ST. MARY'S CATHEDRAL OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Welcome to St. Mary's Cathedral

From its dedication in 1926, St. Mary's Cathedral has stood as the gracious center of the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon. The cathedral belongs to the 400,000 Catholics of the archdiocese and serves as a place of ceremony and celebration for those who come here. The cathedral is also a parish church, and as such it is home to its parishioners and a welcoming place for all visitors. More history of the Cathedral can be found on our website.

The cathedral was designed in 1925 by the firm of Jacobberger and Smith. It is in the Romanesque style with some Byzantine features and covers an area of 12,000 square feet. The stained glass windows in the transept date from one of the earlier cathedrals. Statues of the Sacred Heart and the Blessed Mother were brought in by the Benedictine monks of Mount Angel. The Stations of the Cross and the Povey Brothers dome above the altar date from 1926. Other artwork, including the paintings in the apse, the lights, the stained glass windows, the etched windows in the vestibule, and the icons were either installed at the time of the 1996 restoration of Archbishop Leveda or in the years since then.

FROM THE RECTOR

Vicariate visitation - Archbishop Sample will be visiting the Downtown Vicariate the week of 19-23 April. Cathedral parishioners are invited to a 'town hall' meeting at St. Michael's parish on Monday 19 April at 7:00pm. If you would like to attend you can make a reservation by going to St. Michael's website under 'events'. The week begins by Archbishop celebrating the 11:00am Mass here at the Cathedral on Sunday 18 April, he will then spend some time in each of the other parishes of the Vicariate (St. Thomas More, St. Michael, St. Patrick, St. Andre Bessette and St. Elizabeth of Hungary.) On Wednesday night he will spend a Holy Hour with the priests of the Vicariate and host them for a fraternal dinner. The week will culminate with the Vicariate Confirmations which the Archbishop will celebrate here at the Cathedral at 7:00pm one Friday 23 April. This will be live-streamed since numbers of guest are limited. The livestream can be accessed through the landing page of the Cathedral website.

Surrender Novena - the Archbishop is asking all the faithful to join him in praying the Surrender Novena beginning Sunday April 25. This Novena leads up to a special convocation of Archdiocesan priests that will begin on May 4. He asks that you specifically remember the intentions for this retreat and the priests of the Archdiocese. Copies of the Surrender Novena can be found at the entrance to the Cathedral.

Holy Family Catholic Clinic recently opened in W. Linn and is run by a group of faithful catholic doctors who promote the true vision of Church's teaching on life and human sexuality. 

First Reading Acts 3:13-15, 17-19

Peter said to the people: "The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in Pilate's presence when he had decided to release him. You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. The author of life you

put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses. Now I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did; but God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away."

Second Reading 1 Jn 2:1-5a

My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one. He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. The way we may be sure that we know him is to keep his commandments. Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them. But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him.

Gospel Lk 24:35-48

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.

He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses

and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled.” Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, “Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.”

Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. 
