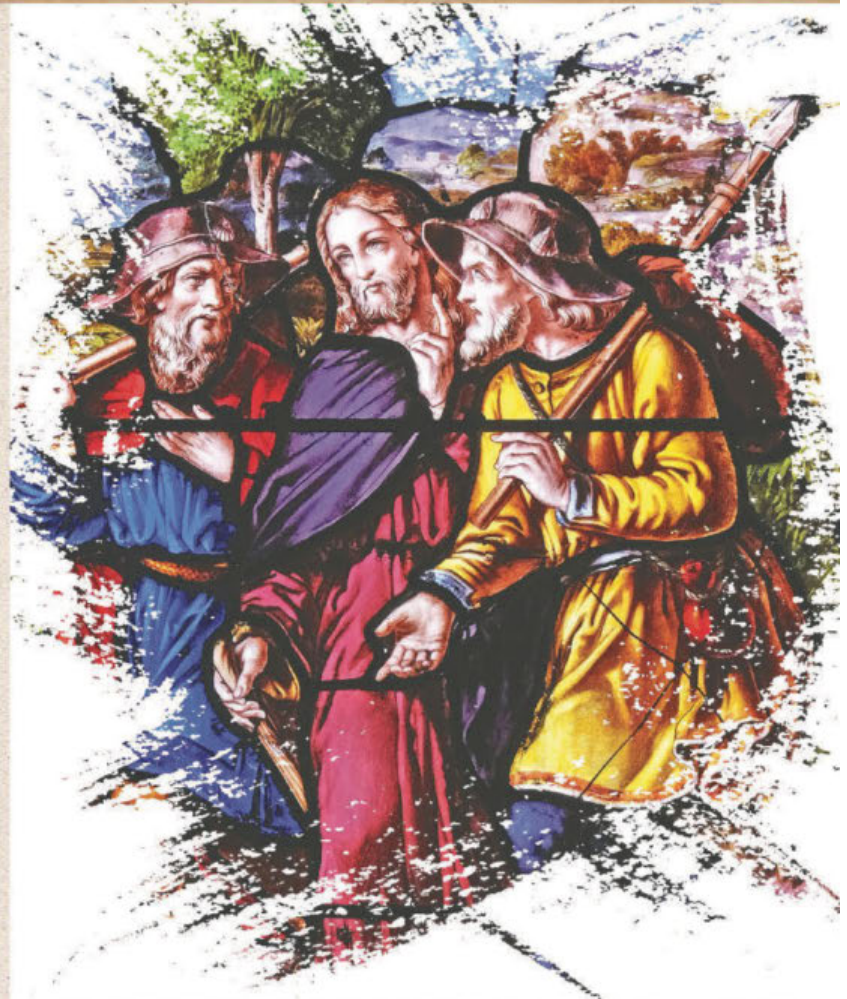

MESSAGE FROM FR. FRANCIS

Children often ask some of the deepest philosophical and theological questions. So, I decided to ask a few of our Visitation students if they had any questions about their faith.

Dear Fr. Francis,

“What is God?” “How was God made?” “What is God made of?”

Dear Natanya, Isabella, and Mason,

Thank you for these amazing questions! I'll do my best to explain, but remember, God is always greater than anything we can fully understand. St. Augustine once said, “God is closer to us than we are to ourselves.” That's a great reminder that while we can know and experience God, He will always remain the most beautiful and elusive mystery.

So, *“What is God?”*

God is our loving creator who made everything in the world. God exists as three-in-one (Father+Son+Holy Spirit=One God). Our minds can't make complete sense of this, and that's why theologians call God “Ultimate Mystery,” “Holy Mystery,” “The Unknowable,” “The Wholly Other,” etc. And we acknowledge this Ultimate Mystery every time we make the sign of the cross: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. But even though God is this Wholly Other, “God is within us, and we do not need to seek Him outside ourselves” (St. Teresa of Avila), “God is in everything, and He is as close to us as the soul is to the body” (St. Julian of Norwich), “In Him we live and move and have our being” (Acts 17:28), “...you know God, for He dwells with you and will be in you” (John 14:17). And we acknowledge our intimacy with God every time we make the sign of the cross: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

“How was God made?” “What is God made of?”

God was never made. He is eternal, meaning He has no beginning and no end. God always existed and is the source of all creation, but He Himself was not created. God is pure spirit and not made of physical matter. He is beyond what we can see or touch, existing in a perfect, eternal nature that is purely spiritual, without any material form.

Hope this helps, and I look forward to many more questions from our students!

CHRISTIAN MEDITATION

"Sometimes it seems that our many words are more an expression of our doubt than our faith. It is as if we are not sure that God's Spirit can touch the hearts of people: we have to help Him out and with many words, convince others of His power. But it is precisely this wordy unbelief which quenches the fire." Henri Nouwen, *The Way of the Heart: Desert Spirituality and Contemporary Ministry*, p. 47.

Christian meditation is an apophatic form of prayer (i.e. imageless prayer, contemplative prayer) in contrast to cataphatic prayer (e.g. the Rosary, Ignatian Exercises, etc.). Of course, there's nothing wrong in praying with words, but if we're not careful we can end up with a prayer life that's excessively wordy and we end up "babbling like the pagans," which Jesus commands us not to do (Matt. 6:7).

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

HOLY WATER

QUESTION:

What is holy water and how do I explain the reason that it is placed at the entrances of churches to my non-Catholic friends?

ANSWER:

Holy water is a sacramental, a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as he entrusts to the Church his saving mission (to give grace). In turn the Church, through the sacraments, shares that grace and mission with us.

On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes on our foreheads to remind us of our origins, humbly created from the dust. But by blessing ourselves with holy water, we are reminded of our destiny! We are baptized sons and daughters of God. This is also a call to conversion, to live more fully our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus. We see holy water whenever we renew our baptismal promises. This will occur during the Easter liturgy as well, reminding us that we are indeed on a journey of faith and renewed in Christ. Blessing ourselves with holy water reminds us that we are baptized into a community faith, and always in need of turning from sin and toward God. Holy water is a visible sign of our baptism.

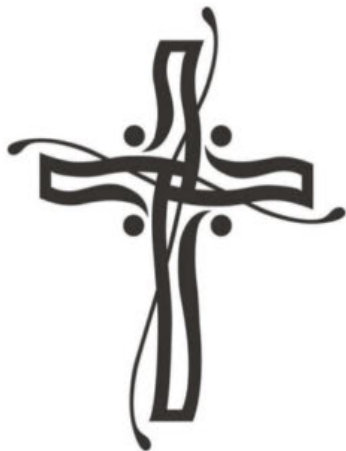
