Pastor's Column

St. Mary Catholic Parish July 03, 2022 - Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Silence at Mass

Silence is often mistakenly regarded as wasted opportunity for sound; more and more, it seems that people simply cannot tolerate the "sound" of silence. People taking walks or out on a bike ride or a jog always seem to have earbuds stuffed into their ears.

However, silence actually is a profound and graced opportunity to be especially attuned to the voice of God. God often speaks in silence and therefore can only be heard in silence. Consider Elijah the Prophet in the First Book of Kings: he ascends the heights of the mountain and waits for God, and God is not in the earthquake or the wildfire or the hurricane winds; instead, Elijah finds God in that soft, whispering sound...the sound of silence.

Accordingly, the Catholic Church has specifically built in moments precisely for this sort of silence throughout the liturgy of the Mass. One, at the Collect (the opening prayer), the priest says "Let us pray," and a brief period of silence follows in order that we may *collect* our own individual thoughts and prayers and gather them together into the one opening prayer for the Mass. Two, also after the priest says "Let us pray" at the end of the Mass. Three, after the Second Reading before the Gospel Acclamation, there is to be a brief period of silence to prepare ourselves to receive the Word of God proclaimed to us in the Gospel.

These are three very important times for silence during the Mass, but for me personally, there are two times that are particularly important for profound, prayerful silence: before Mass begins and then again at the end of Holy Communion.

Before Mass begins, we are to gather reverently, quietly, and prayerfully in the church so that we can place ourselves in mind, heart, and soul into the presence of the Lord, Whose Holy Sacrifice we are about to celebrate in the Mass. This is a time to collect ourselves, to call to mind whatever sins we humbly need to repent (hopefully having gone to confession prior to Mass so as to be absolved of all mortal sins), and in general to remove ourselves from the noise and busy-ness of the world and so enter into and engage with the holy presence of God. For these reasons and for so many other reasons besides, we need to maintain respectful, reverent silence before Mass begins. Perhaps we ourselves have no use for silence before Mass...but our fellow parishioners do, and so it is at least out of respect for others that we be silent before Mass begins.

Secondly, at the end of Holy Communion. We have just received the Lord into our bodies at Holy Communion: the Sacred Body and Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. This is so incredibly profound that mere words cannot possibly do it justice to describe what is taking place in this very grace-filled moment, this privileged encounter with the Lord. We *need* to have silence after Holy Communion so that we can reflect upon this graced encounter and our personal relationship with God. And so, conversation and shifting about and cell phones blaring their various noises have no place here, but only prayer and silence. It is precisely to allow for sufficient silence at this time why I use that time for purifying the sacred vessels at the altar right after Holy Communion. So do not focus on your priest "washing the dishes" but rather be attentive in prayer to the Holy Communion between you and the Lord that just took place.
