

MESSAGE FROM FR. FRANCIS

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

The following reflection was written by Fr. Jonah Lee, a Benedictine abbot currently working to establish a Catholic monastery in war-torn Burma. I'm also proud to call him my cousin. I believe his reflection is particularly fitting for Labor Day. Due to the limited space in our bulletin, his reflection has been significantly edited.

Rest in a Fatigue Society

A philosopher once described today's world as a "fatigue society" (Han Byung-Chul, The Burnout Society, 2012), where unprecedented levels of burnout and depression arise from relentless pressure to achieve. In this "performance society," individuals have become their own taskmasters, constantly pushing themselves to meet ever-increasing demands.

The Fatigue Society

In the past, labor was imposed by rulers or systems; now, we often exploit ourselves in the pursuit of success. This self-exploitation leads to "infinite exploitation," where people remain unaware of how deeply they are affected. The result? A "depressive society," marked by burnout, depression, and even suicide.

The Fatigue Church?

Given this context, the concepts of "healing" and "rest" naturally resonate. But we must ask: Is the Church diagnosing the root causes of this thirst for rest and offering true healing through the Gospel? Or is it simply following the trend, trying to attract more 'customers'? If the latter is true, we risk becoming a "fatigue church" within a fatigue society, serving as a remedy for burnout rather than a source of radical transformation.

Rest and Contemplation

The Rule of St. Benedict instructs monks to "devote themselves to holy reading," using the verb vacare, meaning "to empty." In this sense, prayer time, including scriptural reading, is fundamentally an "empty time," where the "weary and burdened soul" finds rest (cf. Matthew 11:28-30). True "holy leisure" is found here.

In ancient and medieval traditions, "rest" often connects to contemplation. Rest as contemplation, or prayer as rest, is not just a way to recharge but a participation in the divine rest of God.

Resting Only After Arrival

Today, many struggle to rest even when there is no work, believing happiness lies in reaching some future goal. But the Gospel tells us that we have already arrived. Despite delays and setbacks, God stands before us, offering mercy and forgiveness...and rest.

In this "now," we find true rest, deep relief, and God's presence in everything. "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you" (St. Augustine, Confessions 1, 1).

As we observe Labor Day, let us remember that true rest is not just a break from work, but a spiritual practice that brings us closer to God and to the true purpose of our lives.

Eucharistic Miracle of Tidal Alatri, Italy – 1228

On In the town of Alatri, Italy in 1228, a young woman consulted a sorceress in an attempt to regain the love of her sweetheart who had lost interest in her. The sorceress ordered her to steal a Consecrated Host to make a love potion.

The young woman received the Eucharist and removed it shortly after taking it in her mouth and discreetly put the Host in a cloth. When she arrived home, she began having doubts about taking it to the sorceress. After several nights of fitful sleep, she went to look at the Host in the cloth and burst into tears to discover the Host had been transformed into bleeding flesh.

Her family, shocked at what had happened, called a priest. The priest retrieved the Host (now flesh and blood) and brought it to the Church. People heard what happened and came to the church to pray.

The fact that red blood cells in fresh blood breakdown within 48 hours without refrigeration, makes this an extraordinary event. The miraculous flesh, over 800 years later, is still visible in a monstrance in the Cathedral of St. Paul the Apostle in Altri, Italy.

The miracle has been extensively documented specifically in the Papal *Bull, Fraternitas Tuae* (March 13, 1228) written by Pope Gregory IX.



Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

CATHOLIC TEACHING ON LABOR

As we celebrate Labor Day, can you tell me about Catholic teaching regarding labor?

ANSWER:

QUESTION:

One of the most important principles of Catholic social teaching is the dignity of work and the rights of workers. Four encyclicals address this foundational social teaching: Rerum Novarum (1891) by Leo XIII, Quadragesimo Anno (1931) by Pius XI, Laborem Exercens (1981), and Centesimus Annus (1991) by John Paul II. They address both the theology and dignity of work. In Genesis, God takes the initiative in creating the world, calling forth human beings to be faithful stewards of creation. We are thus formed to share in God's continuing creative activity by partnering with God in finishing the world and helping bring it to completion and fulfillment. From this perspective, work can be spiritually understood in terms of sharing in God's ongoing activity to build, create, and transform the world. Human beings are cocreators with God. This vocation demands self-discipline.

Besides an exercise in self-discipline, work is also the means by which we develop and fulfill ourselves. In work, we shape the world and our environment. Through work, we also shape ourselves. Pope John Paul II summarized this point in Laborem Exercens #6, "the value of work is not primarily the kind of work being done, but the fact that the one who is doing it is a person."

Labor Day offers an excellent opportunity to reflect on how we view work in light of our Catholic social teaching.




