

### A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

## **Greetings in the Lord!**

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles, some disciples and the Blessed Virgin Mary. It has been a tradition to celebrate this feast fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus from the dead and ten days after the celebration of His ascension into heaven. Two celebration mysteries that reaffirm the divine nature of Jesus, his rising from the dead and his return into glory. A reaffirmation that the faith that we treasure is one that gives us hope that Jesus indeed has saved us and will lead us into the bosom of his Father, "in my Father's house there are many rooms," which he will prepare for us his disciples.

On this feast of the descent of the Holy Spirit which has been considered by many as the actual beginning of the Church as a community of disciples who heeded the call of Jesus to conversion and believed in his message of salvation in the Kingdom of his Father, I would like to continue my reflections on the reality that the Church that Jesus established with the coming of the Holy Spirit, is a community of disciples who should be active witnesses of the saving action of Jesus in the world today. Hence, there are three points that I wish to share with you in today's reflections.

First, the disciples who heeded the call of Jesus for conversion and faith in the Kingdom of his Father, are a community of disciples. This means that being disciples; those who compose the community are followers of their Master whom they should personally know, humbly obey and faithfully follow. Among the many precepts of Jesus as Master, one that every true disciple must keep in his heart and put into practice daily is what Jesus clearly proclaimed: "a new commandment I give you: love one another as I loved you." One who claims to be a disciple but would not actually love his fellow men "as Jesus loved" by totally giving himself even until death on the cross in loving obedience to His Father, can never be a disciple. In fact this act of fully giving of self to others is the foundation of the disciples into a community of love. It is only in belonging to a community of love can one truly be converted and believe in the Kingdom of God.

Second, membership in this Church that is a community of love demands an outward manifestation of one's identity. This outward manifestation is concretely made when every member of this community becomes a living witness of the Person whom he believes in and the teachings of the same master whom he has committed himself to follow. Before ascending into heaven, Jesus clearly mentioned that his disciples would be his witnesses "in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." The community of disciples that the descent of the Holy Spirit has given birth is a community of witnesses of the salvation that Jesus has brought into humanity. A living testimony that should be grounded in genuine knowledge of the person of Jesus, fidelity to his teachings, and commitment in doing his command: "love one another as I loved you."

Today, the urgent need for authentic witness is once more felt in the world. I do believe in the call for real disciples who are courageous witnesses in a world that has gone far from the teachings of Jesus, in a humanity that has grown deaf to the call for holiness, in men and women who have turned more selfish than generous in heeding the call of Jesus for the transformation of the world into his Kingdom of love. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit would open our hearts and minds so that we, who have given our "yes" to follow Jesus in the sacrament of Baptism would truly become real disciples in a community that would witness to Jesus our Lord. AMEN



#### Inspiration for the week

When we allow God's Own breath to truly take possession of us, we realize that we are meant to become like God and know Him as He really is. This ultimate helper lifts our eyes from what is below to what is above and empowers us to live life with joy and keener vision!



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten, was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court it was easy to be distracted by wealth, power and luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded women's branch. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament.

Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor Lothar as advisor, at end of life, in failing health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg where he died.

#### "A Walking Miracle: How God showed up on Christmas 2020 to Save My Life."

Shana Pereira moved from Australia to California, 20 years ago when she was 22 with \$500 in her pocket ready to start a new life.

On Christmas Eve 2015, an emergency hospital visit revealed that Shana's kidneys were failing. After five years of dialysis, in September 2020, doctors discovered her heart was also failing and operating at only 15%. The week before Christmas, 2020, during the most dangerous strain of CoVID, Shana was admitted to Cedars Sinai for her final clearances and to be placed on the transplant list. With people of many faiths praying for her, on December 25th, 2020 at 10:30 p.m., Shana learned that a heart and kidney were arriving for her the next day.

Her double transplant was promptly scheduled for December 26th. A few hours before surgery, while her surgeons and a nurse came to chat with her, her heart stopped and Shana flatlined. She experienced what culture calls an "NDE" and saw a glimpse into the afterlife. She was resuscitated, raced to the OR and her new organs arrived shortly by helicopter.

Now, 18 months later, Shana is thriving and living life fully with several professional and personal projects underway. She became a full-fledged Catholic on this past Holy Saturday. Her near death experience has given her a sacred relationship to time, a deepened sense of faith and hope, plus a higher level of confidence. She is a walking miracle!





An update from the Diocese on the Synod Process...


Organizations that serve marginalized communities continue to hold sessions with their populations at prisons, sites that serve the homeless and refugee assistance offices. Meanwhile, parishes and schools are beginning to wind down their sessions for youth.

All reports from these sessions are due by June 15 to the diocese's synod team, which continues to analyze the data submitted since March.

The diocese will submit a report that summarizes the information from the sessions to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops by the end of June.

Bishop McElroy plans to share that report with the Catholic community over the summer. The second listening phase of the consultation is to begin in the fall.

Visit sdcatholic.org/synod for the latest information about this consultation at the diocese, part of a worldwide invitation to Catholics to share their experiences with the Church. The findings will be used to strengthen the Church at all levels.



About half of the meals will go to Casa de los Pobres in Tijuana and the rest to the Philippines and Africa. The deacons are seeking 3,000 volunteers to pack the meals during an amazing weekend in June and they are raising funds to buy the ingredients.

The meals will be packed in three shifts outdoors at Cathedral Catholic High School: Saturday, June 11, from 8:30 to 11 a.m. and from 12:30 to 3 p.m.; and Sunday, June 12, from 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Volunteers are also needed to set up the event and to help clean up after it ends.
