Greetings in the Lord!

We are now in the fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary time. As I have mentioned in my previous reflections on the Sunday readings, especially the gospel reading, I consider it very significant to reflect on the messages of the Sundays in ordinary time. The gospel reading of this Sunday, however, is one of the readings for a Sunday Eucharistic celebration during the season of Lent. The message of the Lenten celebration has its own context since during lent we are asked to observe the season by prayer, penance and almsgiving. Today's gospel message may be viewed from the perspective of the question that the doctor of the law asked Jesus in order to test him. The question of the lawyer is "what shall I do in order to gain everlasting life?" The question posed by the lawyer is one that is universally asked by all men and women: how to gain everlasting life, in other words, how do I get into heaven? Jesus has been consistent in his ministry. He fulfilled his mission through acts, words and his own life in order to reveal the nature of the Kingdom and the requisites in becoming a part of his Kingdom. He answered the question of the lawyer by telling the story of the "Good Samaritan." I believe that most of us know this story and everybody should remember the message that Jesus conveys to each one of us by the story.

There are several points that I would like to share today. First, the importance of the law in our lives. Second, that the law becomes really valuable especially when considered within the context that the law should be observed, namely in the human society in which we live, move and have our being fulfilled. Thirdly, meaning that Jesus would like understand by being a neighbor.

Today many people have considered the law as one reality that has become a burden if not an unnecessary obligation. Nevertheless, even in a community of faith such as the Church the need for concrete written guidelines is called for in order to attain the purposes of the community. The first readings makes this reality part and parcel of community living responsive to God's invitation to his kingdom by considering the law as God's voice that should lead us to internal conversion of the heart. Second, the law becomes meaningful when we do not only consider it as God's voice but also a way by which we can live in relation with other men and women who form our society. These legal guides make living with other persons less difficult to attain in view of the fact that each person is unique and truly different from each other and what would help attain a common vision is the law.

In the case of our Christian community, the new commandment of love that Jesus asked his disciples to do is the guiding principle that would help each of us attain communion with the Father. This could be another reminded for each one of us.

Jesus said "new commandment I give you: love another as I have loved you."

Finally, today's gospel reading defines who is this other that we should love most? The word Jesus used and the lawyer adopted is "neighbor." The final sentence that Jesus commanded the lawyer is a clear mission for each one us. The "other" whom we should love is the person who needs most our compassion and concern.

In fact, being a neighbor to others is more clearly defined in this gospel, that is, the virtue of compassion that manifests true love for the suffering of others by suffering with them as they suffer in this life. A Christian becomes a true disciple only when he suffers with others as Jesus has suffered for each one of us in order to bring us into eternal life.



Inspiration for the week

It's important to keep our eyes open. Otherwise, we can easily dismiss things that truly require our attention. Whether it is someone needing care, a wrong that must be rectified, an injustice that must be addressed, or someone in need of a helping hand, the lens through which we view life (and even the rules by which we live) can prevent us from stopping and acting. Whether it's an obsession with being on time, a compulsion to complete tasks according to a schedule, or a rigidity with not breaking a law or fear of taking a risk, we miss daily opportunities to show mercy. We often fail in our duty to be a good neighbor, especially when it involves brothers and sisters remote from us whom we have never met. The pain of the world is our pain. God's law of love, mercy, and compassion is not something remote. It's already within us and very near. All we have to do is open our eyes and carry it out.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Henry was born in 972 to Henry, Duke of Bavaria, Germany, and his wife Gisela of Burgundy. Saint Henry's early life was permeated with Christianity, among those who guided his education was Bishop Wolfgang of Ratisbon, who became a saint himself. In 995, Saint Henry succeeded his father as Duke of Bavaria, and in 1002, upon the death of his cousin, Otho III, he was elected emperor. In 1014, Saint Henry undertook the long journey from Germany to Rome to be crowned Holy Roman Emperor by Pope Benedict XIII.

In 1022 Saint Henry assisted Pope Benedict VIII in holding the Council of Pavia, which promoted clerical celibacy and sought to end simony (the buying and selling of ecclesiastical goods and offices). During his reign, Saint Henry used his wealth and position for the Church. He confirmed Benedict's authority over Rome, was a patron of churches and monasteries, supported the Cluniac Reforms, restored episcopal sees, and founded the Diocese of Bamburg where he built a cathedral.

Saint Henry was married to Cunigunde of Luxembourg, to whom he was incredibly devoted. Although disputed by some historians, some stories of the couple's marriage report they took vows of chastity because their union was childless.

Saint Henry died in July of 1024 and was canonized in 1146 by Pope Eugene III.





The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) is the process that welcomes you to join the Catholic faith community and introduces you to the beliefs and practices of the Church. If you are not baptized, the process leads to the reception of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. If you are Baptized in another Christian tradition, the process invites you to participate fully in the church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

During each R.C.I.A. session we spend time answering your questions about the Catholic faith, reviewing the Scripture readings from Mass, and discussing the current chapter in our book. The most important thing is getting your questions answered.
