Reconsecration of the Diocese of Great Falls-Billings to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on March 25, 2021

On February 28, 2014, I consecrated the Diocese of Great Falls-Billings to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. At that time, the Diocese was facing serious legal issues as well as a significant deficit in financial resources as a direct consequence. There were many members of the Church who had become angry and alienated as a result of sexual abuse in the Church. There has been a good deal of healing since then, but currently, we are facing another crisis as a result of the coronavirus pandemic and its lingering effects. Many parishioners have been impacted directly by the disease either by contracting the disease itself or needing to quarantine as a result of being in contact with those who have it. Parishes have experienced a limited number of parishioners coming to Mass for fear of contagion. Some parishioners have lost employment and their income needed to provide for their families. Though COVID-19 appears slowly to be lessening, due to mitigation efforts and the role of vaccines, its impact remains an issue. In light of this, I will once again renew the consecration of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, seeking her intercession for our diocese on Thursday, March 25, 2021 at St. Ann's Cathedral during the Mass for the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. This special celebration will be at 5:30pm. Also, as I requested in 2014, I urge all pastors to likewise reconsecrate the territory of their parishes to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Each week we will focus on one or two liturgical ministries with which we need your support. Nick Coffman, our parish Director of Liturgy, has revised all of our parish liturgical ministries to comply with CDC guidelines for health and safety during this time of the pandemic. Lenten Alms Cups Done Differently

The Council of Catholic Women (CCW) asks parishioners to save their loose change during Lent. But keeping all members and parishioners safe during the pandemic means a different kind of collection process. Rather than passing out Lenten Cups at the start of Lent, CCW asks that between Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday weekends, individuals and families keep track of their loose change saved as part of their Lenten almsgiving and send a check for that amount, made out to **St. Pius X CCW**, to the parish office after Easter. This annual fund raiser allows CCW to donate to "Water for Life", the Madonna Plan and locally, to LaVie. CCW thanks all for helping make this Lent one of prayerful giving to these worthwhile projects.

Scripture Reflection: Fifth Sunday of Lent

Ezekiel 37:12-14
Psalm 130:1-8
Romans 8:8-11
John 11:1-45

Any good teacher or parent will tell you that once a lesson is really learned it doesn't need to be taught again. When we internalize things we have learned, they become a part of who we are and influence how we perceive and interact with our world. The same is true for the law God has written upon our hearts. Once humanity learns this lesson, we will simply know it to be true and act accordingly. Sometimes, it is hard to get people to learn the lessons they need to learn. They are often distracted, disinterested, conflicted, misdirected, or just too stubborn and unable or unwilling to see what is right before their eyes. Understanding that God is in a loving and committed relationship with those fashioned and formed in God's own image, seems like such a simple lesson to learn. But history and experience has proven that it is not.

We struggle with faith, especially when that faith asks us to learn something very particular about ourselves. We must, like a grain of wheat, fall to the ground and die. Because God's DNA is at the very core of who we are, there are specific pearls of wisdom that must be acquired before we can live a full life. One very powerful lesson is that it is not the task of the world to tell us who we are and what has meaning, but God. For many, death is not an opportunity for greater life but a permanent ending to the life they have known. Jesus knew every dimension to what it means to be fully human because he was! He knows the joys, limitations, sorrows, frustrations, wonders, suffering and opportunities of the human experience. Jesus can teach us a wealth of knowledge and life's lessons from his example, especially obedience.

When we accept the law God has placed in our hearts and gain wisdom from it, then when we suffer we learn to listen more attentively to the Voice behind that law. We naturally flee to our Creator for inspiration, consolation, hope, direction, and comfort as we navigate through this time of darkness. We will not need to run from it, subdue it, fight it, or be overcome by it because we will know, having internalized this profound lesson before, that God will bring new life. God's law is love and love never fails. Even in the moments of Jesus' deepest despair, he glorified the name of his Father. What he learned allowed him to put everything in perspective and be obedient to the tender, loving Voice that echoed within. As Lent quickly winds down, may we learn the same! Then, may we gain the fortitude and wisdom to help others see what is right before their eyes. ©LPi


