MESSAGE FROM FR. FRANCIS

Dear Parish Family,

After thoughtful consultation with the Parish Staff and Pastoral Council, what we once termed “Hospitality” will now be called “Coffee and Donuts.” This isn’t just a shift in terminology but a reflection of our effort to broaden what hospitality really means, going far beyond offering snacks and refreshments. I was inspired by the article *How to Nurture Hospitality* from *The Priest* magazine, which highlights the deeper values of welcome, generosity, and community building, drawing from the biblical story of Abraham.

The article explores how parishes can foster genuine hospitality, drawing inspiration from the biblical story of Abraham welcoming three strangers who turn out to be divine messengers.

Here are seven lessons from the article:

- 1. A Big Tent Mentality:** Abraham’s tent was open to everyone, reflecting the importance of inclusivity in our parishes. We should extend a warm welcome to others, avoiding a parish-centered mentality and maintaining a missionary spirit.
- 2. Leaving Comfort Zones:** Abraham ran to greet his guests despite the heat, symbolizing the need for us to step out of our comfort zones in order to welcome others and show true hospitality.
- 3. Respect for Others:** Abraham bowed before his guests, showing respect. Similarly, we should honor visitors and see them as a reflection of God’s presence, ensuring our hospitality is sincere and respectful.
- 4. Serving Others Selflessly:** Like Abraham offering water for his guests’ feet, we should practice humble, selfless service, as exemplified by Jesus washing His disciples’ feet.
- 5. Going Above and Beyond:** Abraham exceeded expectations in providing for his guests. Likewise, we are called to go the extra mile in serving others, ensuring our actions reflect generosity and care.
- 6. Serving with Humility:** Abraham served his guests as a servant, teaching us to approach hospitality with a servant’s heart, ready to fulfill the needs of others.
- 7. Experiencing God’s Wonder:** The encounter with God and the promise of a future son show that hospitality opens us up to experiencing the wonder of God through others.

These lessons challenge us to examine how we serve others and encourage us to create a parish community where hospitality goes beyond just “coffee and donuts.” True hospitality should permeate every aspect of parish life, reflecting God’s love and presence in all we do. May we at Visitation continue to build a community rooted in care, compassion, and the welcoming spirit of Christ.

ROSARIES AS DECORATIONS

QUESTION: I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around their necks. Is it OK to do that?

ANSWER: The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

LORD'S PRAYER

QUESTION:

Why don't Catholics add the "For yours is the Kingdom ..." prayer at the end of the Our Father like Protestants do? Where did it come from?

ANSWER:

The conclusion of the Lord's Prayer that you refer to is called a doxology, which is a prayer of glory and praise. This particular doxology we do use in the Mass. After the Our Father, the priest prays the prayer that begins, "Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil..." and the people respond with the doxology. The doxology is not found in the Bible, but it is very ancient. It was first found in The Didache, also called "The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles," which dates probably from about the year AD 90. It was a letter of instruction to early converts to Christianity. Protestantism dates only to the sixteenth century, so the doxology is actually a Catholic prayer. Some scholars and the catechism (#2760) indicate that the doxology was connected to the celebration of the Eucharist and was not used apart from it.

Remember, both the Lord's Prayer and the Eucharist were part of the "mysteries of faith," things taught only to believers. Ironically, a remnant of a prayer used during the celebration of the Eucharist has come to be used widely by many Christian churches that do not celebrate the Eucharist! Truth is indeed stranger than fiction!
