Happy New Year and Happy Epiphany! What a beautiful way to start the New Year. New light, new graces, and a new way to serve Our Lord Jesus Christ. I include here the whole Gospel as a map for the coming year. Our Gospel, Mt 2:1-12 reads:

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

These magi had the grace to seek Him. As Jesus says, "Seek and you will find." Often, we aren't aware of our desire for more: more grace, more light, more life. We have been dulled, mollified by the mediocrity of our age. For all our diversity, there is a strange pressure to conform to the culture which increasingly rejects Christian beliefs and values. Popularism creates waves of reaction in many directions, except that is, the direction of Christ, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. How do we find His way?

When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah, since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people, Israel."

Herod was a pseudo-Jew, his parents being mixed Jewish and gentile. He became friends with the Roman occupiers, thus betraying his Jewish loyalties and rejecting the influence of the Hasmonaean dynasty, a remnant of the Maccabean revolt against Greece. In his Jewishness, Herod rightly believes in the Messiah, that he would come and rule Israel. In his worldliness, Herod was jealous of any threat to his power as king, not recognizing that Jesus' kingdom was something totally different and could have complimented his rule with right worship. We, too, can suffer a divided heart, being part Catholic and part worldling, with one foot in heaven and one on earth, attached in an unhealthy way. How do we purify our allegiance to Christ?

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage."

Here, Herod actually gives great advice at the beginning, "Go and search diligently for the child." Would that we did the same. As I quoted Jesus before, "Seek and you will find." Seeking diligently, we will be finding diligently. How fantastic is that?! And what does that look like, searching diligently? Does it mean for me to spend more time in prayer? Or study? Or works of charity? He knows exactly what is needed, what the one thing necessary is. Seeking Him, we will receive more grace to seek as He would have us seek. Because He loves us, He will always guide us to Himself. He wants us to be happy.

After their audience with the king, they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

Stars align themselves according to the King of kings. Magi prostrate themselves and do Him homage. Angels send warnings to protect Him. All is arranged by a marvelous Providence that is as active today as it was 2000 years ago. Jesus wants to make His home in our hearts. Just as He was laid in a manger, a trough for food, so He wants to be laid in our roughhewn hearts, humble as they are. (Could someone please sweep the stall?) He becomes the food for that manger of our hearts that long for love. You, today, are His Bethlehem, which means in Hebrew "House of Bread". You today, are His Bethlehem, which means in Aramaic, "House of Meat". He is both, bread and meat, as the Word becomes flesh and dwells among us.

May the LORD grant you a very merry Christmas!
