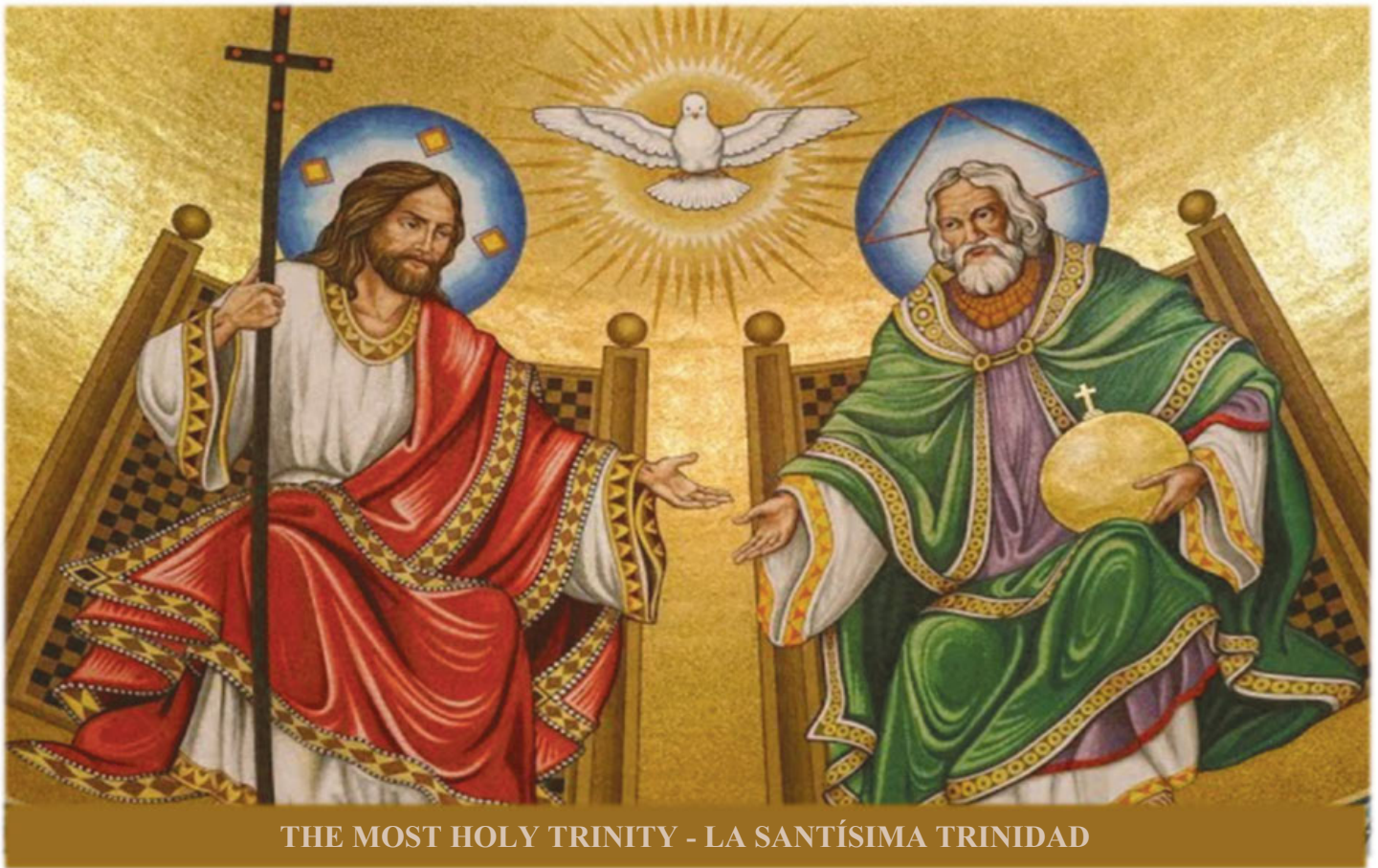

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

We gather to celebrate **Trinity Sunday**. This awesome mystery of our faith gives us a glimpse into the very Being of God's own divine Self. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC #249) explains,

