corporate. Our eyes must be on Him.

Last week on the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, there was an option to read from Isaiah 42:1-7. We chose the other option, Isaiah 55:1-11. In Isaiah 42 it reads, "I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness." This is speaking of a Messiah who would be a covenant. A covenant is an agreement between persons, often indicated by a sign or symbol, or a gesture of some kind. One of the primary symbols of covenant in Israel was the sacrificing of animals, especially the lamb. The literal lamb was still a substitute for what was coming, what was needed.

St. Anselm writes in his *Cur Deus Homo* (Why a God man?) this basic argument:

- God made man for eternal blessedness.
- Man fell from his original state, forfeited eternal blessedness, and ruined the entire race through sin.
- The remission of sins is necessary for fallen man to arrive at eternal blessedness.
- In order for sins to be remitted, satisfaction must be made.
- Only man *ought* to make satisfaction for his sin, but he cannot.
- Only God *can* make this satisfaction, but he ought not.
- Since only man ought to make satisfaction, and only God can, it must be made by a God-man.
- If man remains unredeemed, God's purpose for humanity and creation will be frustrated, which is impossible for an omnipotent Being.
- Therefore, a God-man is necessary for the redemption of humanity

The Son of God must take on our humanity and become the Lamb of God. He is our justification and way of sanctification. Let us keep our eyes on Him.

Tumult

Our world is in tumult. I used this word last week and a person didn't know the meaning. From the dictionary:

tu·mult /t(y)o o m lt/ *noun*

1) *a loud, confused noise, especially one caused by a large mass of people, as in "a tumult of shouting and screaming broke out."*

Similar: din, loud noise, racket, uproar, commotion, ruckus, rumpus, hubbub, pandemonium, babel, bedlam, brouhaha, fracas, furor, melee, frenzy, ado, shouting, yelling, clamor, stramash, hullabaloo

2) *confusion or disorder, as in "the whole neighborhood was in a state of fear and tumult."*

Similar: turmoil, confusion, disorder, disarray, disturbance, unrest, chaos

Opposite: silence

And even worse, as I've said, human lives were lost. All the brouhaha in the world is not worth the loss of a human life. Jesus already gave His to save ours. Sadly, sin still pervades our world and causes fatal conflicts.

I like the opposite: silence. I had to turn the news off Saturday night. It was too disturbing. I was led, as I shared in my 8:30am homily on Sunday, to the *Imitation of Christ*. I opened it to where I last left my bookmark maybe a year ago and it read:

Chapter 3, Book II "Of a Good Peaceable Man"

First keep yourself in peace and then you will be able to bring others to peace. The peaceable man does more good than one who is very learned. The passionate man turns even good to evil, and readily believes evil. The good peaceable man turns all things to good...he who is discontented and disturbed is agitated by various suspicions...to know how to live peacefully with those who are stubborn and perverse, or undisciplined and opposed to us, is a great grace...there are still others who keep themselves in peace and procure to restore peace to others.

Provisionally, someone also gave me *Searching For and Maintaining Peace* by Fr. Jacques Philippe for Christmas, which reads:

To permit the grace of God to act in us and to produce in us (with the cooperation, of course, of our will, our intelligence, and our capabilities) all those good works for which God prepared us beforehand, so that we might lead our lives in the performance of good works (Eph 2:10), it is of the greatest importance that we strive to acquire and maintain an interior peace, the peace of our hearts. I pray that during these challenging times that
"the peace of Christ, which surpasses all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."




St. Stephen the Martyr is Opening




K-5th Grade Programs have started, and you can still join if you register soon.


