

# OUR PATRON. SAINT BARNABAS

Barnabas sacrificed himself to be instrumental in God's cultivation of His Church. Paul makes specific mention of the fact that Barnabas, who willingly impoverished himself in the interests of the Church, labored with his own hands to support himself on his missionary journeys. In Acts 4:36, Luke translates Barnabas to mean "son of encouragement" or "son of consolation." The original Greek word rendered "encouragement," *paraklesis*, means encouragement, consolation, comfort, exhortation and entreaty. It may be that the Apostles who gave Joseph the name Barnabas, saw all of these qualities in his character.

# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

It's not uncommon to hear people complain that we Catholics often fail in communicating our faith. Fair enough. We can and should improve there. But it's interesting to notice that Jesus himself was implicitly accused by his disciples of a similar failure. This week in Matthew's gospel they are perplexed that he speaks to the crowds in ambiguous parables. The Lord's riddles leave many people more confused than before. He responds by pointing out that his parables have an intentional dual purpose: to hide (for some) and to reveal (for others) his Gospel: "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted" (Matthew 13:11). Is Jesus being unnecessarily difficult, obscurantist, or, worse, elitist?

No. We have to remember that all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge lie hidden in him (c.f., Col. 2:3). He is the word of God from heaven to be planted in the earth of our humanity to bear great fruit. However, like a lover delicately pursuing his beloved, we're dealing with a relationship, not new data. When we aren't willing to personally accept Jesus into our lives, the "info" of the Gospel will simply not make sense to us. It'll seem bizarre, esoteric, or like incoherent religious-speak. But when we are willing to accept Jesus into our lives, everything else starts to make sense. When others don't understand the Church or the Lord, let's be patient. Love is patient. Sometimes it has to hide before it is revealed.





# TOGETHER FOR LIFE HOW THE LOVE OF HUSBAND AND WIFE IS FED BY THE EUCHARIST

St. John Paul II firmly believed that love within marriage is strengthened by the Eucharist.

After the "lovey-dovey" feelings go away in marriage, love between spouses changes into something deeper, but for many it can be a difficult time to get through. It can be tempting to turn elsewhere for love.

However, it is precisely during those rough patches in marriage that a couple needs to feed their love with the Eucharist.

St. John Paul II, in his apostolic exhortation *Familiaris Consortio*, explains how the love between husband and wife needs to be nourished by the Eucharist.

The Eucharist is the very source of Christian marriage. The Eucharistic Sacrifice, in fact, represents Christ's covenant of love with the Church, sealed with His blood on the Cross. In this sacrifice of the New and Eternal Covenant, Christian spouses encounter the source from which their own marriage covenant flows, is interiorly structured and continuously renewed.

If Jesus is the source of all love, then why shouldn't we go to him to renew our love in marriage?

We don't always associate marital love with the love that Jesus exemplified, but St. Paul fully understood this connection as well, and wrote about it in his Letter to the Ephesians. His words remind us to love each other as Christ loves us and shows that love most fully in the Eucharist.

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her (Ephesians 5:25).

# MISSION APPEAL 2023

SATURDAY, JULY 22 & SUNDAY, JULY 23
Sacred Heart Sisters of Navjyothi Province, Idukki, Kerala, is fairly new Province of the Sacred Heart order. It is only 20 years old. There are 195 professed sisters in this province. The major activities of the Province are schools, parish activities, medical and counseling. One of the specializations is to treat and work with mentally and psychologically ill and challenged people.

The Sacred Heart religious order is a local missionary religious group begun by Venerable Father Mathew Kadalikkattil some 112 years ago in the South Indian State of Kerala, India. There are about 2300 sisters working in 11 provinces mainly in Kerala and in a few other States of Îndia, Germany and Africa.

The sisters organize a few special programs for the children. One among them is called Navjyothi (New Light) Education and Balbhavan (House of Children) program. The program creates opportunities for children from mentally, psychologically and financially backward families to have complete guided education and needed formation. Their psychological, physical and spiritual and material needs are fully looked after by this program creating an atmosphere where they can grow into responsible, mature individuals.

Navjyothi Education is the first part of this program. As part of this program sisters visit families regularly and deserving children are brought to the facility. They are provided study materials like school bags, textbooks, uniform and other needed accessories. They are given special coaching, tuition and midday meal. Value education programs, therapy and counseling are organized for parents. These families are often reached out through the referrals of the Pastor, teachers or sometimes parishioners.

The second part of the program called Balbhavan program. It is meant for children from completely broken families due to alcohol, drug addiction, abusive, mental and psychologically ill and sometimes separated parents. These children go through a lot of physical and psychological trauma. Children from these families are given boarding facility run by the sisters. They are provided schooling often at the Parish or the Diocese run schools. They are given all the necessities for the schooling like textbooks, school bags, uniform and other needed items. The weak are given special assistance with tuition and coaching during the afterhours. Special help is given to those that need psychological treatment. A psychologist is made available three days a week. Special camps are organized occasionally for skill development and orientation.

Another program run by the sisters is to Care for the HIV Positive and Cerebral Palsy Children. The HIV positive children carry a taboo on them. They are not easily accepted in the society and in most of the schools. This program gives them opportunity to be normal and be like normal children. Besides school materials they are also given very psychological and personality development programs. They are taught about the risk of transmitting this decease and the way to live a normal life. The children are provided with boarding facility.

The sisters provide 24/7 care for 15 children suffering from

cerebral palsy. These children are not able to live in their own family neither are the families able to give them proper medical and hygienic care. There are four sisters attending to this ministry.

The number of beneficiaries for these programs are: Navjyothi Education and Balbhavan Program— 180 children in four facilities/centers HIV Students–35 at one center Cerebral Palsy– 15 at one center

I request everyone to remember the sisters in their mission and ministry especially with these children. Every help that

you can make will assist us in taking care and providing for these unfortunate ones. Be assured of their prayers for you.

### Soil Conditions

I am a hopeless gardener. I never met a plant I couldn't swiftly kill with good intentions and poor understanding of soil conditions.

Because really, it's all about the soil conditions—at least, that's what Google tells me when I helplessly search phrases like "Why aren't any of my seeds sprouting? Please, I tried so hard." I can never seem to match the right type of soil offering the right type of drainage and texture with the right plant. I can't understand why it's not enough to bury the seed in whatever ground is available, sprinkle some water and ask it, very nicely, to grow.

This is also a quality that makes me a poor evangelist to people who do not share my beliefs. How many times have I encountered a friend or loved one who left the faith, and I tried to coax them back by hurling Catechism passages in their direction, offering advice they never asked for and are ill-equipped to understand? I sow these seeds of witness and bang my fists in frustration that they rot where I plant them, never realizing that it's all about the soil.

It is Christ, and Christ alone, who works within the heart. It is Christ who is the sower of the seed, not me. When I leave him out of the equation, when I fail to offer the Person and instead only offer the teaching, I can anticipate that any witness I have to offer will rot where it is planted just as sure as a tulip bulb in a bed of clay.

# Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

### Question:

Why do we use incense at Mass?

#### Answer:

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).


