

#### **OUR PATRON, SAINT BARNABAS**

Barnabas sacrificed himself to be instrumental in God's cultivation of His Church. Paul makes specific mention of the fact that Barnabas, who willingly impoverished himself in the interests of the Church, labored with his own hands to support himself on his missionary journeys. In Acts 4:36, Luke translates Barnabas to mean "son of encouragement" or "son of consolation." The original Greek word rendered "encouragement," *paraklesis*, means encouragement, consolation, comfort, exhortation and entreaty. It may be that the Apostles who gave Joseph the name Barnabas, saw all of these qualities in his character.



### Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We start telling lies around the age of three, the experts tell us. It's understandable. Lying is a god-like power. Whatever I want, I need only say it, and the world rearranges itself accordingly. It's amazing at first. But soon reality snaps back and I'm faced with a dilemma. If I remain committed to my lie I start to fracture into pieces. My words and reality drift apart, and I find myself lost in a lonely world of further falsehoods and fear of being found out.

How marvelous, then, that Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming: "Repent!" We tend to think it means "stop doing bad things" but it doesn't. It literally means "go beyond the mind you have." Think in a new way. It's painful to admit, but some portion of my mind is addicted to lie-telling, usually to protect my ego or make life easier. To repent means to admit this tendency, to say, "I'm done lying," and to move beyond my split mind into a complete commitment to the truth. Perhaps that's why at Mass we together proclaim, "I have sinned in my thoughts, and in my words..." Repentance and truth-telling work together.

Those who know the twelve-step process of addiction recovery know this process well. The fourth step requires radical truth-telling: listing our moral defects. This isn't being scrupulous. Rather it is freedom from falsehood, and entrance into the real world. This week, I invite you to join me in this practice. Get your phone or piece of paper. Answer the question: what are your true moral defects? Write them down. Remember, the Lord knows them already and loves you. We have a sacrament where this truth-telling is celebrated: Confession. Perhaps it is finally time to go beyond our childish lies.



#### A Good Time for Fulfillment

There are some things that always come at the worst time. I've never gotten a telemarketing call and thought, "This is a really convenient moment for me to listen to a sales pitch." I've never seen the compulsory software update notice flash on my computer screen when I didn't have a deadline I was struggling to meet. My kids never come down with the flu unless it's the weekend and the line at Urgent Care is stretching out the door.

And I never, ever feel the calm, persistent shouldertap of the Holy Spirit without thinking, "Now? Now is not a good time. Can you try again when I'm..."

But then I stop and think: when I am what? When I am stronger? When I am happier? When I am smarter? When I am a different person?

When God calls us, He calls the person He sees in front of Him. "Come on," He says, and He doesn't mean "When you're finished" or "When it's convenient" or "Think about it." He means now. This moment.

This is what Paul is saying when he writes that "the world in its present form is passing away." He is saying that your plans mean nothing, the kingdom of God is at hand. Abandon your nets, let your catch escape into the sea. You're not who you thought you were, and you don't need what you thought you needed.

Your sins do not define you. Your fears are not fate. Your inclinations do not govern you. Your life can be changed. We live in the time of fulfillment, and fulfillment is coming for you — ready or not.

### Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

Can a person (the mother, father, or provider) ever be forgiven for an abortion?

#### Answer:

For people of faith, any conversation of human sinfulness should always lead us to reflect on God's loving mercy. Because God's mercy is greater than any sin, the Church is clear that even those involved in the sin of abortion can be reconciled with God and the Church. To help make this grace more available through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Pope Francis extended the permission to absolve someone of the sin of abortion to all priests in 2016.

Even with the grace and blessings of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the tragedy of abortion and the aftermath of abortion takes a toll on everyone involved. Ministries of outreach and support, such as Project Rachel, offer pastoral counseling, support groups, retreats, and other forms of care. As Christians, we are also called to help promote this healing and reconciliation in all its forms.

ITINERARY:

DAY 1: DEPART U.S.A.

Departure for Athens, Greece with an overnight flight.

DAY 2: ATHENS

Welcome to Greece. You are greeted by your tour guide and transferred to the hotel. Dinner and overnight in Athens.

