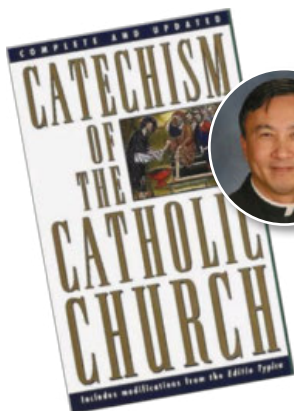

MEMORIAL MASS FOR THE FEAST OF THE HOLY INNOCENTS



Join us, Tuesday, December 28, 6:30 pm Mass

Since the sixth century, the Church has celebrated the memory of those children killed because of Herod's rage against Christ (cf. Mt 2:16- 17). Liturgical tradition refers to them as the "Holy Innocents" and regards them as martyrs. The horror of the massacre and the devastation of the mothers and fathers led Matthew to quote Jeremiah: "A voice was heard in Ramah, sobbing and loud lamentation; Rachel weeping for her children. . . .because her children are no more." (Matthew 2:18). In our own times, children suffer innumerable forms of violence throughout the world which threaten their lives and dignity. On this day, it is appropriate to recall the vast number of unborn children who have been killed under the laws permitting abortion. The Feast of Holy Innocents not only encompasses those lives but the precious babies lost by miscarriage, stillbirth and sudden infant death syndrome. We ask you to join us for this special Mass to honor them here at St. Martin's.



Question:

I have been away from the Church for a few years and really want to get active again, not so much for me, but for my children. Is this a bad reason to come back to Church?

Answer:

If you are on your way to the supermarket, and you are forced to detour from your usual route because of road work, does the food you buy taste different? Is the meal less filling? Are the vegetables less tasty? Of course not. In our faith journey, there are many detours called sin. Some are greater than others, some are even a bit longer. But God's grace comes to us in ways we understand and recognize and need. Your children leading you back to the Church is not as important as the fact that you are back.

This is an opportunity for you to renew, strengthen, and deepen your faith. Regardless of how we get to Church, or what draws us closer to God, the fact is we are there. Do what you need to do to get right with God and the Church. Go to confession, begin good family religious practices, and be involved in the ministries your parish offers. Be more than a lukewarm parishioner. Be the kind of Catholic you want your children to be.

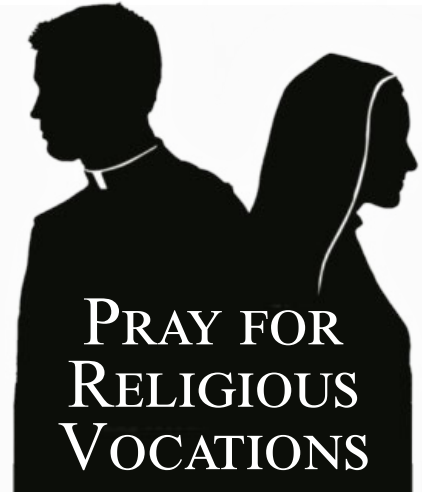

2. Drop off a check or credit card payment at the Parish Office.

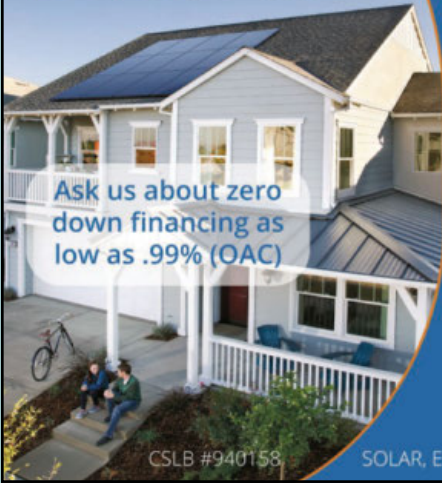

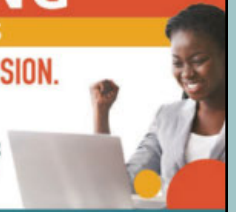
