A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Greetings in the Lord!

We have been reflecting on the theme of discipleship as a loving response to the call of Jesus to follow Him. Last Sunday, we must recall the message of last Sunday's gospel wherein we realized how important the two ways of being disciple of Jesus could be, either by actively serving the Master in the social concerns of people who are very much in need, or simply actively contemplating and listening intently to the words of the Master in the silence of the prayer. However, these two should always be considered together as an integral process of being a disciple wherein prayer should lead one to be actively in service to one's neighbor as an expression of one's compassion for him precisely coming from the abundance of one's love for the Master himself.

I would like to continue my reflections on the same theme of discipleship going further into the deeper and more profound meaning of being a follower of Jesus himself. The prayer that Jesus mentioned in today's gospel reading allows us to see his desire that the disciple should always be in constant communication with Jesus himself who is the master. Constant communication with the master allows the disciple to realize fundamental aspects of discipleship. First, the reality that his relationship with the master should be a relation between two persons in true love which presumes fidelity from each other in order to maintain the lasting relationship. In fact this constant communication of the disciple with the Master allows the disciple to remain aware that he is the follower and his beloved is Lord whom he should constantly listen in order to know his will and plans for him. Besides constant communication with the master allows the disciple to let the Master know his situation, his cares, his problems, his joys and his needs.

Secondly, the Gospel this Sunday affirms that the disciple should never hesitate to tell the Master whatever he needs without tiring and without hesitation as he said "And I tell you, ask and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, received; and the one who seeks, finds; and the one who knocks, the door will be opened." What wonderful affirmation of how faithful the Master really is. What is simply required is the realization of the disciple that he cannot do everything within is power as a creature with weaknesses and frailties, but this could only happen when he remains humble enough to accept the fact that only with his Master can he do whatever he may need to be done in his life. Humility is a virtue that a disciple should develop, a virtue that is the foundation of the ability to seek the assistance of somebody who is acknowledged to be truly greater than the disciple himself. This virtue leads one to have the courage to be persistent in prayer. Persistence is so important in prayer because it affirms the lowliness of the disciple and his acknowledgement of his dire need for assistance from the Master himself. The Master will definitely answer the prayers of the disciple, but his answer may not always be yes to what he asks but even the no could be for the welfare of the disciple in the final analysis.

Finally, the Gospel this Sunday encourages us to keep the prayer Jesus himself taught his disciples as the best way to communicate with the Master, whether we pray this during the mass, when we recite the rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or pray it as it is because it always reminds us that we cannot be the masters, but we can only be true disciples as long as we continue to be conscious of his ever faithful concern for us his disciples. Let us pray that we would be as truly faithful disciples of Jesus also every day of our lives.

Inspiration for the week

Ultimately, what does God promise to give us when we pray? The short answer to that question is God. God promises to give Himself to us in prayer. Prayer is about union with God, not receiving favors. When God comes to us in prayer, His presence comes with faith, hope, and love. When we find these virtues enhanced and nurtured, we know that our prayer has been heard and answered. When we seek out, listen to, and live by these virtues we find ourselves led back to God and more united with the Divine Presence. We struggle with what we want God to do and how we want our prayer validated. That's what makes Jesus' prayer, the Our Father, so perfect. It celebrates a deepening intimate relationship of trust between our Creator and us. When we persistently cry out for God in love, how can that prayer go unanswered?

ST. JAMES THE APOSTLE

FEAST DAY

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SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint James the Apostle is also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater to distinguish him from the other James in Jesus' group of twelve. Most of what we know about Saint James is recorded in the New Testament. He and his brother John were collected by Jesus along the sea of Galilee. Matthew 4:18-22 tells the story of Jesus calling first Simon Peter and his brother Andrew and then the sons of Zebedee. In Mark 3:17 the brothers receive a nickname from Jesus who calls them "sons of thunder" because of their many extreme reactions, like that in Luke 9:54 when they offer to call down fire on a Samaritan village.

Saint James was part of Jesus' intimate circle, a witness to the Transfiguration, the resurrection of Jarius' daughter, and the agony in the garden of Gethsemane. In A.D. 44 Herod Agrippa had "James, the brother of John, killed by the sword." (Acts 12:2) He is the only apostle whose martyrdom is written of in the New Testament.

According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, Spain where his relics were rediscovered in 9th century. This tradition has sometimes been attributed to a passage in the Song of Roland which tells of St. James appearing to Charlemagne in a dream, prophesying that Charlemagne would conquer the Moors in Spain. This was followed by a vision of stars which if followed would lead to the saint's lost tomb. In the Middle Ages Compostela was a hugely popular pilgrimage site. The saint's relics continue to rest in the cathedral there and one can still undertake the pilgrimage.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) is the process that welcomes you to join the Catholic faith community and introduces you to the beliefs and practices of the Church. If you are not baptized, the process leads to the reception of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. If you are Baptized in another Christian tradition, the process invites you to participate fully in the church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

During each R.C.I.A. session we spend time answering your questions about the Catholic faith, reviewing the Scripture readings from Mass, and discussing the current chapter in our book. The most important thing is getting your questions answered.
