SPIRITUAL CORNER

READINGS FOR TODAY

First Reading: Those who fear the Lord honor their parents.
(Sir 3:2-6, 12-14)

**Angelus Address: On the Feast of the Holy Family
Pope Francis St Peter's Basilica, DECEMBER 31, 2017**

In this first Sunday after Christmas, we celebrate the Holy Family of Nazareth, and the Gospel invites us to reflect on the experience lived by Mary, Joseph, and Jesus, while they grow together as a family in mutual love and trust in God. Expression of this trust is the rite fulfilled by Mary and Joseph with the offering of their son Jesus to God. The Gospel says: "They brought the babe up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord" (Luke 2:22), as the Mosaic Law required. Jesus' parents go to the Temple to attest that their son belongs to God and that they are the custodians of his life, not the proprietors. And this makes us reflect. All parents are custodians of their children's life, not proprietors, and they must help them to grow, to mature. This gesture underlines that God alone is Lord of individual and family history; everything comes to us from Him. Every family is called to acknowledge this primacy, protecting and educating the children to open themselves to God who is the very source of life. The secret of interior youth passes by here, witnessed paradoxically in the Gospel by a couple of elderly <persons>, Simeon and Anna. Old Simeon, in particular, inspired by the Holy Spirit, says about the child Jesus: "This child is set for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is spoken against that thoughts out of many hearts may be revealed" (vv. 34-35). These prophetic words reveal that Jesus came to have the false images fall that we make of God and also of ourselves; to "contradict" the worldly securities on which we attempt to lean; to make us "rise again" to a genuine human and Christian way, founded on values of the Gospel. There is no family situation that is precluded from this new way of rebirth and resurrection. And every time families, including those wounded and marked by frailty, failures and difficulties, turn to the source of Christian experience, new ways and unimaginable possibilities open.

Today's evangelical account says that Mary and Joseph "when they had performed everything according to the law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own city, Nazareth. And the child grew - says the Gospel - and became strong, filled with wisdom, and the favor of God was upon him" (vv. 39-40). We all know that the growth of children is a great joy of the family. They are destined to develop and to grow strong, to acquire wisdom and receive God's grace, precisely as happened to Jesus. He is truly one of us: the Son of God makes himself a child, accepts to grow, is strengthened, is full of wisdom and the grace of God is upon Him. Mary and Joseph have the joy to see all this in their son; and this is the mission to which the family is oriented: to create the favorable conditions for the harmonious and full growth of their children so that they can live a good life, worthy of God and constructive for the world. This is my wish for all families, accompanying it with the invocation to Mary, Queen of the Family.

SPIRITUAL CORNER

LECTURAS DE HOY

Prima Lectura: Quien teme al Señor honrará a sus padres.
(Is 3, 3-7. 14-17a)

Salmo: Dichoso el que teme al Señor. (Sal 127, 1-2. 3. 4-5)

(Col 3, 12-21)

En la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia

Plaza de San Pedro Domingo 31 diciembre de 2017

En este primer domingo después de Navidad, celebramos la Santa Familia de Nazaret y el Evangelio nos invita a reflexionar sobre la experiencia vivida por María, José y Jesús mientras crecen juntos como familia en el amor recíproco y en la confianza en Dios. De esta confianza es expresión el rito cumplido por María y José con el ofrecimiento del hijo Jesús a Dios. El Evangelio dice: «Llevaron a Jesús a Jerusalén para presentarle al Señor» (Lucas 2, 22), como requería la ley de Moisés. Los padres de Jesús van al templo para confirmar que el hijo pertenece a Dios y que ellos son los custodios de su vida pero no son los propietarios. Y esto nos hace reflexionar. Todos los padres son custodios de la vida de los hijos, pero no propietarios y deben ayudarlos a crecer, a madurar. Este gesto subraya que solo Dios es el Señor de la historia individual y familiar; todo nos viene por Él. Cada familia está llamada a reconocer tal primado, custodiando y educando a los hijos para abrirse a Dios que es la fuente de la misma vida. Pasa por aquí el secreto de la juventud interior, testimoniado paradójicamente en el Evangelio por una pareja de ancianos, Simeón y Ana. El viejo Simeón, en particular, inspirado por el Espíritu Santo dice a propósito del niño Jesús: «Este está puesto para caída y elevación de muchos en Israel y para dar señal de contradicción a fin de que queden al descubierto las intenciones de muchos corazones» (vv. 34-35). Estas palabras proféticas revelan que Jesús ha venido para hacer caer las falsas imágenes que nos hacemos de Dios y también de nosotros mismos; para «rebatir» las seguridades mundanas sobre las que pretendemos apoyarnos; para hacernos «resurgir» hacia un camino humano y cristiano verdadero, sobre los valores del Evangelio. No hay situación familiar que esté excluida de este camino nuevo de renacimiento y de resurrección. Y cada vez que las familias, también las heridas y marcadas por la fragilidad, fracasos y dificultades vuelven a la fuente de la experiencia cristiana, se abren caminos nuevos y posibilidades inimaginables. El relato evangélico de hoy refiere que María y José, «cumplieron todas las cosas según la Ley del Señor, volvieron a Galilea, a su ciudad de Nazaret. El niño crecía - dice el Evangelio - y se fortalecía, llenándose de sabiduría; y la gracia de Dios estaba sobre él» (vv. 39-40). Una gran alegría de la familia es el crecimiento de los hijos, todos lo sabemos. Estos están destinados a desarrollarse y fortalecerse, a adquirir sabiduría y a acoger la gracia de Dios, precisamente como sucedió a Jesús. Él es realmente uno de nosotros: el Hijo de Dios se hace niño, acepta crecer, fortalecerse, está lleno de sabiduría y la gracia de Dios está sobre Él. María y José tienen la alegría de ver todo esto en su hijo; y esta es la misión a la que está orientada la familia: crear las condiciones favorables para el crecimiento armónico y pleno de los hijos, con el fin de que puedan vivir una vida buena, digna de Dios y constructiva para el mundo. Es este el deseo que dirijo a todas las familias hoy, acompañándolo con la invocación a María, Reina de la Familia.

