

A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Greetings in the Lord!

Last Sunday the Catholic world celebrated the Feast of *Corpus Christ*, the Most Precious Body of Blood of Jesus Christ. I share with you my reflections on the feast, which may be complemented with a deeper understanding of the meaning of faith, so necessary to become true and faithful disciples of Jesus. There are three essential elements, the first is the content of the faith in Jesus and it is focused on the Paschal mystery, namely that Jesus in order to fulfill his mission of salvation had to suffer, die on the cross and rise from the dead. The second element involves a complete adherence to Jesus that demands self-denial, carrying one's cross daily and eventually following Jesus. The third is proclaiming this reality of Jesus and his mission by words, deeds and our own very lives as a way of sharing in the mission as disciples of Jesus. Today's gospel goes deeper into the meaning of following Jesus in the path of discipleship.

The first reading and the gospel reading are so related in today's liturgy pointing to the radical and complete focus on Jesus that a man should have in order to truly become a disciple. This means that once we decide to follow Jesus, there is no more turning back but only forward movement towards becoming part of the community of disciples assembled to sanctify ourselves in response to the call of Jesus for holiness, just as the Father is Holy. The first reading and the gospel narrate how the human desire to turn back to the past is symbolized by the prophet Elisha and the young man's desire to follow Jesus only after he would have buried his dead father. Notice Jesus responded to the young man saying "let the dead bury their dead," and to another, "no one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

The need to look back while following Jesus is a human sentiment, especially when the process of self-denial that is required in carrying one's cross daily and following Him becomes too heavy to bear. We look back to many issues of our past lives even when we have already answered positively to the call for discipleship. These issues may come in the form of people, events and places that may have been pleasing and endearing to us. The persons may be our parents, brothers and sisters, relatives and friends. The places and events could be those whose memory we simply could not erase due to their unforgettable character that leave significant imprints in our lives. They may be happy or sad experiences, but going back to them could eventually distract us from setting our focus on following Jesus and centering our lives on Him so that His person and teachings would become the only issues that should matter to us. Saints and holy people have also been distracted in their lives, but the process in overcoming their struggles through prayer and penance helped them in focusing themselves on Jesus and only on Him throughout their earthly.

Truly the remarks of Jesus in last Sunday's gospel reading that "if anyone would like to come after me, he must deny himself, take up his cross daily and follow" is one that we must keep into constant consideration and against which we should evaluate ourselves daily so that we can deepen our commitment to him and with love and devotion become his true and loving disciples. Leaving back the distractions will lead us out to centering our lives on Jesus, so that we can completely abandon ourselves to his will and be directed according to his plan. Let us pray that during this year of faith we would be able to entrust ourselves to Him and keep his truly our Lord and Master.



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come.



SAINT OF THE WEEK


Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew, Oldcastle, County Meath in November 1625, the son of the Baron of Loughcrew. As a young man, he wanted to become a priest, but it was illegal to travel to the continent to enter seminary. Even so, he undertook the dangerous journey with four other young men and a Papal Envoy. They were pursued by English privateers, storms at sea, and robbers on land. However, Oliver entered Rome in 1647, and was admitted to the Irish College. He was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1, 1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Spienza University, ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill. By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided. He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.

In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible.

He brings to life Thomas More and John Fisher's example of fidelity to a well-formed conscience, vision of eternal life with God, and willingness to die rather than submit to a raw exercise of royal power.

The father of five children and grandfather to ten (at last count), Judge Conrad hopes that the lessons he learned from More and Fisher might resonate with his family and the readers of this work.





The Inquiry Period for the 2022-2023 R.C.I.A. Year has opened.

If you are an adult looking to learn more about or to be initiated into the Catholic faith, need to prepare for a missed sacrament, or are a lifelong Catholic looking for a refresher course, then the R.C.I.A. can help.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) is the process that welcomes you to join the Catholic faith community and introduces you to the beliefs and practices of the Church. If you are not baptized, the process leads to the reception of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

If you are Baptized in another Christian tradition, the process invites you to participate fully in the church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

During each R.C.I.A. session we spend time answering your questions about the Catholic faith, reviewing the Scripture readings from Mass, and discussing the current chapter in our book. The most important thing is getting your questions answered.
