MESSAGE FROM FR. FRANCIS

Dear Parish Family,

On October 4th, we celebrate the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, a saint beloved for his deep humility, love for the poor, and profound respect for all of God's creation. St. Francis reminds us that everything in creation—whether it be the earth, animals, or human beings—is a reflection of God's love and deserves our care and reverence.

As the patron saint of animals and ecology, St. Francis' life calls us to see the beauty and dignity in all creatures and to protect and care for the world God has entrusted to us. He saw the natural world as a gift from God, referring to the elements of creation as "Brother Sun" and "Sister Moon," emphasizing that we are all connected in a great family under God's loving gaze.

Our Responsibility to Creation

In honoring St. Francis, we are reminded of our own responsibility to safeguard the environment. "What all of us have to understand about meditation is that we are not meditating in order to make something happen. We are not meditating in order to get some sort of insight. Eucharistic Miracle 1902 – The Miracle at the Church of Saint-Andre

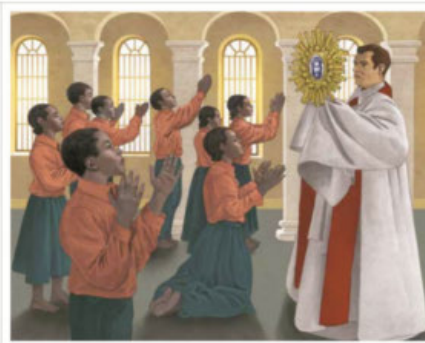

On January 26, 1902, in the parish church of Saint-André, a city on the island of La Réunion, a Eucharistic Miracle occurred. Abbot Henry Lacombe, the pastor of the church, was witness to this miracle. The face of Jesus appeared in the Host which was for many hours witnessed by thousands of people.

During a 40-hour devotion of perpetual Adoration, Abbot Lacombe began to say Mass. After the elevation, during the Our Father, Lacombe reported that he saw a bright halo around the rays of the monstrance. As he continued on with the Mass, perplexed, he looked again toward the exposed host in the monstrance and saw a human face with lowered eyes and a crown of thorns on the forehead.

Not believing his own eyes, after Mass the Abbot went to the sacristy and summoned the older children from the choir to go to the altar and report back what they saw in the monstrance. The children raced back and said: "Father, we see the head of a man in the Host. It is the good Lord revealing Himself! At that moment, Abbot Lacombe knew the vision was authentic.

Eventually the entire town went to the church to see the miracle along with journalists and people from the capital city of Saint Denis. The face on the Host suddenly became animated and the crown of thorns disappeared. Later on, the vision changed again and a crucifix appeared which covered the entire Host from top to bottom. After the Eucharistic blessing, the vision disappeared.

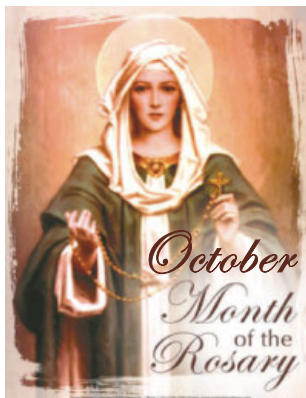

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

ANNULMENTS

QUESTION:

I read in the catechism that marriage is indissoluble. Why then does the Church issue annulments?

ANSWER:

Sacramental marriage is indeed indissoluble. You can find this in several places in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Indissolubility is foundational to the union of marriage (CCC 1646) and required by spousal love (CCC 1644).

This quality of marriage draws its meaning from the fidelity of Jesus to his Bride, the Church (CCC 1647). Spouses give themselves forever to each other. Through the vows and their consummation, the spouses form a covenantal bond that binds them as one. Indissolubility presumes and depends on this sacramental bond between the spouses.

Sometimes, however, there are impediments to marriage that are overlooked, poorly understood, or unknown. It is possible that at the time of the vows, something was either present or absent that made the consent invalid. The ceremony itself does not bring about the sacrament. The priest is the official witness of the Church, but he is not the minister of the sacrament. The husband and wife are the ministers of the sacrament to each other. Without the full, free, and able consent of the man and the woman, no sacrament takes place. An annulment does not destroy the marriage bond. It is an acknowledgement that the sacramental bond did not form in the first place.
