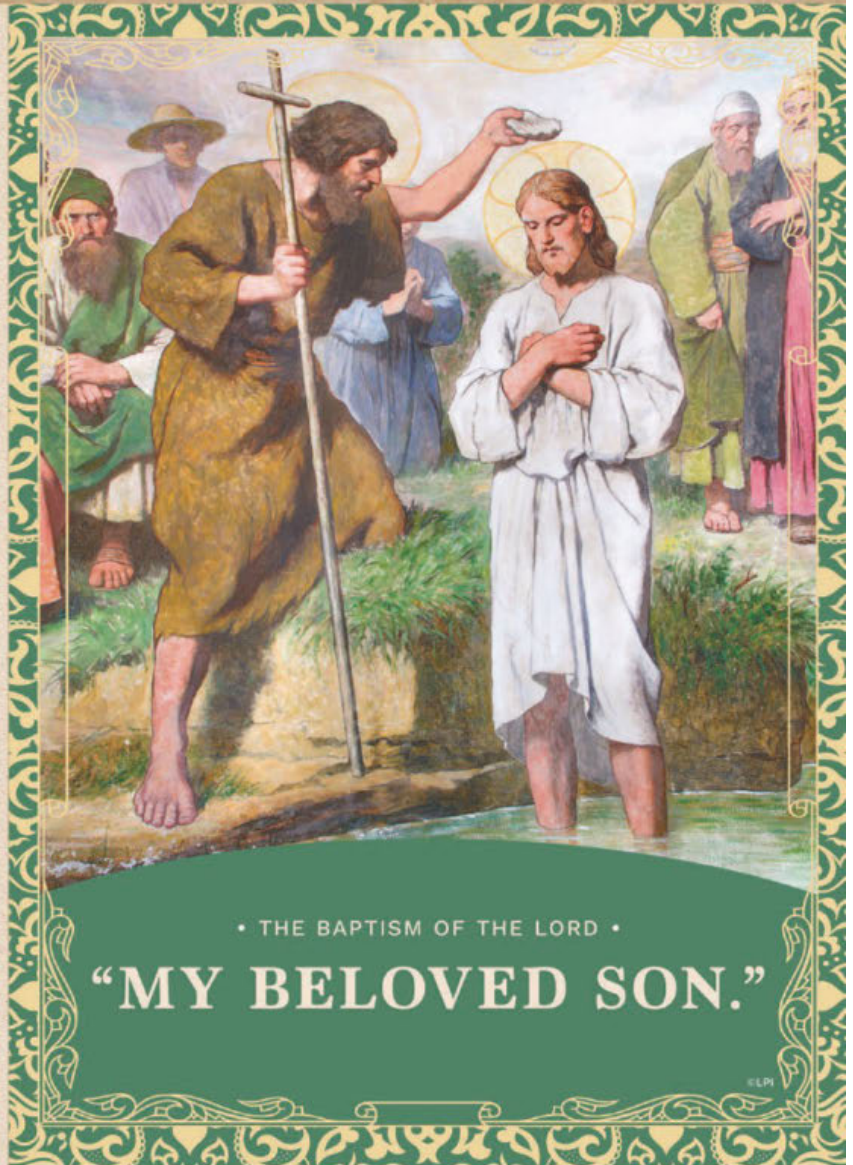

Dear Parish Family,

Today, we celebrate the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**, a moment that marks both the **end of the Christmas season** and the **beginning of Jesus' public ministry**.

Historical Roots of the Feast

In the **early Church**, the Baptism of Jesus was celebrated alongside the **Epiphany** on January 6th, emphasizing both His baptism in the Jordan and the visit of the Magi as revelations of His divine identity. By the **4th century**, the Western Church began to separate these feasts, giving the **Baptism of the Lord** its own focus. After the **Second Vatican Council**, the Church placed this celebration on the **Sunday following Epiphany**, highlighting its importance as a bridge between the Christmas season and Ordinary Time.

Theological Significance

- **Affirmation of Jesus' Identity:** At His baptism, a voice from heaven declares, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Mark 1:11). This moment reveals **Jesus as the Son of God** and marks the beginning of His public ministry.
- **Anointing by the Holy Spirit:** The descent of the **Holy Spirit in the form of a dove** signifies Jesus' anointing for His mission of teaching, healing, and salvation.
- **A Model of Humility and Obedience:** Though sinless, Jesus submits to baptism by John, teaching us **humility and obedience to God's will**.
- **Sanctification of Baptismal Waters:** Jesus' immersion in the Jordan sanctifies the waters of baptism, making them a source of grace for all who follow Him.

