

JANUARY 9, 2022 THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Lord Jesus,

Today the public ministry of Jesus begins, with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. And in this feast we have the opportunity to reflect on the "how and why" of our own Baptism. The Sacrament that makes us true brothers and sisters to Jesus and heirs to the life of grace!

I would take this opportunity to remind you of the powerful moments and the words you have heard in the baptisms we celebrate at our Sunday liturgies. They are: the naming, the signing, the exorcism, the profession of faith, the washing, the anointing and the presentation of the baptismal candle.



First, the naming. This Sacrament is personal, we are known to God and presented to the community as a unique creation and a gift from God to the world.

Second, the signing with the sign of Jesus' cross. It is a reminder to us all, as we undertake the journey of a disciple, that we too must "take up our cross" and follow Christ. The way of the Master will be our way and He will be with us every step of the way.

Next, the exorcism, a frightening word for some, but really a gift and grace for those of us with faith. An exorcism is the recognition of God's absolute authority over evil and that evil will not triumph! So we, the Baptized, go forward into our life with the strength and power of Jesus at work in us, saving us and giving us the strength to triumph in our battle with evil.

And before the water is poured, we surrounded by our family of faith, reject sin and all that is contrary to the Gospel, and we proclaim the faith that saves us. With this divine family, assembled by God the Father, we journey together to our true and everlasting home – heaven.

The beautiful gift and sign of being washed in the waters of Baptism is the center of the Sacrament. We are washed clean of sin, we pass through the waters with Israel, we are with Jesus in the Jordan River, we die on the cross with Christ and we rise with Him in His resurrection! The blood and the water that flowed from His side are the signs of nourishment for our journey: Baptism and Eucharist!

And now, as daughters and sons of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus, we are anointed with Holy Chrism. A sign of being chosen by God and strengthened by God for our Holy purpose that will be discovered through prayer, the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the support of the Christian community.

And finally, the baptism candle. Remember the words that are spoken, they can shape and fashion the day-today actions we choose as disciples. "Receive the light of Christ. This child is to walk always as a child of the light. May they keep the flame of faith alive in their heart; and when the Lord Jesus returns, may they go out to meet Him with all the Saints in that heavenly kingdom".

So my friends, walk as a child of the light! Keep the flame of faith alive in your heart! Be hope-filled and ready to meet the Lord! And know that the eternal gift of Heaven is yours through your faith in Him!

Happy Feast of the Baptism of the Lord! As always, I wish you peace. - Fr. Ed

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE


"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ."

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

Check your child's backpack

As you and your children prepare for their return to school after

Christmas break, make sure they are not carrying too much around in their backpacks. Backpacks that are too heavy can cause problems like neck or back pain, or poor posture. The American Chiropractic Association (ACA) recommends that a child's backpack weigh no more than 5-10% of the child's body weight. Help your children by ensuring that they wear

their backpacks correctly, with both straps over the shoulders, and that they are only carrying what they need. If you have concerns about the load your child is carrying, reach out to a teacher or school staff to discuss what should and should not be coming home every day.
