

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. All are invited to our **Epiphany Celebration after the 10:30 A.M. Mass today.** On behalf of the entire staff at Saint Mark the Evangelist Parish, I would like to offer thanks for all those who volunteered and gave of their time and talent to make our Advent and Christmas Liturgies so beautiful. I am always in awe with the generosity of our Parish and the willingness of Parishioners to volunteer in various ministries in our Parish. May the Lord bless us all in this New Year.

In our Gospel today, Herod and the Magi offer a study in contrasts. Herod was a man of the political world, fiercely holding onto his power. The Magi were men devoted to finding the King announced by the star, even though they did not know who this King was or exactly where the star would lead them. Herod was a Jew in name but a pagan in all things. The Magi were pagans in name but acted like sincere Jews seeking the One who was the summit of God's Plan for mankind

Sixteen centuries later, the mystic and doctor of the Church, St. John of the Cross, would reflect on his own life in a way that was like the lives of the ancient Magi as well as the lives of all who seek the Lord. In "Songs of the Heart...." John of the Cross wrote, "I went without discerning and with no other light except for that which in my heart was burning."

And so, we journey to the Lord. Where exactly are we going to find Him? We really don't know. He may be in marriage. He may be in the priesthood or religious life. He may be in the life of the single determined to spread Christianity. He may be in children and teens. He may be in a career. He may be in our caring for a sick spouse or relative. He may be in the outcast who reaches out for us. He is in all these and countless more places. If we are wise, we will spend our lives seeking Him out, wherever He is. And yes, we might get sidetracked. Yes, we might find ourselves seeking Him in the wrong place, like in the palace of a hypocritical King Herod. We may start a career that is wrong for us. We may have to break a relationship that is unhealthy for us. But if we are attuned to God's Word, He will set us straight and direct us to the course we need to follow. We will all get to our Bethlehem's if we are open to God's call.

At times the journey is difficult. We are called to be moral in an immoral society. We are called to stand for life in a society of death. We are called to embrace the joy of the Lord in a society that exalts in prejudice and hatred. It is easy for us to give up and to give in. It is easy to take the drink that will destroy us, the drug that will dull us. It is easy to go with the flow of an immoral relationship. It is difficult to step away from all this and stay on the path to the Lord. But we can stay on that path. We can, and we must. The world is counting on us completing the journey of our lives. For those who complete their journey reveal to the world the Presence of its Savior. And so, we look towards the great ones who have died, the great ones in our Church, the universal Church and the great ones of the little church of our families – like Saint Mother Theresa, Saint John Paul II, Father James Coyle, Father Andy Sullivan, Father Brian Egan, Father Louis Giardino, or our parents and our grandparents - their lives give witness for us that the Lord is indeed among us.

And we journey, not alone, but guided, guided by an interior star, the voice of the One we love who calls to us deep within ourselves. And we go in the words of Saint John of the Cross "without discerning and with no other light except for that which our hearts is burning."

Including all, omitting none, with Christ-like love and understanding,





serving in any way, please contact Sr. Madeline by January 18 at SrMadeline@stmarkrc.org or call her at 205-980-1810, ext 3.







ANCHOR COMMUNITY RESPITE MINISTRY

Anchor Community Respite Ministry based at Asbury United Methodist Church provides fellowship and stimulation to people who are living with memory loss due to dementia or stroke. Anchor operates every Tuesday and Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Asbury's campus.

A typical day at Anchor is structured in the following way:

- 10:00-10:30: Arrival, Coffee, Socialization, Table Time (puzzles, word searches)
- 10:30-11:00: Physical Fitness (balloon volleyball, bowling, chair yoga)
- 11:00-11:30: Lemonade & Brain Fitness (trivia, brainstorming, creative writing)
- 11:30-Noon: Activities/Games (guest speakers, bingo, wheel of fortune)
- Noon-12:30: Family-Style Meal (lunch and dessert)
- 12:30-1:00: Physical Fitness (stretching, dancing)
- 1:00-1:30: Art (painting, coloring, crafting)
- 1:30-2:00: Music (singing, guest musical performances)

The memory-loss program gives care partners a break each week to run errands, visit with friends, and rest. Care partners can participate in a monthly support group (which meets the first and third Thursday of each month) to share ideas and concerns with other care partners, as well as learn more from memory loss professionals. Care partners are invited to call and schedule a tour of the Respite Care Center prior to enrollment.

Volunteer Opportunities:

You don't need any special skills to volunteer at Anchor, just a willingness to love and be a friend! Volunteer opportunities include:

- Set-up and/or clean-up
- Serve as a companion to participants
- Prepare, serve and clean-up lunch
- Perform (i.e. music, drama, dance, storytelling)
- Lead an easy art or craft class
- Organize and maintain activity supplies
- Assist with administrative duties
