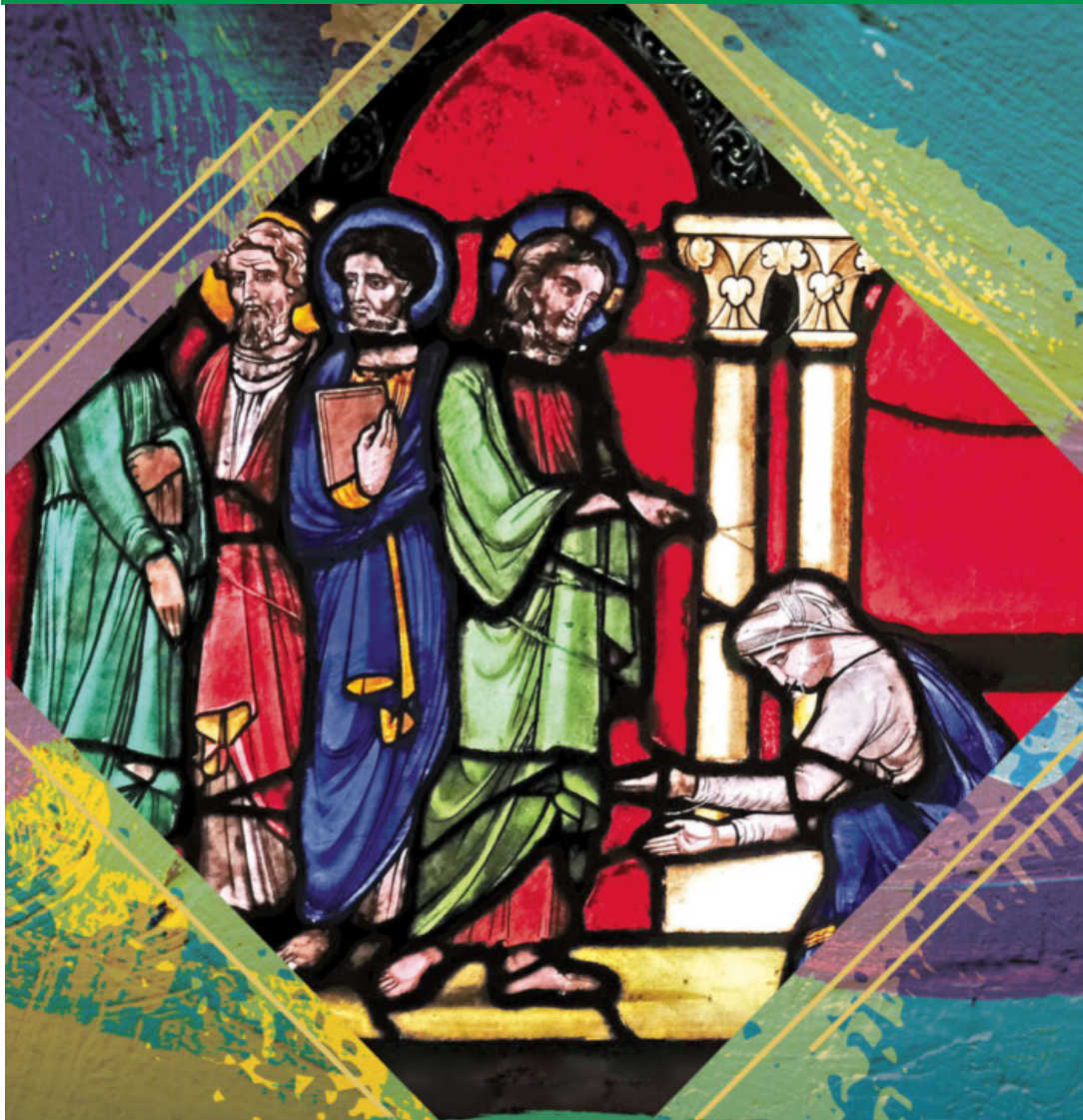

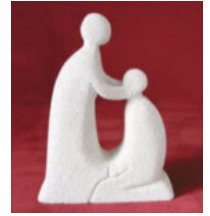

St. Anastasia, through the Ministry of Consolation, provides a safe and caring haven for those going through the tough journey of losing a loved one.



Every second and fourth Tuesday of the month at 7 pm, we gather in the Parish Office Conference Room to offer solace.

This gathering is open to all, extending a warm welcome to those in need.

Our group is currently engaged in sharing and reflecting upon a book titled *"It's Okay That You're Not Okay"* by Megan Devine.

The author, who has personally experienced tragic loss, and is also a professional counselor, recognizes the inadequacies of available guidance for the bereaved. She acknowledges how the existing systems fail to effectively navigate the path toward coping with the pain of losing a loved one.

Here are some thought-provoking insights from this unique and impactful book:

- "It is all just as crazy as you think it is; this is really as bad as you think"
- "The Reality of Grief: When out-of-order death or a life-altering event enters your life, everything changes. Even when it's expected, death or loss still comes as a surprise. Everything is different now. The life you expected to unfold disappears ;vaporized."
- "Grief is part of love. Love for life, love for self, love for others. What you are living, painful as it is, is love. And love is really hard. Excruciating at times."

In our present group, we have discovered that while this perspective on grief might deviate from the norm, it is profoundly beneficial. Although it can be challenging to grasp at times, as it delves into the reality of pain from an unconventional standpoint, it offers a refreshing perspective that encourages openness.

We extend a heartfelt invitation for you to join us and discern if this space aligns with your expectations. Feel free to drop by and explore whether this environment meets your needs.

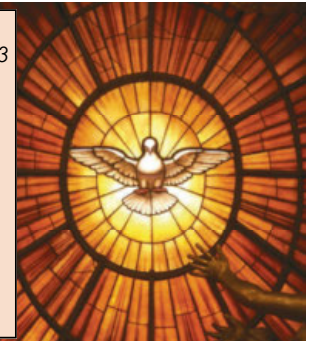

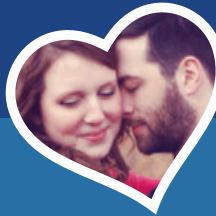

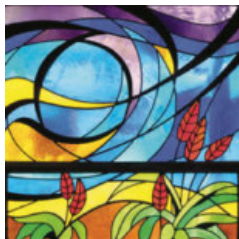
