Message from Fr. Francis

Dear Parish Family,

In today's first reading, we hear of Paul and Barnabas returning to the Christian communities they helped form and to help them build up their faith. Their journey wasn't easy for they faced hardship, opposition, and danger. Yet they pressed on, not for worldly recognition, but because they had been sent. Christ had commissioned them, and they knew their mission wasn't just about spreading information—it was about building up God's Church.

And here's the truth we sometimes forget: that same commission belongs to us. Through our baptism, every one of us has been sent into the world as Christ's witnesses. We may not travel to distant cities like Paul and Barnabas, but we are called to bring the message and love of God into our homes, neighborhoods, workplaces, and parishes. We are the Church in motion.

This week, as we reflect on their courage and dedication, we might ask ourselves: How can I share the love and message of God in my daily life-in my home, in my work, and in my parish community? Like those first disciples, we are called not only to believe, but to go and make disciples.

CHRISTIAN MEDITATION

"The way of prayer is the way of ever deeper, ever more generous silence. And to learn this silence. to be open to the gift of it, we must learn to say our mantra. Our times of meditation immerse us in this silence, and we emerge from it refreshed, renewed, and rebaptized in the power of the Spirit...All of us must address our own lack of discipline: we must bring our restless, wandering minds to stillness. And it's one of the first great lessons in humility that we must learn, to realize, that we come to wisdom, we come to stillness, we pass beyond distraction, only through the gift of God. His prayer is his gift to us. All we have to do is to dispose ourselves, and we dispose ourselves by becoming silent. Silence is the essential human response to the mystery of God, to the infinity of God. And we learn to be silent by being content to say our mantra in humble fidelity." Fr. John Main, OSB

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

GOOD AND EVIL

QUESTION:

If God is good, why is there evil in the world?

ANSWER:

The problem of evil is perplexing. If God is all-powerful and all-good, why doesn't He stop bad things from happening? He must either not be all-powerful, or perhaps He's not very good after all. Human beings have faced the possibility of evil since the very beginning of our existence. In granting us free will, God gives us the ability to make free choices. God does not force us into moral perfection. We are not forced to love Him or to love our neighbor. We must make the decision ourselves. This means, of course, that we have the ability to choose against love.

One small decision of selfishness, jealously, or pride may not seem so bad. But every decision — good or bad — is like a stone dropped into a still pond. The ripples extend much farther than the original stone. When decisions against love begin to compound, they affect families, neighborhoods, and nations. This is all the more reason for Christians to be faithful to our baptismal call to love one another as Christ has loved us!

HAIL MARY - MAY 18, 2025

The words of the Hail Mary — undoubtedly the most recognizable Catholic prayer after the Lord's Prayer — are deeply rooted in scripture. The opening lines of the prayer are taken from the words of the angel Gabriel at the Annunciation — "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." This line is known as the Angelic Salutation. The following words — "Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus" — echo the sentiments expressed by Elizabeth at the Visitation.

The Angelic Salutation is regarded as the earliest devotional prayer to Mary, since it forms the very first words spoken to her as the Mother of God, but Catholics did

not begin to utilize the Hail Mary prayer in its current form until around the 11th century.

An in-depth explanation of each line of this prayer is provided in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2676-2677.

Fill our hearts, O Lord, with Your love, the deepest, richest, purest love any of us has ever known. May Your love be our standard for love.

May Your love be what we bring and communicate to the world. May Your love define us as Christians, made in Your image and likeness.
