OUR PATRON, SAINT BARNABAS

Barnabas sacrificed himself to be instrumental in God's cultivation of His Church. Paul makes specific mention of the fact that Barnabas, who willingly impoverished himself in the interests of the Church, labored with his own hands to support himself on his missionary journeys. In Acts 4:36, Luke translates Barnabas to mean "son of encouragement" or "son of consolation." The original Greek word rendered "encouragement," *paraklesis*, means encouragement, consolation, comfort, exhortation and entreaty. It may be that the Apostles who gave Joseph the name Barnabas, saw all of these qualities in his character.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

The famous Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoyevsky said, "Love in action is a harsh and dreadful thing." In the Gospel reading this week, Jesus does something harsh and dreadful — he watches his own disciples abandon him. What could possibly be loving about that?

Well, we notice the context is Jesus' teaching about eating and drinking his body and blood. His followers hear this and say, "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" (John 6:60). We shouldn't imagine we'd do anything different, because not even the ones who stay, like Peter, seem to understand what Jesus is saying. Then we hear this devastating line, "Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him" (John 6:66). Besides the night of the Last Supper, only now do Jesus' disciples abandon him. And, painfully, Jesus just lets them go.

The best way to make sense out of this is love. Jesus is God's love in action. He wants to become one with those whom He loves. He wants to love them as His own body. Yes, the oneness manifested in the Eucharist sounds harsh and dreadful because it is rooted in love which is willing to risk abandonment and separation to attain its goal: to be one body with the beloved. It is both terrifying and wonderful that Jesus will risk losing us in order to be one with us. Our response? Lord, we cannot grasp a love so great, but please help us never to abandon it, either.

Walk & ***** with One



As soon as the Lord lays someone on your heart, begin to pray for them! Ask God to remove whatever obstacles are making it difficult for this person to draw closer to Christ and his Church. Pray for the grace to be able to accompany them well.

Eucharistic Examen



This Eucharistic Examen is designed to be used as part of your "Walk with One" journey (see www.eucharisticrevival.org/walk-with-one for more info). Throughout each stage of the journey, pray this examen to help you discern the path the Lord is calling you to follow in accompanying another person towards Jesus.

Take

Opening Prayer: Ask God to help you be aware of his presence, to truly encounter him, and to open your heart to the person whom Jesus is bringing to mind.

Choose a Scripture passage in which Jesus calls a person by name, and sit with it. For example:

 • Mt 4:18-22
 • Mk 2:13-17
 • Lk 13:10-17
 • Jn 15:1-17

 • Mt 9:9-13
 • Lk 5:1-11
 • Lk 19:1-10
 • Jn 20:11-18

 • Mt 14:22-33

 • Lk 10:38-42
 • Jn 11:1-44 (esp. 43)

Rless

Reflect on some aspect of the Paschal Mystery: Jesus' Passion and Death, Resurrection, or Ascension.

Ask Jesus to shower his love upon the person for whom you are interceding, and pray for the courage to accompany the person in a spirit of self-giving and openness.

Break

Considering your daily and weekly routines, ask the Lord to show you how to break out of your comfort zone to make space to connect with the person for whom you have been interceding.

Invite the Holy Spirit to identify the next best concrete step, and pray in thanksgiving for the opportunity to build a new friendship.

Give

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you practice the art of listening and discern a concrete invitation you can give to your friend to draw closer to Jesus. Make a resolution about how and when you will extend this invitation.

Closing Prayer: Ask Jesus to help you keep your resolution as you journey on mission with him, making a gift of yourself for the life of the world.





Bulletin Insert - Who's Keeping Score?



The motto of the Marine Corps is Semper Fidelis - always faithful. Marines never leave anyone behind, to the point of laying down their lives for each other. They serve with a willingness to sacrifice all without counting the cost. Similarly, in marriage, each spouse is called to sacrifice by voluntarily putting the needs of the other above their own. St. Paul calls this "mutual subordination" to one another. Love doesn't hold anything back, present or future.

Even though this can be difficult to live out, when one spouse has difficulties, the other picks up the slack out of love. Couples are called to sacrificial love like Jesus because love doesn't keep score. The couple sacrifices for their marriage because they are better together and joined by mutual respect and trust. In this way, the couple embodies the love of Christ and his Church and becomes an image of God's love on earth.

Marriage is a partnership. Two are united as one, creating a sense of "us-ness" that is greater than either person. Rather than a 50/50 split of child-raising, housework, and finances, it's a 100/100 split of each giving their all for each other and the family. So when money is tight, nights are long, or schedules are stressful, don't keep score. Instead, let Jesus on the cross show you how to love without counting the cost.

"Christ dwells with them, gives them the strength to take up their crosses and so follow him, to rise again after they have fallen, to forgive one another, to bear one another's burdens, to 'be subject to one another out of reverence for Christ,' and to love one another with supernatural, tender, and fruitful love." – Catechism of the Catholic Church #1642







St. Lorenzo Ruiz was born in 1596 to a Filipino mother and Chinese father. Raised in Manila, Lorenzo served his parish, had a strong devotion to the rosary, and wound up marrying a woman named Rosario! The happy couple lived a peaceful, prayerful life with their two sons and one daughter. The daily lessons and prayer life they practiced as a family strengthened them for the crosses ahead.

In 1636, Lorenzo was falsely accused of killing a Spaniard and was forced to flee to Japan. Shortly after arriving in Nagasaki, Lorenzo and the priests he was with were arrested by the shogunate, brutally tortured for their faith, and martyred. Although he was tempted to renounce his faith, Lorenzo's last words were "Had I one thousand lives, all of these I would give to God."

Lorenzo and Rosario faced many terrible challenges that couples experience even to this day: racism, separation, loss of a spouse, forced migration, persecution for the faith. They can be great intercessors for couples and families to persevere in times of hardship.

Reflection questions for couples:

- How do we pray as a couple, or as a family? How can we strengthen our prayer life to imitate the Ruiz's?


