MESSAGE FROM FR. FRANCIS

Dear Parish Family,

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us a simple but powerful truth:

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments."

It's easy to say we love God, but it's more difficult to live it.

Jesus doesn't ask for just warm feelings or nice thoughts-He asks for obedience. That's a word we don't always like. But in Scripture, obedience is not about control-it's about relationship. It's about trust. It's about choosing to live in a way that reflects God's love, even when it's difficult or inconvenient.

So what are His commandments?

Love your neighbor. Forgive those who wrong you. Care for the vulnerable. Speak truth with love. Live with integrity. Practice mercy.

These aren't abstract ideas-they're concrete ways of loving God.

Jesus also promises that we are not left to do this on our own.

"The Advocate, the Holy Spirit... will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

When we try to follow His commandments, the Holy Spirit is there to guide usnudging us to apologize when we've hurt someone, to stand up for someone who's vulnerable, or to act with compassion when it's easier to ignore. That's how God "makes His dwelling" within us-not just as a nice idea, but as a real and active presence in our thoughts, words and actions.

In a world full of noise, division, and distractions, the command to keep His word is more relevant than ever. Jesus doesn't just want to be believed in–He wants to be followed. He wants to dwell within us. And He gives us His very Self/Spirit so we can do just that.

Love is not proven in words alone, but in the lives we live.

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments." May we love Him well.

Eucharistic Miracle of Glotowo, Poland - 1290

In 1290, a priest from the village of Glotowo, Poland buried a gold Ciborium containing a consecrated Host to protect it from the invasion of Lithuania. Lithuanian's troops destroyed the village and the church. None of the survivors knew about the hidden Host.

Several years later, a farmer was walking behind his oxen late in the day as they were pulling the plow in a field. Suddenly the plow got stuck and the oxen pulled up a large clump of earth. The oxen stopped, frozen. As the farmer attempted to scold the beasts, he noticed a sudden change around him.


The light on the field was as if it were noon and a very intense light was coming from the ground shining on the kneeling oxen. The farmer began to dig and noticed that the bright light was coming from a little ciborium covered with dirt. It contained a perfect Host as white as snow!

The news spread rapidly among the people, who rushed immediately to the site. A procession was organized to carry the Host to the Church in Dobre Miasto. According to ancient records, the Host was inexplicably found once again at the place where it had been discovered the first time.

The occurrence was interpreted as a sign from God and a small church of Corpus Christi was built in honor of the Blessed Sacrament on the site of the Miracle. Even today, the shrine in the village of Glotowo, attracts numerous pilgrims each year who gather to venerate the Relic of the Host, which has remained intact since 1290.







WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

WHY USE INCENSE?

QUESTION:

Why do we use incense at Mass?

ANSWER:


The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).

DEVOTIONS *EXPLAINED!* - Connect with Tradition and Grow Your Faith



Anyone who has ever dined in a Catholic home has probably heard the prayer before meals that begins with the famous words: "Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts." These words in particular are first found in the Galesian Sacramentary, a book of Christian liturgy that dates to the seventh or eighth century, but the practice of praying before meals is Biblical, harkening back to the Jewish ritual washing of hands before eating. In the Gospels, Jesus is shown praying before the Last Supper and other meals, setting an example followed by Paul in Acts 27:35.

In his 2015 encyclical Laudato SI', Pope Francis urged the faithful "to return to this beautiful and meaningful custom."

"That moment of blessing," he wrote, "reminds us of our dependence on God for life; it strengthens our feeling of gratitude for the gifts of creation...(and) reaffirms our solidarity with those in greatest need."




