#### **OUR PATRON, SAINT BARNABAS**

Barnabas sacrificed himself to be instrumental in God's cultivation of His Church. Paul makes specific mention of the fact that Barnabas, who willingly impoverished himself in the interests of the Church, labored with his own hands to support himself on his missionary journeys. In Acts 4:36, Luke translates Barnabas to mean "son of encouragement" or "son of consolation." The original Greek word rendered "encouragement," *paraklesis*, means encouragement, consolation, comfort, exhortation and entreaty. It may be that the Apostles who gave Joseph the name Barnabas, saw all of these qualities in his character.



# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A life-long Catholic friend of mine recently mumbled to me, "I can't stand all these converts to the faith. They're always rocking the boat." It surprised me because he is dedicated to evangelization, and yet he struggles with openness to new Catholics. It made me realize how easily I close my heart to those whom I perceive to be outsiders who become new members of the Catholic community. Almost unconsciously I reduce the world to the categories of "us" and "them." The result is that meaningful community silently shrinks in my life. Don't we all do that to some degree?

This week Jesus' punchy parable about the two sons blows up that black and white world. One son said he wouldn't get to work, and then did. The other said he would, and then he did not. "Which did the will of his father?" asks the Lord. Like so many of us, in identifying the first as the answer, the religious authorities manifest hidden hypocrisy in refusing to follow Jesus. They — like us — intuit the correct path but simply won't do it. The tax collectors and prostitutes are indeed following Jesus and thereby getting to work in the kingdom of God. Everyone is called to do God's will regardless of the labels we may apply to them.

This week let's reject the convenient but damaging categories of "insiders" and "outsiders." Instead, let's embrace a grateful attitude that Jesus is calling fallen, weak, and broken men and women like you and me. Then we begin to see that the tax collectors and prostitutes aren't *them*. They are us. And Jesus wants all of *us* working in his boat, no matter the rocking.

## Jesus and the Eucharist Study

Every parish across the country is invited to host the Jesus and the Eucharist study during the Year of Parish Revival. This seven-session series will immerse participants in the kerygmatic proclamation (Sessions 1–4) and unveil God's saving work in the Eucharist (Sessions 5–7).

Each session opens with an exhortation from a different bishop, followed by lectio divina prayer with scripture. The main lesson is drawn from content created by the Augustine Institute and will include personal testimonies from Catholics across the country. We will then transition into small group discussions. Each session will be 2 hours or less.

#### BELOW IS AN OVERVIEW OF EACH SESSION

#### Session 1: What's Our Story? 9/28

The Bible is the story of God's love for us. He created us out of love, redeemed us by his love, and transforms us in his love.

#### Session 2: Who Is Jesus? 10/5

Jesus is both God and man, therefore he reveals who God is in relation to us. Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15) He asks this same question of us: who do you say Jesus is?

#### Session 3: Am I Saved? 10/12

Salvation is a gift from God through Jesus Christ that requires our "yes."

#### Session 4: Why a Church? 10/19

Jesus didn't simply leave us a written message or instruction manual to follow. He gave us a living, dynamic Church where we encounter him personally and allow ourselves to be transformed into his likeness.

#### Session 5: God Is With Us 10/26

God's presence in the Old Testament foreshadows the gift of the Eucharist, one of the seven sacraments of the Church. Jesus established the Eucharist to give us strength and accompany us at every moment of our earthly journey.

#### Session 6: The Story of the Eucharist 11/9

The story of the Eucharist can be traced throughout Scripture. From Genesis to the present day, this session explores how the Cross is the new Tree of Life, and the Eucharist is its fruit.

#### Session 7: Bread for the Journey 11/16

The Eucharist sustains us on our spiritual journey. Our participation at Mass through the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist is an offering of thanksgiving to God. We are then sent forth to share what we have received.

#### ST. BARNABAS CATHOLIC CHURCH FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Blessings of peace to you! I pray that you and your families are nourished and strengthened by the Holy Eucharist. We are pleased to present the financial position of our Parish for the fiscal year 2022-2023, which covers the period from July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023. It appears that the economic impact from the aftermath of Coronavirus pandemic has again posed another challenging year for our Parish financial operations.

The Statement of Activities reflects a **Net Loss of \$221,629**, which is a worsening over last year. We have taken a step backwards. For the third consecutive year, we have endured a net loss.

In spite of the decrease in offertory collections, we were still able to cover all of the Parish operating expenses, including our Archdiocesan Assessment of \$58,158, without asking for monetary support from the Archdiocese. This was made possible due to your generous support, kind sponsors, and anonymous donors. More of you have initiated donating online through Faith Direct. We encourage others to explore this e-giving option as well.

We spent \$73,292 on critical building maintenance and repairs which could not be deferred. The increase in expenses restricted us from making further repairs and embarking on further capital improvement projects. Due to years of neglect, we still have many church-improvement projects and other repairs to complete. We hope to begin these once we receive our Called to Renew funds from the Capital Campaign which begun in 2022. We appreciate your commitment in sending your pledges to Call to Renew Capital Campaign. This would help our Parish in a big way.

Our financial operation has been impacted by an increase in insurance, utilities, and property taxes by \$33,571. The Church and Parish Office had increased expenses as we returned to a normal operation after the Covid-19.

The Balance Sheet presents our cash position; it reflects an operating cash balance of \$163,352 and investment funds of \$215,015. Our cash balance was reduced by \$311,304, in order to meet all of our expenses.

The unfunded Accumulated Archdiocesan Assessment from previous years, has a balance of \$275,751 as of June 30, 2023 and is reflected in the Balance sheet as a Long-Term Liability and an off-set to Equity. We again did not receive an annual credit from the Archdiocese, as in previous years. Also, we did not make much progress in reducing the liability this past year, as the Archdiocese suspended the payments for several months. We are hopeful that the Archdiocese will consider giving us this credit for the last three years, which would reduce or eliminate our debt.

The accumulated debt reflects multiple years of payments owed to the Archdiocese to pay for Parish insurance, Parish pensions, and Archdiocesan Assessments, which were previously unpaid until 2014, prior to my appointment as the Administrator and Pastor to St. Barnabas Parish. We continue to be diligent in our spending, while stabilizing our finances, and working to retire this outstanding debt.

Please know that I appreciate very much for all the sacrifices you make for supporting our Parish. May God reward you with His choicest blessings for your happiness and good health. I am confident that our Lord will bless our common efforts to strengthen the spiritual and financial wellbeing of our Parish. Together with the Finance and Pastoral Council, I am deeply grateful for your love, kindness, and generosity towards our Parish.


