MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

We welcome Mr. Adam Sellers, a seminarian for our Diocese, to the Parish this Summer. He will be here for 6-8 weeks. He will be writing an article for the Bulletin each week while he is here. Those articles will take the place of my letter.

After last week's readings of the difficulties of discipleship, Jesus appoints seventy-two people to go into every town and village and proclaim that the Kingdom of God is at hand. We see that He sends them in pairs because in the Law of Moses two witnesses were needed for their testimony to be true. Not only was this probable for the pairs, but also because "For where two or three are gathered together in My name, there am I in the midst of them." (Matthew 18:20)

Jesus then admits that it will not be easy for them. That He is sending them out as lambs among wolves and not even a money bag or sandals is to be taken with them. This is because Jesus wants to take away any distractions that would keep them from proclaiming the kingdom of God. When their journeys are over, they come back rejoicing because they have found that demons were under their power because of Jesus' name. So, even though they were sent as lambs amongst wolves, it is by Jesus' power given to them that they were safe the entire time.

A key theme of today's Gospel and last Sunday's Gospel is discipleship—its challenges, its difficulties and its rewards. Sharing in the mission of Jesus is difficult, but everyone is called to do it, not just some professionals trained for ministry. Even for us today, the harvest is plentiful. We should pray to the Master of the harvest to send out workers for His harvest.

Being good stewards of the gifts given to us and seeking to use them wisely, to live as the body of Christ with Mary, the Mother of God, as our model on our journey of faith.

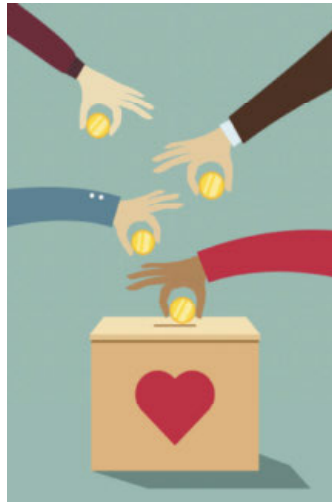

R.C.I.A.: Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

Have you, or someone you know, ever thought of joining the Catholic Church? Have you been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received First Eucharist or Confirmation?

Well, R.C.I.A. may be the answer to your questions. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of spiritual and educational formation for adults who seek to reflect on becoming full members of the Roman Catholic Church through their conversion of mind and heart.

The program this year will begin on Monday, Sept. 12 and conclude in May 2023, meeting weekly (with few exceptions). The high point is of course the Great Easter Vigil when those who, after discernment and prayer, are received into the Church.

We will host three information sessions this summer: Sunday, July 17 at 1:00 PM, Saturday, July 30 at 5:30 PM and Monday, August 8 at 6:00 PM, all in the Parish Hall. Meetings will be about 1 hour.
