

OUR PATRON, SAINT BARNABAS

Barnabas sacrificed himself to be instrumental in God's cultivation of His Church. Paul makes specific mention of the fact that Barnabas, who willingly impoverished himself in the interests of the Church, labored with his own hands to support himself on his missionary journeys. In Acts 4:36, Luke translates Barnabas to mean "son of encouragement" or "son of consolation." The original Greek word rendered "encouragement," *paraklesis*, means encouragement, consolation, comfort, exhortation and entreaty. It may be that the Apostles who gave Joseph the name Barnabas, saw all of these qualities in his character.





Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

St. Thomas Aquinas said that friends share three things: time, possessions and secrets. For example, how do I know if you're my friend? Well, let's say we've been to Mexico together, you've tried my shaky attempts at pasta carbonara, and you know what ridiculous costume I wore in a music video I filmed in my early twenties. We, dear reader, are definitely friends. We've shared time, possessions and secrets.


How does friendship with Jesus develop? The same way. Jesus lives and eats with his disciples. Then he takes Peter, James and John to Mount Tabor and there reveals to them his deepest secret: his glorious, divine Sonship. The majesty of God shines from within his humanity in a way that goes beyond description. God the Father confirms this "secret," saying, "This is my chosen Son, listen to him" (Luke 9:35). It's all so precious that "they fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone." Do we take time to be alone with Christ, to allow him to mystically share this "secret" with us as his dear friends?

Lenten challenge: This week, identify one time when you experienced an awareness of some specific aspect of Jesus — perhaps on a retreat, at Mass, in prayer or in an act of service. Spend ten minutes consciously re-living that experience in your heart. If you can't recall one, set aside at least two hours this Lent as a mini retreat, either alone in nature or in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Focus on him and ask him to share the secrets of his heart with you. He will. Then, as his friend, share the secrets in your heart.

EUCHARISTIC ENCOUNTER

St. Charles de Foucauld and Venerable Fulton Sheen both typify how encounter with our Eucharistic Lord gives shape to the rest of our lives.




ST. CHARLES DE FOUCAULD

St. Charles, who was dedicated to evangelizing non-Christians in the Sahara Desert, would spend several hours each day before the tabernacle, understanding that "Eucharistic life' evangelizes" (Pope Francis, "General Audience," October 18, 2023). St. Charles recognized that he needed to come to Christ in the Eucharist in order to be transformed by the Holy Spirit, filled with his strength, and made an evangelizing witness to the risen Christ (cf. Pope Benedict "Message to the Young People," 2008).

VENERABLE FULTON SHEEN

The Eucharist played a similar role for Venerable Fulton Sheen, who was widely known for his radio and television presence and his work with missions. Throughout the sixty years of his priesthood, Archbishop Sheen would spend an hour before the Blessed Sacrament each day. In his autobiography he writes, "The purpose of the Holy Hour is to encourage deep personal encounter with Christ. The holy and glorious God is constantly inviting us to come to Him, to hold converse with Him, to ask for such things as we need and to experience what a blessing there is in fellowship with Him. ... I have found that it takes some time to catch fire in prayer. This has been one of the advantages of the daily Hour" (Fulton Sheen, Treasure in Clay: The Autobiography of Fulton J. Sheen, 199-200). The venerable archbishop even desired to draw his final breaths in the presence of the Eucharist, which he did!




Dear Friends in Christ,





Give us the strength to defend human life against every influence or action that threatens or demeans it, as well as the strength to make every life more human in all its aspects.


Intentions for Each Mystery




