In Acts 4:36, Luke translates Barnabas to mean "son of encouragement" or "son of consolation." The original Greek word rendered "encouragement," *paraklesis*, means encouragement, consolation, comfort, exhortation and entreaty. It may be that the Apostles who gave Joseph the name Barnabas, saw all of these qualities in his character.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.



•MISSION APPEAL 2023

Sacred Heart Sisters of Navjyothi Province, Idukki, Kerala, is fairly new Province of the Sacred Heart order. It is only 20 years old. There are 195 professed sisters in this province. The major activities of the Province are schools, parish activities, medical and counseling. One of the specializations is to treat and work with mentally and psychologically ill and challenged people.

The Sacred Heart religious order is a local missionary religious group begun by Venerable Father Mathew Kadalikkattil some 112 years ago in the South Indian State of Kerala, India. There are about 2300 sisters working in 11 provinces mainly in Kerala and in a few other States of India, Germany and Africa.

The sisters organize a few special programs for the children. One among them is called Navjyothi (New Light) Education and Balbhavan (House of Children) program. The program creates opportunities for children from mentally, psychologically and financially backward families to have complete guided education and needed formation. Their psychological, physical and spiritual and material needs are fully looked after by this program creating an atmosphere where they can grow into responsible, mature individuals.

Navjyothi Education is the first part of this program. As part of this program sisters visit families regularly and deserving children are brought to the facility. They are provided study materials like school bags, textbooks, uniform and other needed accessories. They are given special coaching, tuition and midday meal. Value education programs, therapy and counseling are organized for parents. These families are often reached out through the referrals of the Pastor, teachers or sometimes parishioners.

The second part of the program called Balbhavan program. It is meant for children from completely broken families due to alcohol, drug addiction, abusive, mental and psychologically ill and sometimes separated parents. These children go through a lot of physical and psychological trauma. Children from these families are given boarding facility run by the sisters. They are provided schooling often at the Parish or the Diocese run schools. They are given all the necessities for the schooling like textbooks, school bags, uniform and other needed items. The weak are given special assistance with tuition and coaching during the afterhours. Special help is given to those that need psychological treatment. A psychologist is made available three days a week. Special camps are organized occasionally for skill development and orientation.

Another program run by the sisters is to Care for the HIV Positive and Cerebral Palsy Children. The HIV positive children carry a taboo on them. They are not easily accepted in the society and in most of the schools. This program gives them opportunity to be normal and be like normal children. Besides school materials they are also given very careful psychological and personality development programs. They are taught about the risk of transmitting this decease and the way to live a normal life. The children are provided with boarding facility.

The sisters provide 24/7 care for 15 children suffering from cerebral palsy. These children are not able to live in their own family neither are the families able to give them proper medical and hygienic care. There are four sisters attending to this ministry.

The number of beneficiaries for these programs are:

Navjyothi Education and Balbhavan Program- 180 children in four facilities/centers

HIV Students-35 at one center Cerebral Palsy- 15 at one center

I request everyone to remember the sisters in their mission and ministry especially with these children. Every help that you can make will assist us in taking care and providing for these unfortunate ones. Be assured of their prayers for you.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do priests kiss the altar at the start of Mass?

Answer:

Our churches and chapels are filled with symbols. We might think of the more common symbols (like the crucifix, statues, stained-glass windows, vestment color and altar cloths) as well as major symbols (such as the paschal candle and the baptismal font). But there are some things that we can take for granted in our sacred spaces, because unfortunately, they seem to just be part of the building, including three of the main symbols of our liturgy: the ambo (lectern), the chair for the priest celebrant, and the altar.

These three objects are placed in a specially designated area called the sanctuary. They are the places where the Word of God is proclaimed, where the priest prays and presides at the celebration, and where the bread and wine are offered by the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer. Although each of these objects is sacred because of the role they play in our worship, the altar holds a special place. In a document containing the rules and instructions for the Mass — the "General Instruction of the Roman Missal" — we read: "The altar on which the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God is called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished throughout the Eucharist" (no. 296).

One of the ways that we recognize the importance of the altar is when the priest and deacon kiss the altar at the beginning of Mass. Kissing is an ancient act of devotion. Remember, we also kiss the cross on Good Friday, and the deacon or priest kisses the "Book of the Gospels" after the Gospel is proclaimed. This act of devotion reminds us that the altar is a symbol of Jesus, the "living stone" (see 1 Peter 2:4), the foundation stone of our faith. It is a symbol gesture, but it is a powerful reminder of the One on whom our faith is built and in whose name we gather as the "household of faith" (see Galatians 6:10).
