# **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament**


Every Friday during Lent, except Good Friday 8:30 AM - 10:30 AM in the church



Stations of the Cross Every Friday during Lent Catholics 18-59 years of age in good health must fast (only one full meal) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics age 14 and older must abstain from meat Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

During Lent, we will "fast" from noise and observe ten minutes of silence prior to Mass. The assembly will be gathered and dismissed in silence with a bell, but no hymn.

# March 9-10 | | Why are children with disabilities at risk?

In many cases, this is because these children may be more vulnerable to grooming or exploitation by a perpetrator, need extra attention and care, which can lead to caregiver burnout and frustration, isolation from community, and financial strain. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles mandates all clergy, staff and volunteers who work in any capacity with or around children, the elderly, or people with special needs to complete the Protecting God's Children training & to be fingerprinted through the Archdiocese. This training must be renewed every 4 years. All OLA Liturgical Ministers must have up to date certification in order to serve at Masses.
