

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION


"For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." — Matthew 18:20

A baby can be left at the Parish Office during normal office hours. After hours, take the baby to the nearest fire station or hospital.

Jesus' Physical Experience of His Passion — Part 2: Hearing

After exploring Jesus' passion and death through the sense of sight last week, we'll move on to how he might have experienced those same events through his sense of hearing. As you read through this week's reflection, try to tune out your other senses as much as possible and focus on the intensity of the sounds involved in Jesus' redemptive work.

The Last Supper, as recounted in the Gospels, was a deeply intimate and emotionally charged event. It was a moment of fellowship where Jesus shared his final meal with his disciples and friends, but it was also one tinged with great tension and foreboding. As Jesus reclined at the table, the surrounding sounds would have been familiar and comforting, yet meaningful. The clinking of cups and other dishes and the soft murmur of voices would have been normal in a Jewish Passover meal. It is customary to celebrate by recounting the story of God's deliverance of the Israelites from Egypt, a story Jesus would have heard often since his childhood. However, as they conversed with one another, unbeknownst to the disciples, this was not an ordinary Passover meal.

Jesus heard the disciples' confused and uncertain questions as he broke the bread and passed the cup, especially when he spoke of betrayal (Matt 26:21-22). He heard them ask perplexed, "Is it I, Lord?" The sound of his own voice identifying the traitor as the one who dips his hand in the dish with him would have been striking, adding an ominous tone to the evening. Jesus' words were prophetic and deeply sorrowful, as only he

understood the gravity of the moment.

Amid this conversation, the disciples were also engaged in their own discussions, wondering among themselves who would be the greatest in the kingdom of God (Lk 22:24). Had they understood what was about to happen, this question likely would have seemed trivial in comparison and hardly worth asking. Hearing these conversations must have deepened Jesus' sorrow, knowing his disciples still did not fully understand the path he was quickly about to walk, and their hearts were filled with pride rather than compassion.

As Jesus instituted the Eucharist, explaining that bread and wine were transformed into his body and blood, his voice would have been calm but firm, and the words would have echoed through the room filled with sacrificial love as his disciples were silent and rapt with attention. His voice surely resonated deeply within the disciples' hearts, though they may not have fully understood the implications at the time. Hearing Jesus' instructions to remember him in this way would have had a lasting impact, both on that night and in the future.

After the Last Supper, Jesus withdrew with Peter, James, and John to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. In this quiet place, the sounds would have shifted dramatically. As the usual noises of the city became distant, they were replaced by the rustling of trees and the occasional call of night birds. He confided to his friends, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of

death," his voice trembling with emotion before going to pray. Jesus, in his distress, sought solitude to communicate with his Father. The sound of his prayers — pleading, sorrowful, and desperate — echoed through the garden. We can only wonder if Jesus heard a response from his Father, as the gospels do not mention one. Had the disciples not fallen asleep, they would have heard Jesus expressing his inner turmoil as he wrestled with the tension between submitting to the will of his Father and his human fear of the horror and suffering that awaited him. After asking his Father to "take this cup from me," the silence must have been profound (Mat 26:39).

As the soldiers approached to arrest Jesus, the silence was penetrated by the sounds of chaos. The shuffling of soldiers' boots, the clinking of swords, and the angry voices of the mob created an atmosphere of tension and fear. Jesus, amid the commotion, heard Judas say, "Greetings, Rabbi!" followed by the sound of his kiss — the sign of betrayal (Mt 26:49). A sound typically associated with love and affection was now a sound that would pierce his heart. As the soldiers seized Jesus, he heard the panicked voices of his disciples and the clash of weapons as Peter, in a misguided attempt to protect Jesus, cut off the ear of the high priest's servant, causing him to cry out in pain (Jn 18:10). Remaining calm, Jesus rebuked Peter, telling him to put away his sword (Mt 26:52). Perhaps Jesus' calm voice in the chaos steadied the disciples as they watched the events unfold.



During his trial before the Jewish authorities and later before Pontius Pilate, Jesus was subjected to false accusations and mockery. The sounds of the proceedings — the frantic and accusing voices of the high priests and the crowd's shouts of condemnation — filled the surrounding space. As he heard the false accusations against him, he remained silent. The jeers of the crowd, the mockery of the Roman soldiers as they beat him, and the sound of a whip striking his back would have been excruciating. The sounds of spitting, slapping, and mockery must have been the cruelest ones that Jesus experienced as he stood silently before his accusers, fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah 53:7, "Though harshly treated, he submitted and did not open his mouth." The crowds then started to chant, "Crucify him!" This sound would have pierced him more deeply than the physical pain he endured (Mt 27:22). The voices of the people, so recently filled with praise and adoration during his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, have now turned into voices filled with hatred and condemnation.

As Jesus began his journey to Calvary, he would have heard the sound of his cross dragging in the dirt behind him, and each of the

three times he fell, he heard the thud of the wood on the ground. Upon reaching his destination, there would have been one final sickening thud as the soldiers tossed his cross on the ground to prepare it for his crucifixion. After Jesus is laid on his cross, he would have heard the rhythmic hammering of nails into his flesh, the groans of pain from his own body, and the distant sounds of the crowd still yelling and mocking him with no compassion for his pain and suffering. The cry of the Roman Centurion, "Hail, King of the Jews!" would have been yet another cruel mockery echoing in his ears (Mt 27:29). The sound of Jesus' voice crying out in agony, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" pierced the air, revealing the depth of his spiritual and emotional desolation (Mt. 27:46). Throughout the crucifixion, the sounds of nature also played a role. As Jesus died, the earth reacted with the sound of the

temple veil tearing and the rumble of an earthquake. Then, there was a deafening silence, which was only interrupted by the Centurion's declaration, "Truly this was the Son of God!" (Mat 27:54). After all the horrors of the previous night and morning, this one supreme truth was finally spoken out loud, heard clearly by those nearby.

The sounds of Jesus' suffering invite us to listen attentively to the profound truths they carry. Through the sounds of his passion, we can hear his love, his sacrifice, and, ultimately, his triumph over death. Notice how the sense of hearing reinforced his connection to humanity, from the intimate sounds of fellowship at the Last Supper to the cacophony of cruelty at his crucifixion. As you meditate on the sounds of the passion this week, resolve to listen to the sound of Jesus' voice in your heart and your daily life more attentively.
