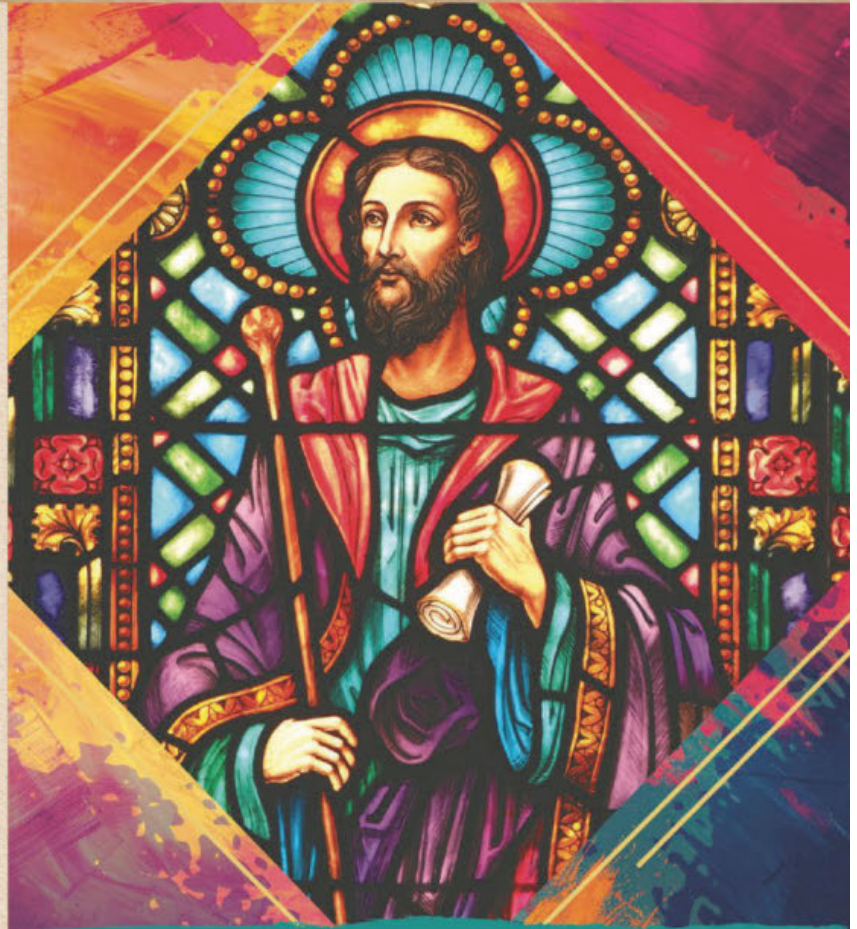

Dear Parish Family,

For the next six weeks, the 2nd Reading will be coming from the First Epistle (i.e. Letter) of St. Paul to the Corinthians. It was written by St. Paul around AD 55, and it addresses the Christian community in Corinth, a major Greek city known for its cultural diversity, wealth, and moral challenges. Corinth was a busy trade hub, but it was also marked by divisions, immorality, and spiritual confusion, which had crept into the life of the early Church there.

Paul wrote this letter to address various issues troubling the community, including:

- Divisions among believers over leadership.
- Moral and ethical problems, such as sexual immorality and lawsuits among Christians.
- Questions about worship, including the Lord's Supper and the use of spiritual gifts.
- Doctrinal concerns, especially about the resurrection of the dead.

Through this letter, Paul emphasizes the centrality of Christ, the importance of unity in the Church, and living lives of love and holiness. One of its most famous passages is what's known as the "Hymn of Love" found in 1 Corinthians 13, which highlights love as the greatest virtue. It's a verse that's worth repeating here and perhaps in our own lives and with family and friends:

"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres." (1 Cor 13:4-7)

"We...possess the mind of Christ. (1 Cor. 2:16).' The ongoing pilgrimage of meditation leads us to an ever-deeper encounter with the essential theology of prayer. What does St Paul mean when he says we possess the mind of Christ? We know from the doctrine of the indwelling of the Holy Spirit that the fullness of God is to be found in our own hearts. We know that the full life of the Trinity is lived in our hearts. This is because Jesus Christ dwells in our hearts. His human consciousness is to be found within each of us. The journey of prayer is simply to find the way to open our human consciousness to His human consciousness and to become, on that way, fully conscious ourselves. The way passes beyond all dividedness, for there is no longer any subject or object, there is only full consciousness containing both.

This is the wonder of the doctrine of the Incarnation. Jesus being man and possessing a human consciousness, is our way to the Father. Humanly it is possible for us to open our human consciousness to His. That is the marvel, indeed the perfection, of the Christian revelation, that He is the Way, and He is the One Way because His love embraces all human ways. He is the universal redeemer and the universal sanctifier. He can be so for us because His human consciousness is fully open to the Father in the Spirit of love. When in the silence of prayer, and the concentration of our meditation, we open our human consciousness to Him, we go beyond Him, to the Father. We go beyond Him by His power of self-transcending love.

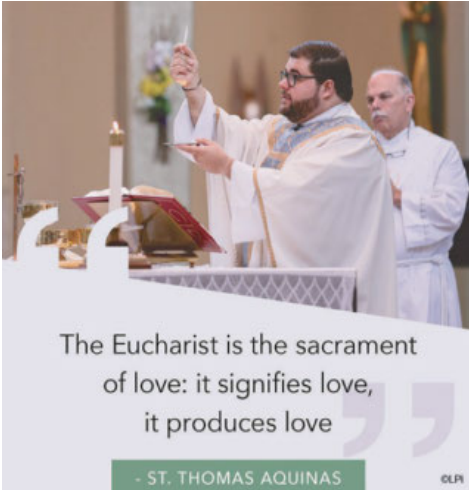

Is it a school with a parish, or is it a parish with a school? It is a question I always consider when people ask me about Catholic Schools Week, though you might look at that opening question and ask, "What?"

It is a good question, because our parish communities have a mandate from the Gospel to preach the good news. Moreover, that is exactly what a good Catholic school does. It is another one of the ministries of a parish: to educate well-rounded individuals in Gospel values, preparing those young individuals to take their eventual place in the larger secular community. All the educational efforts of the parish school are focused on the life of faith. That faith is formed in knowledge of the teachings of the Church and of the Gospel, and those qualities are demonstrated through a life of service to the community.

A Catholic school is a community of faith, knowledge, and service, as a ministry of the parish community; and Catholic Schools Week provides a wonderful opportunity for us to reflect on whether we have "a school with a parish, or a parish with a school," and make sure our parish school is living its mandate from the Church.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

LOVE AS A THEOLOGICAL VIRTUE

QUESTION:

I've heard that love is a theological virtue. What does that mean?

ANSWER:

Charles Shultz, the creator of the *Peanuts* comics wrote, "I love mankind ... it's people I can't stand!" This good humored comment gets at an important truth. St. John wrote a very strong statement in one of his letters: "If anyone says 'I love God,' but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1 John 4:20). How often do we say "I love the homeless," but ignore the parish food drive? Or insist on the importance of respecting others, but don't bother to say hello to our cashier? If we can't love an individual person, we might not love people like we think, and we certainly need to work on our love for God.

Love is "the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for His own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God" (CCC 1822). God knows acts of love of Him and others isn't always easy. So He invites us to pray for the grace to do it. The virtue of love gives us the grace and strength we need to offer our lives to God and love people in our lives, especially those who are difficult to respect, tolerate, and care for. Real love, of course, is risky. Real love wills the good of the other when we just want good for ourselves. Real love gets up on the cross when we'd prefer to take a nap in Gethsemane. Real love changes things.
