Here are some excerpts from the book:

"Having lost a loved one, she (the author) knows that life is forever changed. There is not getting over it, but only getting under it. Loss and grief change our landscape. The terrain is forever different and there is no normal return to. There is only the inner task of making a new and accurate map. As she (the author) so wisely says,

- We're not here to fix our pain, but to tend to it."




