

Message from Fr. Francis

Dear Parish Family,

In the quiet of the early morning, Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the beloved disciple discovered something remarkable: the stone was rolled away, and the tomb was empty. What they first thought was a sign of loss and confusion soon became the greatest sign of hope. The beloved disciple, seeing the empty tomb, believed.

This moment is at the heart of our faith. The Resurrection is not just about what happened two thousand years ago-it is about what God is doing in our lives right now. Like Mary and the disciples, we often come to the "tombs" of our lives: places of sorrow, fear, or uncertainty. Yet, because Christ is risen, these places are never the end of our story.

The empty tomb reminds us that God is always at work in our lives, even when we do not fully understand. Resurrection means that new life can break forth from the places we thought were lifeless. It means our burdens can be lifted, our wounds can be healed, and our fears can give way to courage. Even when we cannot see the full picture, we are invited to trust, as the disciple did, and believe.

This Easter, let us open our eyes and hearts to the signs of Resurrection around us — in moments of forgiveness, in acts of kindness, in the quiet reassurance that God walks with us every day. The tomb is empty. Christ is alive. And because He lives, we live in faith, hope, and love.

May you and your loved ones have a joyful and hope-filled Easter!

CHRISTIAN MEDITATION

"One of the most difficult things for Westerners to understand is that meditation is not about trying to make anything happen. But all of us are so tied into the mentality of techniques and production that we inevitably first think that we are trying to engineer an event, a happening. According to our imagination or predispositions, we may have different ideas of what would happen. For some it is visions, voices, or flashes of light. For others, deep insights and understanding. For others again, better control over their daily lives and problems. The first thing to understand, however, is that meditation has nothing to do with making anything happen. The basic aim of meditation is indeed quite the contrary, simply to learn to become fully aware of what is. The great challenge of meditation is to learn directly from the reality that sustains us.

The first step toward this—and we are invited to take it—is to come into contact with our own spirit. Perhaps the greatest tragedy of all is that we should complete our life without ever having made full contact with our own spirit. This contact means discovering the harmony of our being, our potential for growth, our wholeness—everything that the New Testament and Jesus himself, called 'fullness of life.'" -Fr. John Main



DISCERNMENT

QUESTION:

How do I discern if a call to do something big is really from God?

ANSWER:

Each day we face plenty of decisions about following God: whether or not to pray, how to treat people, and how to prioritize our time. Sometimes there can be something much more significant we discern: a vocational call, a promotion at work that requires a move, or a new ministry

position at church. In addition to a pro-con list or a cost-benefit analysis, here are a few things to prayerfully consider and to talk over with trusted individuals.

Does it conform to God's will revealed in the Church? God doesn't call us to do something that contradicts the moral law. Will it encourage spiritual growth? Sometimes we need to choose between multiple good options. Consider the personal impact on you and others you are responsible for, like family. Other times we might be invited to do good for others, but when we assess our other life commitments, we see that saying yes to this would actually impede our prior responsibilities in the long run. Does the call seem consistent? This isn't to say that God won't do something new. Even so, consider if the call is consistent with your gifts and abilities. Can you see a "through-line" so to speak, with how your experiences have led you to this point? Do others confirm it? Share your reflections with trusted, insightful confidantes. Have they seen the same things you have, or are they bringing up new points to consider? Humbly add their relevant points to your considerations. Don't forget your gut. After you've carefully considered everything in your mind, don't neglect your instincts. Does your heart say yes or no?






APOSTLES CREED
