OUR PATRON, SAINT BARNABAS

Barnabas sacrificed himself to be instrumental in God's cultivation of His Church. Paul makes specific mention of the fact that Barnabas, who willingly impoverished himself in the interests of the Church, labored with his own hands to support himself on his missionary journeys. In Acts 4:36, Luke translates Barnabas to mean "son of encouragement" or "son of consolation." The original Greek word rendered "encouragement," *paraklesis*, means encouragement, consolation, comfort, exhortation and entreaty. It may be that the Apostles who gave Joseph the name Barnabas, saw all of these qualities in his character.

Gospel Meditation**Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

My childhood best friend was Xander Price. He was the fastest runner in school, an excellent baseball player and Jewish. Though his family wasn't intensely religious, I felt totally at home with them despite our religious differences. Everything about their Judaism seemed to undergird and strengthen my own experience of being a Catholic. I knew they didn't believe in Jesus like my family did, but I intuited somehow that Jesus was "hiding" in their religion. Like a cat moving under a blanket, ready to emerge at any moment, the Lord was hidden there in a special way.

In the Gospel for this third Sunday of Lent, Jesus says, **"For if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me, for he wrote of me"** (John 5:46). Stunning words, those. Moses wrote about Jesus. The way therefore that we come to know and believe in Jesus is to discover him lurking in Moses' writings. The Hebrew Scripture is the wonderful womb in which Jesus gestates within a host of images: Adam, Isaac, David, Melchizedek, the Temple, sacrificed lambs, prophets and so on. Right now, in your parish's OCIA program, soon-to-be baptized people are carefully studying where Jesus is in the writings of Moses, so that they may believe in him. This works for all of us, too, who wish to deepen our knowledge and love of Jesus.

Lenten challenge: Take some time to prayerfully study one of the images of Jesus listed above in the Old Testament. Identify which one you find compelling and consider why this is so. If you don't know where to start, begin with the prophet Jeremiah as an image of Jesus.

EUCCHARISTIC IDENTITY

St. Mary Magdalene and Blessed Carlos ("Charlie") Manuel Rodriguez both provide models of Eucharistic Identity. They show us how spending time with Christ leads us into missionary activity.



ST. MARY MAGDALENE

Through the Gospels, we read that St. Mary Magdalene had a persevering love for Jesus. She remained faithfully with him throughout his Passion, clinging to the foot of the Cross as Jesus died. In traditional iconography, Mary is depicted embracing the Cross or caressing Christ's feet as his Blood pours forth onto her. She was the first witness and herald of Christ after his Resurrection, earning her the title the "Apostle to the Apostles." Her awe, amazement, and joy when she encounters Christ in his Paschal Mystery—as well as her evangelization to the apostles—match the call we hear at the dismissal in Mass.

BLESSED CARLOS "CHARLIE" MANUEL RODRIGUEZ

Blessed Charlie likewise embodied what it means to have a Eucharistic identity. For him, this Eucharistic identity was lived out through his devotion to the Easter Triduum. He was fond of saying that "we live for that night," referring to the Easter Vigil. This statement is even found on his tombstone!

Blessed Charlie's life was a beautiful example that through the Eucharist—as a memorial of the Paschal Mystery—on every day the Church has called the Lord's Day she keeps the memory of the Lord's Resurrection, so that the whole year is transfigured by the light of the Resurrection. In his suffering, Blessed Charlie found strength and consolation in the Eucharist and the promises offered to us in the Resurrection. In this way, his whole identity was defined by these mysteries.

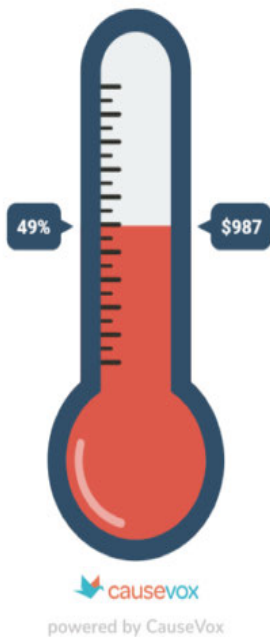
Dear Friends in Christ,

Rosary for Life

Opening Prayer

Almighty God, Our Father, You have given us life to know, love and serve You in this world, grant us Your grace. Enlighten our minds to an awareness and to a renewed conviction that all human life is sacred because it is created in Your image and likeness. Help us to teach by word and the example of our lives that human life is precious because it is the gift of God whose love is infinite.

