EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Due to the constant unchecked flow of data and information through the Internet, it can be hard to know when a story is real news or rubbish. It never ceases to amaze me when someone I know has bought into some crazy fake news story. Sometimes the story is just so unbelievable: celebrities who gained two hundred pounds in a month, women having babies who were never pregnant, or people actually being seen who are dead! Like Elvis!

The apostle Thomas found the news that Jesus was alive just too far-fetched to believe. But he didn't first hear the news on the Internet or read it standing in the grocery store checkout line. His friends told him. His fellow apostles told him they had actually seen the Lord with their own eyes. Their testimony was not enough. He needed proof.

The resurrection of Jesus gives us not only hope, but also a reason to be his disciples. We have not seen with our own eyes but, like Thomas, we have a community, the Church, that has relayed the truth to us. This same Jesus now calls us to go forth to spread the Gospel. More unbelievable than that, we have, through the gifts we have been given, a chance to change and even save lives. The day may come that you, moved by this news of the risen Lord, will be an agent of his love to the point where someone will tell the tale that you, a follower of Jesus, actually helped to change his or her life. Pretty unbelievable, right?

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE— *Father John Muir* April 16, 2023

2nd Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy)

A young, engaged couple sat on the couch in front of me as we chatted

about their upcoming marriage. The young lady was struggling to trust her future husband. She told me her father had been unfaithful to her mother. She said of her fiancé, "I want him to prove to me that he won't cheat on me." The young man looked at me helplessly, raised his eyebrows and shrugged his shoulders. What evidence could he possibly give to validate such a proof? Nothing. All he could do was invite her to trust him.

We all are wounded by experiences of imperfect love. We also are tempted to demand from God proof of His fidelity and goodness. We are like St. Thomas the Apostle who, on that second Sunday of Easter, demands proof of the Lord's resurrection. ***“Unless I see the mark of the nail ... I will not believe.”*** Our science, technology and mathematics can indeed prove a great deal. But there are some things that require trusting another person. We prove promises of love only by trusting.

St. Thomas indeed saw the wounds of Jesus and believed. But there is an even greater blessing for us who simply trust Him — and all the truths the Church proclaims — because of the trustworthiness of the Risen One who speaks. This week let's trust Jesus without seeing him.

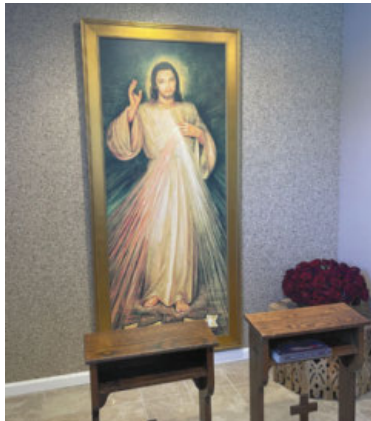

On May 5, 2000, at the direction of Saint John Paul II, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. **This Sunday, April 16th at 3PM** we invite you to join us in the Church for the Divine Mercy Chaplet, which was passed on by Jesus in visions to St. Faustina. ST. ANASTASIA SANCTUARY REMODEL

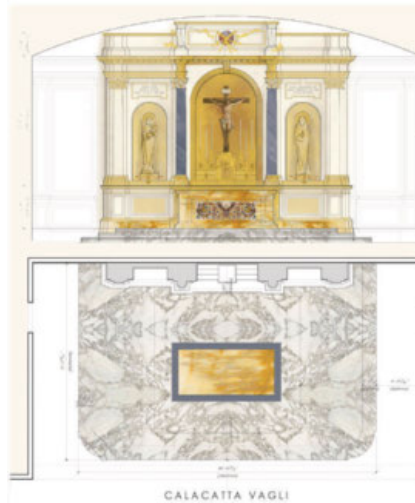
Our Sanctuary remodel is going very well. Over the past few months, our staff has worked closely with the Los Angeles Archdiocese Construction Department and the assigned project manager. Our contracts have all been signed and approved by ADLA. The flooring material for the Sanctuary has been purchased and is currently being

fabricated with a target installation date of May 8th. Our Retablo is being built offsite in the artisans's workshop and will be installed, painted, and finished once completed.

We have also contracted a lighting designer. She is well known in the Los Angeles Archdiocese and will begin with lighting niches and then work outward over time into the Church's nave.

We are currently reviewing bids on this work with the construction department. Our next step is to finalize material selections for the flooring in the rest of the Church.

We thank you for your continued patience during this time. In addition, we are incredibly grateful for your continued financial generosity to our Building Fund and parishioners' fulfillment of Called to Renew pledges. Both sources of funding will help see this project to fruition

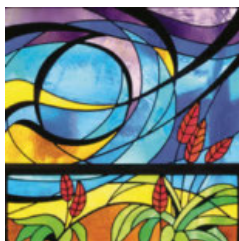
