

Message from Fr. Francis

Dear Parish Family,

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us one of His most challenging commands: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you."

These words are just as radical today as when Jesus first spoke them. We don't have to look far to see how divided our world is—politics, social issues, personal conflicts. The instinct to fight back, to return hate for hate, is strong. **But Christ calls us to be more—more merciful, more generous, more loving.**

True discipleship means loving not just when it's easy, but when it's hard; not just those who love us, but even those who oppose us. Love, for a Christian, is not just a feeling—it's a choice to will the good of the other and to act on it. It means forgiving instead of seeking revenge, showing kindness even to those who are unkind, and giving without expecting anything in return.

The world may see this as weakness, but it's not. It's the strength of Christ working in us.

As we reflect on this Gospel, let's ask ourselves:

- Who in my life do I struggle to love?
- How can I show mercy even when it's not deserved?
- In what ways can I be more generous with my time, patience, and forgiveness?

Jesus reminds us: "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." May we take His words to heart and strive to reflect His love in our daily lives.

This week, let's pray for the grace to love as Christ loves—boldly, mercifully, and without limits.

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration of the Week


Jesus' message today is one of radical generosity and abundant mercy, and it scandalized the people of his time. It shook them to their core. It should do the same for us. Are we ready to live as Jesus lived? Are we ready to offer love in the face of hate?



DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED!

The practice of fasting predates Christianity. The Old Testament is full of examples of righteous men and women mortifying their flesh for the purpose of making atonement or simply to grow closer to God. Jesus himself fasted for forty days and forty nights in preparation for the beginning of his public ministry, and we see his disciples following his example in the Acts of the Apostles.

Fasting continues to be an important part of Christian devotional life today. Many people feel the practice of fasting enhances their prayer and helps them fulfill St. Paul's advice to "put to death the deeds of the body" (Romans 8:13) to grow in the Spirit. Most Catholics will associate fasting with the liturgical season of Lent, which begins and ends with obligatory fasting for all members of the Latin Catholic Church between ages 18 and 59.



As one Catholic community of faith, rooted in prayer, let us reflect on how we can support our underserved parishes and schools in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. Did you know that one in every five parishes and one in every four Catholic schools rely on financial assistance to continue their vital ministries? 

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

ASH WEDNESDAY

QUESTION:

Is Ash Wednesday a holy day of obligation?

ANSWER:

Despite the often packed churches, you may be surprised to hear that the answer is no! Holy days of obligation commemorate a particular event (such as the birth of Christ at Christmas) or celebrate particular people (such as Mary's Immaculate Conception or the feast of All Saints). Ash Wednesday is a day of penance, fasting, and abstinence to begin the season of Lent. In a sense, it focuses on a concept rather than something particular and concrete.

Of course, repentance ought to be reflected in particular, concrete ways! That's one of the reasons that attending Mass on Ash Wednesday is a very good idea. It marks the beginning of a solemn season of penance. Despite all its comparisons to the desert, Lent can be very fruitful for our spiritual growth! Beginning this season with the celebration of Mass and the reception of ashes is a sign of our commitment to God and to spiritual growth.

Dear God, help me to love other people the way you love me.

Mission for the Week

When someone hurts your feelings this week, instead of getting even, pray for that person.

Sharing the Gospel

Treat others the way you want to be treated. God doesn't want us to treat other people the same way they treat you. Choose to be kind, even when other people are mean. Choose to forgive, even when someone has hurt you.






