It's a simple, familiar practice for many parishioners: Call the church office, drop it in the collection basket, and hear your intention announced at the pulpit. What some may not be aware of, however, are the deep historical roots behind Mass intentions and the many canonical laws that govern the beloved tradition.

The Second Sunday of Ordinary Time (01-16-2022)

All of us long for miracles at some time or other in our lives. What we mean is a divine intervention like for a healing from a sickness or for success in business, or for a solution to some problems in the family or with friends. The readings of today tell us about the first miracle of Jesus and to teach us to keep our eyes opened to see the many miracles taking place around us every day.

As long as you have a reason to hope for, life becomes worth living. In the first reading God gives his people in exile a description of the good days to come, to instill in them a messianic hope. The Prophet Isaiah prophesies Zion's reversal of fortune. Isaiah understands the importance of not only the city itself, but most importantly, the temple. The temple was the pinnacle of right worship. It was the place where heaven met earth – the divine met humanity. It was the place where God chose to dwell among people. In the second reading, we hear that God has created marvelous things. He has adorned human being with many things. He has given each one of us with our unique personal gifts and charisms to build up the body of Christ – the Church. In the Gospel, Jesus and his mother attend a wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. When they run out of wine, Mary instructs the servers, do whatever he tells you. Jesus turns water into wine.

According to John's Gospel, Jesus performs his first miracle during the wedding feast at Cana. In the Gospel of John, there are only seven miracles of Jesus which he calls "signs". John wants to manifest the magnanimity of God's Kingdom and the divinity of Jesus Christ.

We may learn in this Gospel, that there are signs by the Son of God which enable us to understand his true work of bringing life and renewal to the world. They are external and visible events, symbolic of spiritual realities. The "Wedding Feast" is a sign of the heavenly banquet at the new Covenant between God and his people. In this Gospel, we can see some more signs such as: the hour, the water and the wine. Each stands for a particular meaning. "The hour" stands for the true manifestation of Jesus' power. "The water" meant for the purification. "The wine" stands for joy and peace. Here Mary was instrumental in this miracle.

We all live in a world of Godlessness and God forsakenness. We live with variety of idols, such as the idol of comfort, the idol of pleasure. We desire them more than God. These idols are perishable. We must desire for the imperishable such as: God, faith and good works. Jesus is forever. He is with us always. He is present in the Eucharist. He can do many miracles in our lives. Let us walk with him together. He is the true sign of our salvation.
