

Baptism

As I've done a few times before, I'd like to use the next few weeks bulletin columns to talk about a single topic. Obviously, should something urgent come up, it might be interrupted by the need to talk about this or that. Anyway, I'd like to write about the 7 Sacraments and how to receive them.

Baptism is the first of the Sacraments and is the gateway to the others. We cannot fully claim to be Christians until or unless we are baptized. Baptism conforms us to Christ's death and resurrection and gains for us the forgiveness for all past sins and makes us adopted children of God. Baptism is the one and only path to Salvation that Jesus Christ gave to his Church (God can save whomever he likes, however he likes, but with regard to our own actions and manner of life, we can have no sure and certain hope in any path but Baptism and the other Sacraments). I know we know these things, but we perhaps need to appreciate them more. In our own lives, we should be filled with great gratitude and healthy pride for what God has done for us and what he has made us, and we should live accordingly by daily working to turn away more completely from our sins.

Also, parents need to realize more deeply the importance of this sacrament and seek it immediately for their children upon birth. Parents are called to baptize their children *quam primum* (as soon as possible). I honestly find it a bit odd that so many families don't arrange for the baptism well in advance of the birth; it is not like the birth of a child comes from nowhere, you have a (usually) predictable amount of time to prepare. The ideal is baptism within days of birth (I mean that almost literally. Ideally the first ride in a car is back from the hospital, the second is to the church for the Baptism). Alas, quite often in the Church, we so see baptisms of children of several years of age or even kids who are so old that they have to go through the Catechumenate (which is really more intended for adult converts). In the end, we are happy that anyone is brought to Baptism, of course, but for those who are delaying the baptism of a child: Why? Why let your child live one more day without the greatest gift you have to give, the opportunity for salvation? Why deny your child the blessing of being an adopted son of God (and adoption is as good as blood) conformed to the Only Begotten Son; a Christian?
