

The Stewardship of the Vine and Branches

I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing.
(John 15:5)

In our Gospel this Sunday, Jesus tells His disciples and us that, "Apart from me, you can do nothing." At first glance, you might say, "No. That's not right, -that's not true!" After all, I can do good things on my own. In fact, I know many people who do good things, -worthwhile things for their family, their community, and even the world. But they are not us. And we are not just trying to do good things, but we are trying to do the things of Christ – those things that are of Christ. As His Faith-filled stewards, we are trying to live a life that brings about the Kingdom of God, - a world that is founded upon and in God's perfect and unconditional love for us as shown by His Son through His passion, death and Resurrection.

What our Gospel tells us today is that our lives, in order to bear fruit, -a fruit that is founded upon God's enduring love for each of us, we must live a discipleship or stewardship that is based in, through and with Christ, the Son of the living God. In other words, as John reminds us, 'apart from Jesus, we can do nothing'. We cannot be the People of God, - we cannot be the Mystical Body of the Christ -either individually or as a Church, apart from the Risen Lord.

This is the simple truth that we are being reminded of this Fifth Sunday in Easter. So, how do we make sure our Stewardship is based solidly upon and with Christ? Jesus tells us today, "Abide in me." Abide in Jesus. Just as he abides in us. Those who abide in Christ, bear much fruit. So, that's the answer. Abide in Christ. So, we ask, how do we do that? How do we abide in Jesus? The answer is not some great mystery – it is exactly what we discussed earlier in this series on Stewardship; it what has always been taught about our relationship with God. It comes down to daily prayer, spending time with God's Word, and weekly worship.

This has always been the way that Christians have sought to abide in Jesus. And there is nothing in this world that has changed that. So, here is a follow-up question: "How do we know if we are "abiding in Jesus", well? The answer is simple: "are we bearing fruit?" Are we the living signs of the nine "fruits of the Holy Spirit?" Do our lives reflect God's "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." These my friends are the fruits that we bear (live) when our lives "abide in" Jesus.

"My Father is glorified by this," Jesus concludes this gospel reading, "that you bear much fruit and become my disciples." Let us glorify the Father. Let us bear much fruit. As individuals, and as a congregation. Let us be known for our love, and our joy, and our peace, and our patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Let us bear this fruit, in the only way that we can: By abiding in Jesus, our Risen Lord, as His Faith-filled stewards/disciples.

Our Liturgical Life!

The General Outline of the Eucharistic Celebration!

"Wherever two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in the midst of them."

Matthew 18:20

As we begin our journey into a deeper understanding of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, let us first look at the structure of the Eucharist, - the Mass. In the Roman Rite, the Eucharist (Mass) is made up of two principal parts: the "Liturgy of the Word" and the "Liturgy of the Eucharist". It begins however, with the Introductory Rites and ends with the Concluding Rites.

Another way of dividing a Mass is into its "ordinary" parts—those texts which, with some variations, are part of the Mass on a daily basis—and its "proper" parts—the texts of prayers and selection of Scripture readings proper to the specific feast, feria (i.e.: Ordinary time when no special celebration or Holy Day is celebrated) or other occasion being observed (special needs).

Even though we are familiar with the structure of the Mass, it is always good to review and reflect upon what it is that we do during the celebration of the Eucharist. Thus, the General Outline of the Eucharistic Celebration is as follows:

I. Introductory Rites

Entrance * Greeting * Penitential Act * Glory to God * Collect

II. Liturgy of the Word

First Reading * Responsorial Psalm * Second Reading (on Sundays and solemnities) * Gospel Acclamation * Gospel * Homily * Profession of Faith (on Sundays, solemnities, and special occasions) * Universal Prayers of Intercession

III. Liturgy of the Eucharist

Presentation of the Gifts and Preparation of the Altar * Preparation of the Altar * Prayer over the Offerings * Eucharistic Prayer * Preface * Holy, Holy, Holy * First half of prayer, including Consecration * Mystery of Faith * Second half of prayer, ending with Doxology * The Lord's Prayer * Sign of Peace * Lamb of God * Communion * Prayer after Communion

IV. Concluding Rites

Optional announcements * Greeting and Blessing * Dismissal

In the weeks ahead, we will be exploring each of these areas of this wondrous and miraculous Sacrament. As we take this journey of Faith into the central Sacrament of our Faith, let us remember that the Mass, the Eucharistic Celebration is the most beautiful act of worship of and to God and a precious treasure of our Catholic Church. For it is through our celebration and faith-filled participation in the Mass, that we participate in the ever-present, everlasting reality of the Last Supper, the Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection and the continued presence of Our Lord this day and tomorrow - for all eternity.