From the beginning, the revealed truth of the Holy Trinity has been at the very root of the Church's living faith, principally through Baptism. It finds its expression in the rule of baptismal faith, formulated in the preaching, catechesis, and prayer of the Church. Such formulations are already found in the apostolic writings, such as this salutation taken up in the Eucharistic liturgy: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." (a footnote in the CCC references: 2 Corinthians 13:13)

We also see the Trinitarian formula at the conclusion of the Gospel of Matthew when Jesus gives his Great Commission:

Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age. (Matthew 28:19-20)

Over the first centuries, this Scriptural foundation raised many questions and led to different understandings of the mystery of the Trinity. It was the Councils of Nicaea (the 1700th anniversary of which we observe this year) and Constantinople-I in which the Church wrestled with ways to best formulate our understanding of this mystery. The work of these early councils rejected errors and led to the formulation of the Creed, the Profession of Faith we pray at Mass on Sundays.

Of course, no human formulation can capture the fullness of the divine. Our human words keep us on the right track, but we need to recall that these are always our finite attempts to express the reality of the infinite. God's Self is always beyond us. Nonetheless, in the dogma of the Holy Trinity we are privileged to be invited by God into the beauty and wonder of God's inner life. In light of the Trinity, we can better appreciate the proclamation found in the First Letter of John that "God is love" (1 John 4:8). That God is One in Three divine Persons, that God is Father-Son-Spirit, helps us understand how Christ's revelation of God's love for us and his call that we love one another flows out of God's very Nature. How blessed we are that God loves us so much as to choose to reveal this glimpse into the wonder of the divine.

This weekend we celebrate **Fathers' Day** and it seems so appropriate that it coincides with Trinity Sunday since it was Jesus who taught us to call God our Abba, our Father in heaven. Our Christian understanding is that human fatherhood is a sacred vocation that reflects this divine fatherhood. Truly, this is a beautiful and challenging vocation. So today and often let us pray for all fathers. We will have a special blessing for our fathers after Communion at all of our liturgies today.

Jesus, who sends us the Spirit of truth, may we always allow your love and truth to enfold us and guide us. Holy Mary, our dear Mother, pray for us that we always appreciate the awesome beauty and love of our Triune God!

It is a day in which we both somberly reflect on the evil of slavery that haunted our land for centuries, as well as a day of joyful thanksgiving to God for the long and arduous process that freed our land from that pernicious evil. It is also a day to pray that we make continued progress in overcoming the ongoing evils of racism and other forms of prejudice that deny the human dignity God gives to all people. Finally, today it is well to recall that slavery is not yet eradicated throughout the world, and a destructive new form of slavery, human trafficking, has arisen. And so, we rededicate ourselves to our Catholic principles of respect for human dignity and pray that justice may flourish in our land and our world.