DAY 3: ATHENS- CORINTH

After breakfast join on a city tour including the Agora where Paul preached. On Mars Hill, Paul was brought before the council and delivered his great sermon. You will visit the ancient town of Acropolis to see the Parthenon, the theater of Dionyssos, the Temple of the Wingless Victory and other sights, which reflect the golden age of Greece.

Afternoon, drive to Ancient Corinth following closely the same route Paul took during his journey. Here you visit the marketplace where Paul preached to the Corinthians, visit the Temple of Apollo and the Corinth Museum. Dinner and overnight in Athens

DAY 4: ATHENS - MYKONOS

After breakfast you will be transferred to Piraeus, where you will board your cruise ship. The first stop is picture perfect Mykonos Island, with its white houses, chapels and windmills. DAY 5: RHODES

Today the ship docks in Rhodes, the island Paul visited during his third journey as he sailed toward Jerusalem. Tour the medieval city where the Crusaders gathered before sailing to the Holy Land, and the Knights of St. John built the magnificent town. Take an optional tour to the majestic Acropolis of Lindos and tile old town built by the Crusaders.

DAY 6: PATMOS - KUSADASI - EPHESUS

Our first stop is the sacred island of Patmos, where John received the mystical Revelation, which forms the last book of the New Testament. The optional excursion takes you to the Grotto of Revelation. And the 11-century Monastery of St. John (which houses the original script of the Gospel). In the afternoon the ship arrives in the colorful Turkish port of Kusadasi, where you disembark. We will have a Mass at

Virgin Mary's House in Ephesus. The Apostle John accompanied Mary to Ephesus. Dinner and overnight in Kusadasi. DAY 7: KUSADASI- ST. JOHN BASILICA - KUSADASI

After breakfast, we will visit the most complete magnificent ancient city ever excavated. Tour the antique city, Ephesus, with its theatre, library, and the Temple of Artemis, declared as one of the Seven Wonders of the ancient world. Then, we will visit the Basilica of St. John and visit his tomb. We will also speak about Philadelphia, Sardis and Thyatira. Dinner and overnight in Kusadasi.

DAY 8: KUSADASI - LAODICEA - HIERAPOLIS - PAMUKKALE

After breakfast, proceed to the spa city of Pamukkale; see the cascading water from the cliffs forming crystallized, dazzling white "frozen waterfalls ". Visit Laodicea, one of the Seven Churches. Christians were chastised here by John for being lukewarm. The next visit is to the vast ruins of the Roman health spa of Hierapolis, and to see the magnificently preserved Necropolis, the Main Street and Gates. Dinner and overnight in Pamukkale.

DAY 9: PAMUKKALE - CAPPADOCIA

Today we will have a long trip to Cappadocia via Konya (Iconium). Dinner and overnight in Cappadocia.

Full day sightseeing of the villages of Uchisar with panoramic views of the Cappadocian valleys, Zelve-the valley of the fairy chimneys and the Goreme Valley. There are several hundred churches in this area, some of which are decorated with inscribed frescoes depicting scenes from the Bible. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.



DAY 11: CAPPADOCIA-TARSUS-ADANA

After breakfast, drive to Tarsus, where St. Paul was born, pay a meaningful visit to St. Paul's well, believed to have healing properties. After a short visit to the gate of Cleopatra, continue to Adana for dinner and overnight.

DAY 12: ADANA-ANTIOCH-ADANA

After breakfast, we will drive to Antakya (Antioch) where the people of The Way were first named Christians, it will make you feel home, in the heart of holiness as Antakya served as the home base for St. Paul's missionary journeys. Peter was the first to establish a church in Antioch (Acts 9:32 and Galatians 2:1 1.) Visit the cave church where St. Peter first celebrated mass. Enjoy the Hatay Museum, which is the home for the richest, most varied collection of Greek and Roman mosaics. Then, drive to Adana for

dinner and overnight.

DAY 13: ADANA-ISTANBUL

After breakfast, take a short flight to Istanbul and join the city tour of magnificent Istanbul, the city that links two continents, Asia, and Europe. Visit Hagia Sophia, the magnificent former Christian Basilica, the Blue Mosque, and the Grand Bazaar, with over 4000 little shops. Dinner and overnight in Istanbul.


DAY 14: RETURN TO THE U.S.A. HOME SWEET HOME






