### Words from Fr. Ed

### Christian Surrender

"Whatever." Often this word is used as a sigh of resignation to fatalistic indifference. It's perhaps translated as, "I no longer will care about this outcome." It is not Christian surrender or abandonment; no, it is a capitulation to discouragement. Compare this spirit to the word of Our Lady in today's Gospel, "Do whatever He tells you." This is Christian surrender, a ready obedience to whatever God may ask any given moment. It's a disposition that we are all called to foster. Here is the full Gospel from Jn 2:1-11:



There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bride- groom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

Our Lady's counsel is worth considering as a principle conviction for the coming year. Are we ready to obey? Are we free and available? Are we willing? Me? I don't know. I pray for the grace to be. Currently, I'm on quarantine from a COVID positive test 1/6/22. The main effect has been a stuffy nose. I'm grateful it's not worse. Hopefully it will have run its course by the time you read this and my immune system will be the stronger for it.

It makes me reconsider a commitment to taking care of my health. I neglect it, relying on faith to get me through. But we aren't "faith alone" Christians. Catholics are "faith and reason" Christians. St. Thomas Aquinas wrote that "grace builds on nature", it does not deny it or go against it. How can we build on nature? There are certain minimums that health experts recommend. Take your pick. For me, I need to walk more.

Our Lady's counsel is worth considering as a principal conviction for the coming year. Are we ready to obey? Are we free and available? Are we willing? Me? I don't know. I pray for the grace to be. Jesus used water as a basis for the wine. He also uses our bodily health and humanity as a basis for the supernatural gifts that He wants to pour out upon us. We hear of these gifts in our second reading from 1 Cor 12:

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom;
to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit;
to another, faith by the same Spirit;
to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit;
to another, mighty deeds;
to another, prophecy;
to another, discernment of spirits;
to another, varieties of tongues;
to another, interpretation of tongues.

But one and the same Spirit produces all of these,
distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

Do you know your gifts? If not, please check with Beth Nieva, our Stewardship of Talents Coordinator. We have a survey that will help you discover where God has blessed you most abundantly and how you can best serve Him. It helps to know. Your gifts are needed.

Gregory of Nazianzen writes about the need to share:

Christ is bathed in light; let us also be bathed in light. Christ is baptized; let us also go down with him, and rise with him...Nothing gives such pleasure to God as the conversion and salvation of men, for whom his every word and every revelation exist. He wants you to become a living force for all mankind, lights shining in the world. You are to be radiant lights as you stand beside Christ, the great light, bathed in the glory of him who is the light of heaven. You are to enjoy more and more the pure and dazzling light of the Trinity, as now you have received – though not in its fullness – a ray of its splendour, proceeding from the one God, in Christ Jesus our Lord, to whom be glory and power for ever and ever. Amen.






