

Theme: Jesus is the Star that Guides all People

Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, Year C January 2, 2022

First Reading, Is 60:1-6, Second Reading, Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6, Gospel, Matt 2:1-12

Today is the feast of Epiphany, where we celebrate Jesus the incarnate word being revealed to all the nations of the world. The Church calls it, the feast of appearance or manifestation of the Lord. Epiphany comes from the Greek word and means "Manifestation". The Church celebrates the light of God's revelation of His Son as human in Jesus Christ. The story of the magi is the story of the ways in which God reveals Himself to us and the different responses and reactions this revelation receives. The Lord of the universe who reveals the star of Bethlehem to the Gentiles of the East so they could come and worship Jesus, the Prince of Peace and Kings of Kings gives each one of us the same light of revelation to recognize and accept Jesus as Our Lord and Savior.

Jesus constantly reveals Himself to us in different ways and our reactions vary in the same way as the people of Jesus' time. In today's feast of the Epiphany there are three major reactions to the revelation of Jesus. The first person is Herod and the likes of him. His reaction to the news of the revelation of a King born in Bethlehem was the reaction of hatred and hostility. Herod was afraid that this infant King was going to interfere with his life, his place and his power, his influence and therefore the instinct was to destroy Him. He should not live because His presence will be a disturbance to His peace and His life. In the same way, think about when you hear the word of God or receive His message which probes your conscience or challenges your life. What is your reaction to it? Do you kill that message inside you or do you let it die gradually? Do you get mad at the messenger for being courageous to challenge you. Do you welcome it with joy and make an effort to change? What is your reaction?

The other group is the reaction of the Chief priests and scribes during the time of Jesus. They were also told about the birth of Jesus. Their reaction was that of complete indifference to the news of the birth of a king and a savior. It did not make any slightest difference to them. They were so engrossed in their temple rituals and their legal discussion. They were more interested in their personal affairs that Jesus' birth meant nothing to them. What is your reaction as you go through this write up? Are you interested or disinterested in the message of Jesus? Are you more concerned with your own personal affairs that you don't bother about Christ's message or his Church? Are you among those so engrossed in your own affairs that you don't have time to come to Mass on Sunday or make time for God in your life. Are you among those who come to Mass with eyes on the watch just to leave the Church even before the Mass is ended because you are so busy with other private concerns?

Then we come to the last group, the reaction of the wise men from the East. The reaction of adoring worship, the desire to leave everything and seek Him out where He is and worship Him. The desire to lay at the feet of Jesus with noblest gifts which they could bring. Thus, we learn from today's feast that God speaks to us humans not only through the scriptures, the word of His revelation, but He speaks to us also through the book of nature. However, the wise men from the East did not worship the stars they worshipped the one to whom the star pointed out to them. The events of nature most often point to us about the magnificent nature of God and it is this God we should worship and not the nature that reveals the mighty deeds of God.

Finally, the Eucharist and Jesus present in the tabernacle is the same Jesus the wise men found in Mary's arms. We should examine ourselves to see how we adore him when we encounter him at Mass or when He is exposed for us. Do we realize that it is the same Jesus in the tabernacle that we encounter when we come into the Church? Do we worship Him profoundly and give Him due honor when we enter the Church or do we pay less attention to His presence each time we come into the Church? May this light of God's revelation fill your family with peace.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

January 2, 2022

The Epiphany of the Lord

In his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis references a thought from Pope Benedict XVI: "Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." Today we celebrate an encounter with the Person of Jesus Christ! This simple but holy event in time dramatically changes human life, pointing it toward a new horizon and giving it a decisive direction. This is a message and truth that is not meant to be shared with only a select few who qualify but with the entire world. Pope Francis continues saying, "Thanks solely to this encounter or renewed encounter with God's love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and self-absorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being."

Look around at people. Where is life heading for them? What gives them direction? Even we who are people of faith can get distracted and lose our focus. God, in all of His fullness, is revealed in Jesus Christ and we can encounter Him! God is tangible, real, vulnerable, poor, and full of wonders, surprises, and opportunities. For those who are struggling and lost, today is a day of great joy. All they have to do is reach out and touch the truth of Christ. This presence is revealed in the poor, exploited, and vulnerable ones who cry out for compassion and love. But it is also found in the faithful ones who see in the Epiphany of God a liberation from structures and systems that hurt us, a narrowness of mind and heart that constricts us, and an absorption in our self-agenda that prevents us from seeing anything other than ourselves as important.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.



La Epifanía del Señor

Aun en estos tiempos, la humanidad continúa buscando la estrella, esa estrella que muchas veces se pierde entre la injusticia, el odio y la discriminación. Sin embargo, hay que seguir el camino y alzar los ojos al cielo para encontrar el centro de su luz. "Levántate y brilla, que ha llegado tu luz y la Gloria de Yavé amaneció sobre ti (Isaías 60,1). La Gloria de la Manifestación de Jesús en su Evangelio y en la Eucaristía se hace presente entre nosotros en la Liturgia de hoy. El Papa Francisco nos explica acerca de la belleza de esta celebración. "La manifestación de Jesús, simbolizada por la luz: Levántate y resplandece, Jerusalén, porque llega tu luz; la Gloria del Señor amanece sobre ti". Él nos exhorta al movimiento, a no quedarnos ahí fijos como estatuas sin hacer nada.

También, nos explica sobre la participación de los magos del Oriente y lo que ellos representan. "Los Magos, venidos de Oriente, representan a todos los pueblos lejanos de la fe judía tradicional: se dejan guiar por la estrella y se enfrentan a un largo y arriesgado viaje; se postran ante Jesús y le ofrecen regalos simbólicos: oro, incienso y mirra; la búsqueda del Señor implica también la generosidad del corazón" (1/6/2019). ¿Qué le estoy ofreciendo a Jesús en esta etapa de mi vida? ¿Qué tipo de manifestaciones he tenido de Dios a lo largo de mi vida? Pidamos, en esta Eucaristía, que la luz de Cristo se manifieste en estos tiempos turbulentos y oscuros que experimentamos en el mundo entero. Sigamos vigilantes, caminemos por sendas nuevas, sigamos el ejemplo de los Magos. Ellos, regresaron a su país por otro camino.