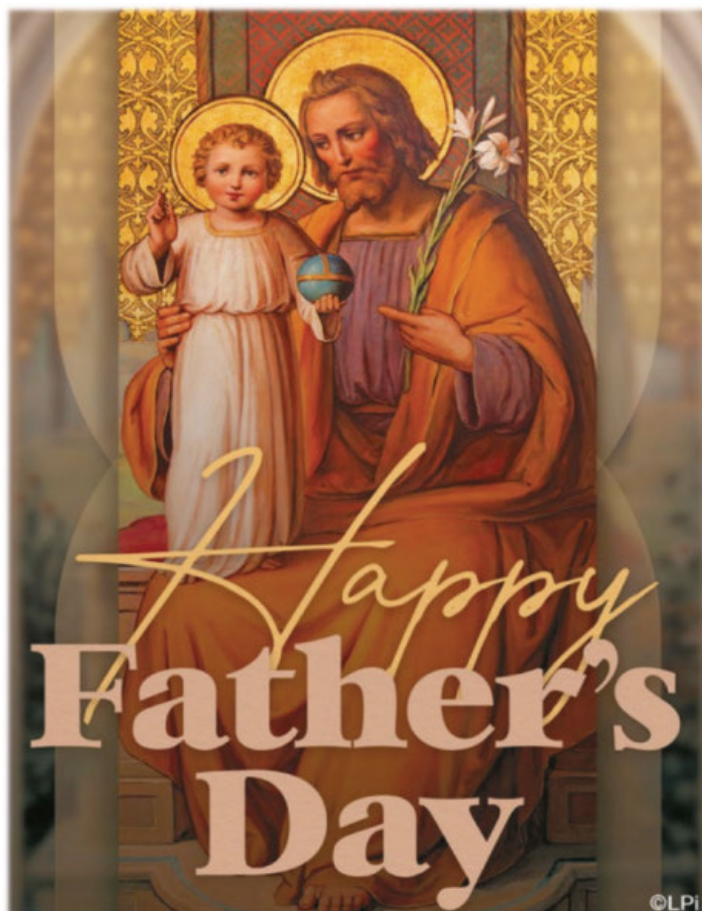

This week, on Saturday, June 21, we celebrate the *Memorial of St. Aloysius Gonzaga*, a Jesuit scholar who lived in the sixteenth century and who died at the early age of 23. He came from a wealthy princely background. At age 7, he had a profound spiritual experience. Despite opposition, he eventually renounced his inheritance and joined the Jesuits. When the plague hit Rome, Aloysius cared for the sick and dying until he himself caught the plague and died three months later. He is the patron saint of young people. DID YOU KNOW? BODY SAFETY INFORMATION FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

Children should know the difference between “okay” and “not okay” or “good” and “bad” touches — touches that are welcome and comforting, and those that are intrusive, unwanted, painful, or uncomfortable. Children should know that they have the right to say “no” to being touched, even to adults, and that no children or adults should touch their private parts unless in very specific circumstances, and for a healthy purpose. This is where it can be helpful to discuss “safe adults,” like doctors, who check our bodies to help keep us healthy, and only in the presence of a parent or trusted adult. MENSAJE DEL PÁRROCO

Queridos feligreses,

Nos reunimos para celebrar **el Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad**. Este asombroso misterio de nuestra fe nos da una visión del Ser mismo del propio Ser divino de Dios. Como explica *el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica (CIC #249)*,

Desde el principio, la verdad revelada de la Santísima Trinidad ha estado en la raíz misma de la fe viva de la Iglesia, principalmente a través del Bautismo. Encuentra su expresión en la regla de la fe bautismal, formulada en la predicación, la catequesis y la oración de la Iglesia. Tales formulaciones se encuentran ya en los escritos apostólicos, como esta salutación recogida en la liturgia eucarística: "La gracia del Señor Jesucristo, el amor de Dios y la comunión del Espíritu Santo estén con todos vosotros". (una nota a pie de página en las *Referencias del CIC* : 2 Corintios 13:13)

También vemos la fórmula trinitaria en la conclusión del Evangelio de Mateo cuando Jesús da su Gran Comisión:

Vayan, pues, y hagan discípulos a todas las naciones, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo, enseñándoles a guardar todo lo que yo les he mandado. Y he aquí, yo estoy con ustedes todos los días, hasta el fin del mundo. (Mateo 28:19-20.)

A lo largo de los primeros siglos, este fundamento bíblico planteó muchas preguntas y condujo a diferentes interpretaciones del misterio de la Trinidad. Fueron los Concilios de Nicea (cuyo 1700 aniversario conmemoramos este año) y Constantinopla I en los que la Iglesia luchó con la manera de formular mejor nuestro entendimiento de este misterio. El trabajo de estos primeros concilios rechazó los errores y condujo a la formulación del Credo, la Profesión de Fe que rezamos en la Misa los domingos.

Por supuesto, ningún enunciado humano puede capturar la plenitud de lo divino. Nuestras palabras humanas nos mantienen en el camino correcto, pero debemos recordar que estos son siempre nuestros intentos finitos de expresar la realidad del infinito. El Ser de Dios siempre está más allá de nosotros. Sin embargo, en el dogma de la Santísima Trinidad tenemos el privilegio de ser invitados por Dios a la belleza y a la maravilla de la vida interior de Dios. CELEBRACIONES ESPECIALES DE ESTA SEMANA

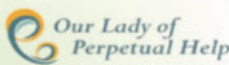

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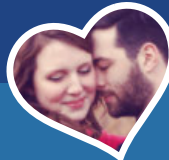
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
