



Notes From the Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,



Fr. John,

What is the reason that incense is used during Masses? Is it a necessity or just a traditional practice? I bring an elderly relative to mass on occasion and would like to bring her when there is no incense.

My Dear Parishioner,

Incense has been used in Christian liturgy from its earliest centuries. In fact, it was a part of the Jewish tradition that came before it, a use that was commanded by God himself and recorded in Sacred Scripture. (Exodus 30:1-10; 30-34) When we see incense being used in our church at Mass, it is meant to remind us of heaven, and that our worship of God in the Christian liturgy is divine in origin. The use of incense adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendence of the Mass which links heaven with earth, and allow us to enter into the presence of God. It also reminds us to pray, and that our prayers rise to God like the smoke from the censer, purifying our worship of God, and allowing his Holy Spirit to work in us to make us holy.

Incense at St. Dominic Catholic Church is used during the High Holy Days of our faith (Easter, Christmas, Feast of Corpus Christi, Pentecost Sunday, etc.) and the season that follows. For instance, incense is used from Christmas Eve through the Baptism of the Lord. Incense is used at all the Masses during these times.

When incense is used, the air handlers are turned on so the smoke dissipates rapidly and doesn't fill the church. Additionally, the incense that we use is a pure plant derivative (typically the sap) and has no additives and thus is naturally not likely to produce an allergic reaction. This is much different from the incense you can buy commercially for use in the homes (sticks, cones, etc.) These often have many additives such as perfume added to them.

I believe your relative will be fine attending any Mass at St. Dominic. I look forward to meeting her.




