



New Bishop

This Tuesday we will have a rather unique and joyful event in our Archdiocese. Father Frank Schuster, who is one of the pastors in Federal Way, is going to be ordained to be our auxiliary bishop! Father Schuster is a very good priest that I have known the entirety of my priesthood, and even before, and I am incredibly glad that he is being entrusted with the responsibility to be a successor of the Apostles. In an organization such as the Catholic Church, so often those who end up in places of high authority can be "company men" or "politicians" rather than the shepherds and pastors that we would hope for and deserve. Luckily, Father Schuster is not one of that kind; As our Byzantine neighbors would say: Axios! (he is worthy!). He is going to be a very good Bishop for us so long as he is with us (hopefully it will be a good long while, but realistically he is likely to be moved on to be the Bishop of a whole diocese in the course of some years, which will be our loss and their gain in the fullness of time).

Other than encouraging you to attend his ordination on Tuesday, if you are free, which will be at the cathedral in Seattle at 2:00 PM, or at least to view the ceremony on the Cathedral livestream, I would also like to encourage you to pray for Father Schuster now and after his ordination. Being a bishop is a big and difficult job and responsibility, and he will need the support of the Body of Christ to do it well.

I might also take this opportunity to explain what exactly it is that he has been selected for. The Catholic Church throughout the world is a communion of Local Churches, called dioceses (in our Latin tradition) or eparchies (in Eastern traditions), each led by a bishop. Now, there are additional titles such as Archbishop/Metropolitan, Cardinal, Patriarch, or Pope that indicate either the leader of a diocese that is centered in a major metropolitan area and which has some added regional responsibilities to smaller dioceses (Archbohops/Metropolitans), a bishop who has the responsibility to elect the pope when a vacancy occurs (cardinals), the leader of all the Local Churches of a particular tradition who is leader of all Catholics of his tradition in addition to his own eparchy (Patriarchs; this is more easily seen in Eastern Churches, as the Latin patriarch is also the Pope), and the Pope—the bishop of Rome—who is the point of communion between all Catholic Local Churches throughout the world of all traditions (East and West). Each local church is a full instantiation of the Catholic Church, and the bishops are not the subordinates or employees of their Archbishop, patriarch, or Pope (even if and when those individuals have some role in selecting and assigning bishops), and the one bishop is the one and true head of his Church. However, some dioceses, such as our archdiocese, are large enough that one Bishop cannot fully handle all of the responsibilities for such a large area or number of people. Now, in a perfect world, if a territory is so large and populated that one bishop can't handle it alone, and that situation seems to be a permanent one, the territory would be divided into several smaller dioceses/ eparchies. However, that is often too complicated and permanent a move, so instead in such cases, a local bishop who cannot serve a large area alone can request that the universal/worldwide/Catholic Church provide him one or more additional bishops to collaborate with him to serve the people of his Local Church. These additional bishops, who work with another bishop (usually an archbishop or cardinal), are called auxiliary bishops; this is the role that Fr Schuster has been selected to fulfill.


