Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We give thanks and praise to almighty God for giving us a new successor of St. Peter. Rejoicing in the selection of **Pope Leo XIV**, we also pray for him and the whole Catholic Church. This moment marks a new chapter in the life of the Church and the world, and we receive our new Holy Father with hearts full of anticipation. We are confident that under his leadership, the Church will continue to grow in faith in God, unity, and service.

We pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and strengthen him as he begins this new ministry as the Vicar of Christ. May **Pope Leo XIV** be a true shepherd after the heart of Jesus, guiding us to greater holiness and deeper communion with the Lord and with one another.

Jesus announces the great commandment: "This is how all will know you for my disciples: your love for one another."

Jesus' theme of love is outlined marvelously in this short story on Mother Teresa from *Celebration* magazine and I wanted to share it with you.

Do Ordinary Things with EXTRAOrdinary Love

One day, as the late Mother Teresa (1910-1997) and her Missionaries of Charity were tending to the poorest of the poor on the streets of Calcutta, they happened to come across a man lying in the gutter, very near death. He was filthy, dressed in little more than a rag and flies swarmed around his body. Immediately Mother Teresa embraced him, spoke to him softly and began to pick out the maggots that were nesting in his flesh. A passerby was repulsed by the sight of the man and exclaimed to Mother Teresa, "I wouldn't do that for a million dollars." Her response was immediate, "Neither would I."

Obviously, monetary gain did not motivate the diminutive woman known as the Saint of Calcutta; love did. In her writings, Mother Teresa frequently affirmed the motivating power of love. Quoting Jesus in today's Gospel, she wrote, "Jesus said, 'Love one another. Such as my love has been for you, so must your love be for each other.' She continued, "We must grow in love and to do this we must go on loving and loving and giving and giving until it hurts the way Jesus did. Do ordinary things with extraordinary love: little things, like caring for the sick and the homeless, the lonely and the unwanted, washing and cleaning for them."

Elsewhere, Mother Teresa remarked that the greatest disease in the West today is not tuberculosis, leprosy or even A.I.D.S.; it is being unwanted, uncared for, unloved. That she did her part in trying to "cure" this disease was attested in everything she did and in every word that she said.

As today's readings indicate, love has been the great motivator of Christianity from the beginning. Love of God, love of Christ, love of the Gospel and love for humanity motivated the earliest missionaries to persevere in the faith even when they had to undergo many trials.

This next week, let's do ordinary things with extraordinary love.

Mrs. Pham will take a leadership role that includes curriculum development, student testing and faculty observations and evaluations.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I've always found it amazing that Jesus never says to his disciples the straightforward and bumper stickery words "I love you" or "I will always love you" (a la Dolly Parton's song). Why doesn't Jesus say, "I love you"?

Well, actually he does, but in particular ways. He says, **"As the Father loves me, so I love you"** (John 15:9) thereby rooting his love for us in the space of the Holy Trinity. This week he commands, **"Love another as I have loved you"** (John 13:34). He presents his love for us as a completed action which continues into the present moment. How *has* he loved us? By becoming one of us, one with us, and finally giving his life for us in his suffering on the cross. We weren't there when he did that, but neither were his Apostles (except one). Still, that action is his great "I love you" to us.

His love is also hedged in a command: **"Love one another."** So how can we practically follow it? The great St. John XXIII wrote in his diary that each day he followed this rule: "Only for today, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it." The hidden nature of a good deed is a sign that it is truly loving. This week, take on St. John XXIII's practical method of following Jesus' great commandment of love. It's a splendid way to say, "I love you."

Two videos are the centerpiece of the training: A Time to Protect God's Children™ and A Plan to Protect God's Children™. The facilitators incorporate policies and procedures into the training defining child sexual abuse, addressing the reporting of child sexual abuse, the screening and selection of employees and volunteers, and victim advocacy.

Child sexual abusers often target nurturing, child-friendly environments, where parents and participants assume that no one would ever want to harm a child. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles began implementing the VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children sexual abuse prevention program in 2004 to send a message to potential predators that child sexual abuse is not tolerated. Through this program, adults learn that through early identification, awareness, and education they can be "proactive" in protecting children and young people from child sexual abuse. Since the program began, more than 405,000 adults have been trained in abuse prevention. Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur.
