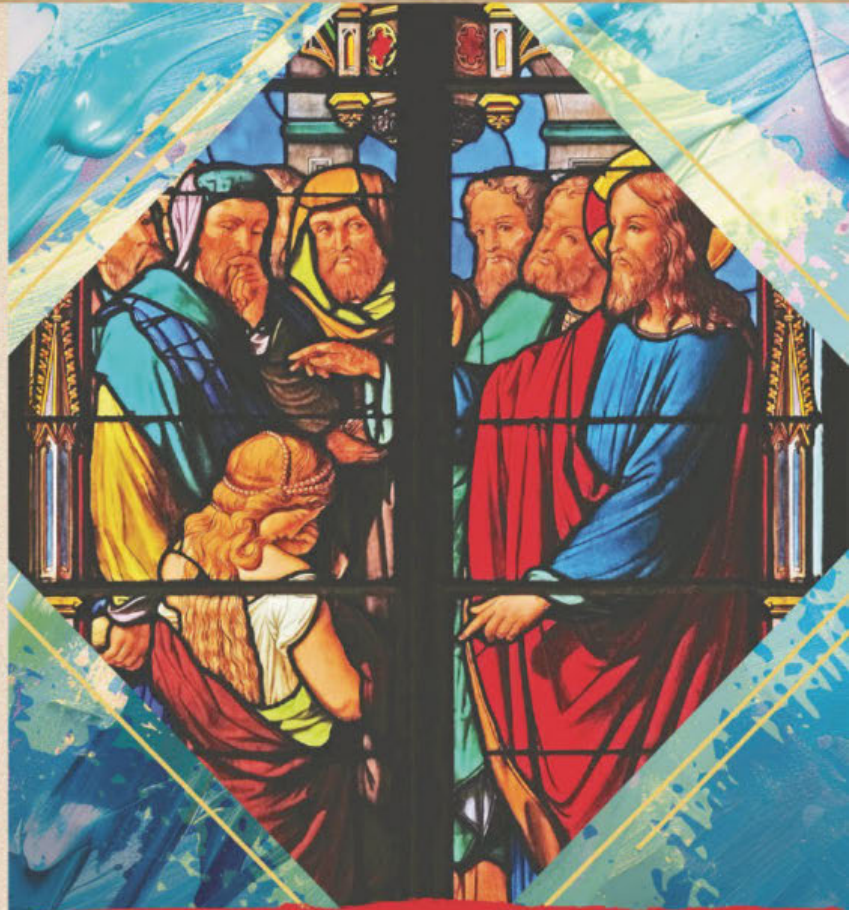

MESSAGE FROM FR. FRANCIS

Dear Parish Family,

Today's Gospel gives us one of the most powerful and tender moments in all of Scripture: Jesus and the woman caught in adultery.

The scribes and Pharisees come ready with stones—ready to judge, to condemn, to trap both the woman and Jesus himself. But Jesus meets their harshness with silence. He bends down and writes on the ground, slowing the moment, drawing their attention inward. And then he speaks words that echo through time:

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone."

One by one, the accusers drift away, leaving Jesus alone with the woman. He asks, *"Has no one condemned you?"* When she says no, Jesus replies,

"Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

Jesus does not excuse sin, but he does refuse to define people by it. He sees her not only as someone who has fallen, but as someone who can rise again.

I'm reminded of a powerful quote from Dietrich Bonhoeffer:

"We must learn to regard others less in the light of what they do or omit to do, and more in the light of what they suffer."

Jesus sees this woman in the light of what she has suffered—and loves her there. Can we do the same?

Lent is our opportunity to lay down the stones we carry: the urge to judge, the impulse to condemn, the shame that weighs us down. In their place, may we take up compassion, mercy, and the healing hope that Jesus offers each of us.

Jesus never condemns. He invites us to begin again.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

PRIESTHOOD

QUESTION:

If someone is interested in becoming a priest, how does he go about it?