Give us the strength to defend human life against every influence or action that threatens or demeans it, as well as the strength to make every life more human in all its aspects.

Intentions for Each Mystery

1. **Give us the grace** when the sacredness of life before birth is attacked, to stand up and proclaim that no one has the authority to destroy unborn life.
2. **Give us the grace** when a child is described as a burden or is looked upon only as a means to satisfy an emotional need, to stand up and insist that every child is a unique and unrepeatable gift of God, a gift of God with a right to a loving and united family.
3. **Give us the grace** when the institution of marriage is attacked, to affirm fathers and mothers in their vocations to build the domestic church.
4. **Give us the grace** when the sick, the aged or the dying are abandoned in loneliness, to stand up and proclaim that they are worthy of love, care and respect.
5. **Give us the grace** when basic necessities are denied the poor, to stand up and reaffirm the demands of justice and to work for their relief and defense.

Closing Prayer

Almighty Father, give us courage to proclaim the supreme dignity of all human life and demand that society itself give its protection. We ask this in Your name, through the redemptive act of Your Son and in the Holy Spirit. Amen.

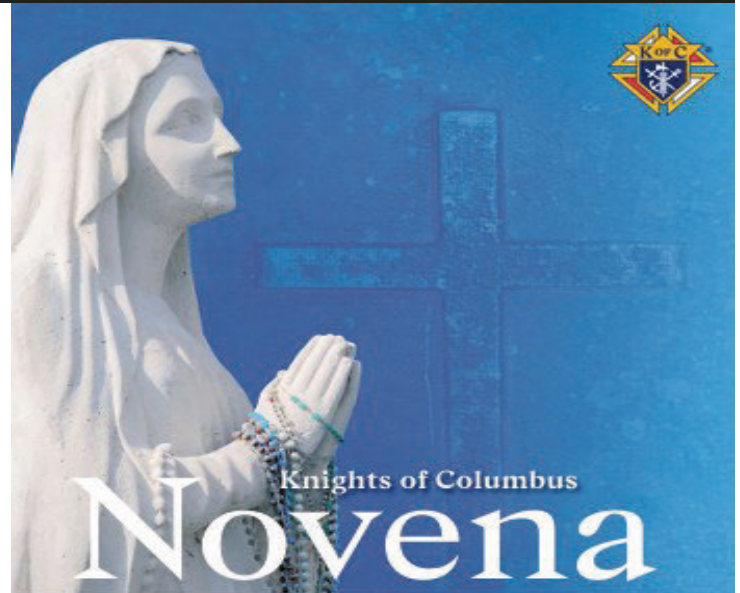

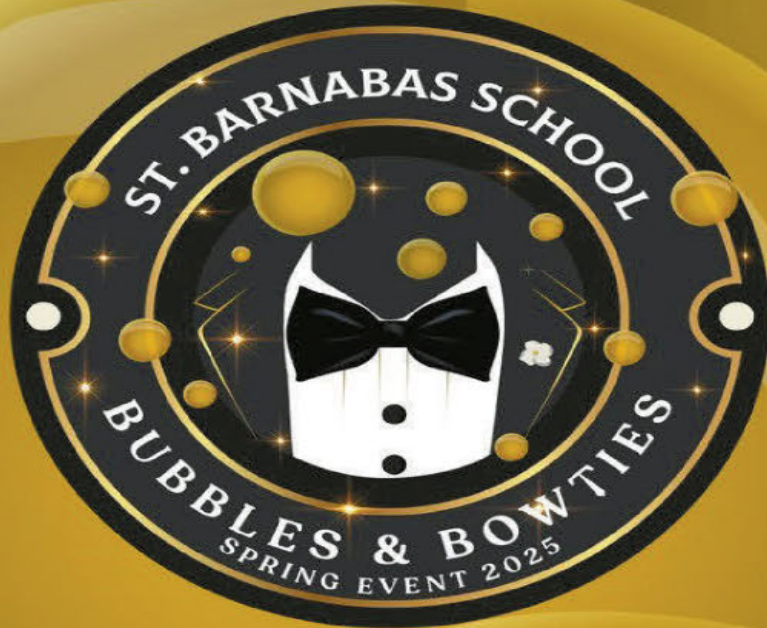

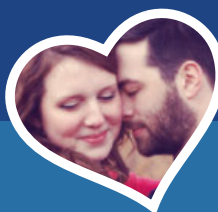