Hermanas y hermanos, la familia es sagrada porque nace de Dios. Es anterior al Estado y a sus leyes, y por supuesto, va primero que los acuerdos entre los mismos Estados o las conveniencias de las empresas o asociaciones humanas. De Dios viene toda paternidad, nos enseña Pablo (Ef 3,15). Dar origen a la vida humana es asemejarse demasiado a Dios, y por ello es preciso que la paz, la bondad y la sabiduría de Dios abunden allí donde ya se hizo presente su magnífico poder.

Así como la Iglesia ha sostenido que existe el principio de la "defensa propia" que da un matiz particular al mandamiento de no matar, así también en la honra al padre y a la madre se entiende el deber previo de descubrir qué hay en ellos que sea digno de honra. Esto no disminuye nuestro deber sino que lo aquilata, porque puesto como un enunciado general nos está indicando que siempre hay algo honorable, algo que pide reverencia y gratitud en aquellos que nos han dado algo que no podemos retornarles de ningún modo.

Así que, aunque en todo lo demás fallaren, es claro que en el misterio de ser instrumentos de la vida hay siempre un misterio de donación en que Dios se ha hecho presente, y por tanto requiere nuestra gratitud y honra. La Familia en el Pensamiento de San Pablo: Lo primero es que cada miembro de la familia se reconozca como "elegido" por Dios, sumergido en la gracia, bañado por el perdón, fortalecido en la paz, iluminado por la Palabra, lleno de motivos de gratitud y gozo. Sin esta base, la familia será pacto de intereses no santuario del amor divino.

Sobre esta base se comprende que en la familia hay un misterio de complementariedad que es propio de la vida cristiana entera. Los deberes y derechos, aunque Pablo no utiliza esa terminología en su Carta, tienen un doble referente. En primer lugar, hacia adentro, lo que cada uno tiene de propio y peculiar, esto es: la mujer es mujer, y el hombre es hombre; el papá es papá, y el hijo es hijo. No son "seres humanos" abstractos, idealmente igualados por un concepto racional, sino historias particulares que Dios conoce bien y desde dentro. Lo que les hermana no es una naturaleza abstracta expresada en derechos ante una ley positiva, sino la condición de creaturas amadas, pecadoras y redimidas. ¿Qué es la familia, según el apóstol Pablo? Es la expresión del amor cristiano sanando, bendiciendo y fecundando los orígenes mismos de la vida humana.

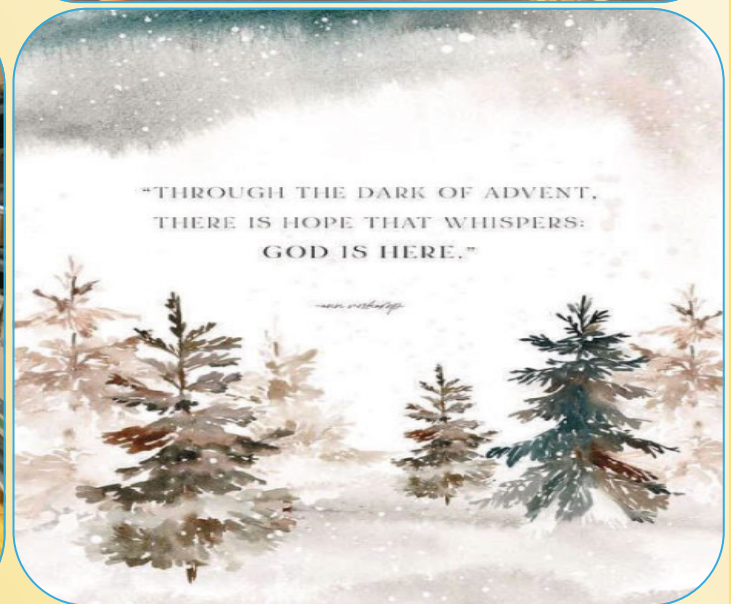
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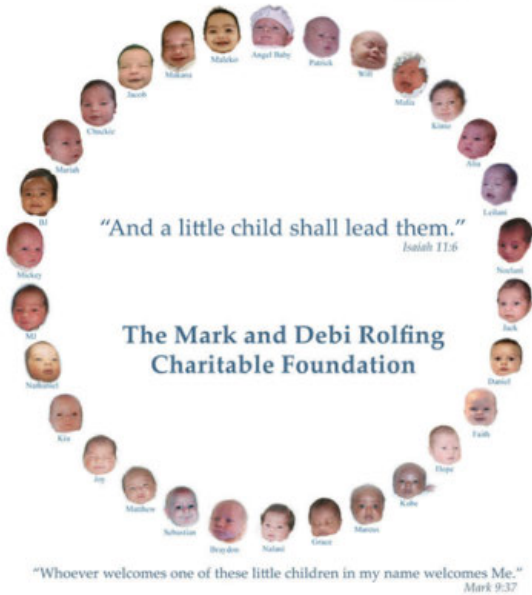

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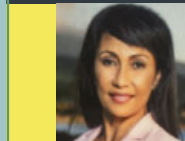


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