ANSWER:

Discerning a vocation can happen in any number of ways. It might come as a surprise to the person called or to family or friends. Sometimes it is a gradual process, and other times it is as quick and bright as lightning. Regardless of how it starts, a vocation to the priesthood or religious life requires a process of discerning, testing, and preparing. The best place to begin would be with lots of prayer, receiving the sacraments, and attending daily Mass whenever possible. Then talk to your pastor or a priest you know and trust. Your diocese may have a vocation director who can provide you with guidance and information. The Serra Club is also a great resource for information and contacts to help you discern if indeed God is calling you.

Remember that many young Catholic men have considered the priesthood. Some are ordained and others realize this is not their calling. However, we are all called to be of service to others as we practice our faith. These are extraordinary times in which we live, and they require an extraordinary witness to faith and to God's presence in the world. Our work, our ministry as Catholics, is to be the body of Christ with and for others. The Church needs priests. If God calls you to ordained service in the church, He will provide the grace, direction, and support you need. Just listen and respond with all your heart, mind, and soul.

5TH SUNDAY OF LENT



Eucharistic Miracle of Blanot, France

On March 31, 1331, a Eucharistic miracle took place on Easter Sunday, in Blanot, France during the distribution of Holy Communion.

One of the last people to receive Holy Communion was a woman named Jacquette. The priest placed the Host on her tongue, and started to walk toward the altar. He didn't see that the Host had fallen and landed upon the cloth that was on the Communion rail. The altar server assisting at the Mass went to the altar and said: *"Father, you must return to the rail because the Body of Our Lord fell from the mouth of this lady onto the cloth."*

The priest approached the woman, still kneeling at the railing. Instead of finding the Host on the cloth, he saw a small spot of Blood. When Mass concluded, the priest took the cloth into the sacristy and placed the stain into a basin filled with clear water. After washing and scrubbing the spot several times, he found that it had become darker and larger.

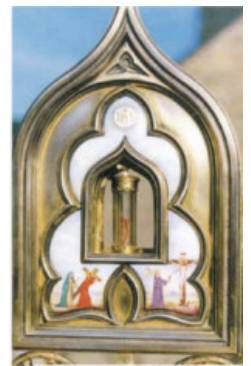
Additionally, the water in the basin turned Bloody. The priest was astonished, and exclaimed, to: *"This is the Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ!"* The priest then took a knife and, after washing it, cut from the cloth the piece bearing the bloody imprint of the Host. This square piece of cloth was reverently placed in the tabernacle.

Every year on the feast of Corpus Christi, the relic is solemnly exposed in the church of Blanot.

****The Hosts that remained in the ciborium after the distribution of Holy Communion on that Easter Sunday were also returned to the tabernacle, never to be distributed. Hundreds of years later they were found to have been perfectly preserved.**

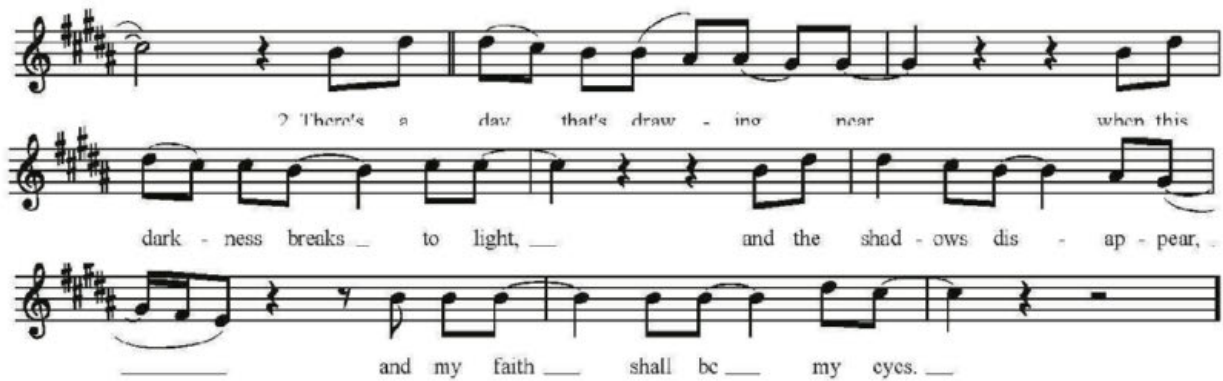

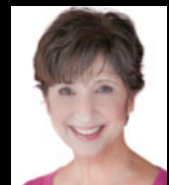