The Feast in Our Lives Today

This feast is not just a reflection on Jesus' baptism but also a **renewal of our own baptismal promises**. Through baptism, we are:

- **Affirmed as beloved children of God.**
- **Empowered by the Holy Spirit to live our faith boldly.**
- **Called to participate in Christ's mission of love, healing, and reconciliation.**

A Time for Reflection and Renewal

As we celebrate the **Baptism of the Lord**, we are reminded to:

- **Reflect on our own baptismal identity.**
- **Renew our commitment to live as disciples of Christ.**
- **Trust in the Holy Spirit's guidance in our daily lives.**

May this feast inspire us to embrace our baptismal call with **courage, humility, and faith**, living as beloved children of God and witnesses to His love in the world.

"Meditation is practiced in solitude but it is the great way to learn to be in relationship. The reason for this paradox is that, having contacted our own reality, we have the existential confidence to go out to others, to meet them at their real level, and so the solitary element in meditation is mysteriously the true antidote to loneliness. Having contacted our conformity with reality, we are no longer threatened by the otherness of others. We are not always looking for an affirmation of ourselves. We are making loves search, looking for the reality of the other. In the experience of encountering the reality of the other, we discover our own existence enriched and deepened. Meditation is demanding. We must learn to meditate whether we feel like it or not, whether it is raining or snowing, or the sun is shining and whatever is on television or whatever kind of day we have had. In the Christian vision of meditation, a perspective gained from the words of Jesus, we find the reality of the great paradox He teaches: if we want to find our lives we have to be prepared to lose it. In meditating, that is exactly what we do. We find ourselves because we are prepared to let go of ourselves, to launch ourselves out into the depths which soon appear to be the depths of God. The essential message of Christianity is that God is present in the depths of each human being. That is why we must learn humility. That is why we must learn silence; because we must enter those depths of our self to encounter the otherness of God and in that encounter, to discover our essential self in union with God." Fr. January is the month dedicated to the Most Holy Name of Jesus. Everything about our divine Lord is holy, including His Name. It was the Archangel Gabriel who first spoke the name of Jesus to His mother, “Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus” (Luke 1:31). The Archangel was only a messenger, so the name of Jesus was given to Him by the Father in Heaven.

Saint Peter was one of the first Apostles to speak with authority in the Holy Name of Jesus when he healed a crippled man saying, “I have neither silver nor gold, but what I do have I give you: in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean, rise and walk” (Acts 3:6). Saint Paul also exalted the holy name of Jesus when he said, “...at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father” (Philippians 2:9–10). Saint Paul preached with power in the name of Jesus so often that even some itinerant Jewish exorcists tried to imitate him by commanding demons, “I adjure you by the Jesus whom Paul preaches” (Acts 19:13).

According to Harvard, walking "boosts immune function. Walking can help protect you during cold and flu season. A study of over 1,000 men and women found that those who walked at least 20 minutes a day, at least 5 days a week, had 43% fewer sick days than those who exercised once a week or less. And if they did get sick, it was for a shorter duration, and their symptoms were milder."

DID YOU KNOW? The REPORT Act protects minors online

A bipartisan bill passed last year is helping internet platforms protect children from abuse and enticement in their online interactions. The REPORT Act, passed in May 2024, requires U.S.-based online platforms to report child sex trafficking and online enticement to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC). To assist with this, NCMEC has issued guidelines intended to help online platforms play a crucial role in protecting children by recognizing key signs and indicators of child sexual exploitation. Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

BAPTISMAL BIB

QUESTION:

At my grandson's Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. I do not remember seeing this before. Why is this done? Is it something new?

ANSWER:

When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.

Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like and fit over the baby's head. Others are simply placed on the baby's chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all: "See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers and this is symbolized by the white garment.

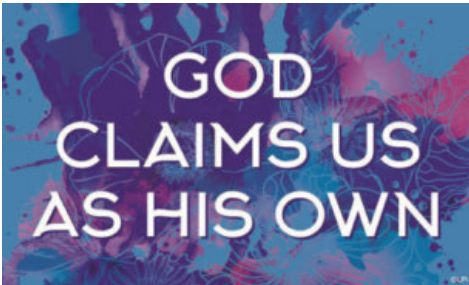
