Open yourself to new life.

Doubt. Is doubt a bad thing? Not necessarily. Our doubts show us the aspects of faith and discipleship we need to bring to prayer, explore, and grow beyond. We can learn from Thomas (whose story we hear this month and who is forever remem-bered as "doubting"). Thomas expressed his doubts to the people whom he trusted and listened to their expressions of faith; he took his doubts to Christ, who showed him the way to faith; he moved from doubt to belief, later spreading the Gospel as a missionary.

Confusion. The disciples had experienced Jesus' arrest, witnessed his passion and crucifixion; knew he had died. Jesus had been brutally killed and he had been in the tomb for three days. Their faith was shaken; they were confused and perplexed. We are sometimes confused as well. Life is not always black and white; complex situations with no easy answers may leave us feeling unmoored, uncertain; we may question our faith or wonder about God and God's ways.

Longing. Most of us have moments in which we go through the motions. We get up, go to work or school, work out, go out with friends, or enjoy quiet at home, and start the next day no different than the one before. Then, occasionally, some-thing happens. We have a flash of insight, hear from a friend we haven't seen in a long time, are struck by a moment of beauty, a difficult circumstance arises, or we simply find ourselves longing for more, aching for meaning, purpose, and im-pact.

Amazement. It is easy to understand the astonishment of the disciples when they encountered the risen Jesus. He ap-peared before them offering his hands and his side - flesh and blood - as proof that it was really him and he was really alive. This month at Sunday Mass, we hear the stories of the early communities of believers and what took place after Jesus' res-urrection. The lives of the apostles and those who gathered with them were turned upside down by all that took place in Jesus' ministry, passion, death, and resurrection. They had to look at their lives differently as a result.

Peace. Jesus' message to the disciples is more than a nice greeting. He understands their confusion and uneasiness. The peace of Christ does not mean our lives will be absent of fear, confusion, grief, or dismay. Rather, the gift of the Lord's peace is the assurance that God holds us closely in love and mercy in the midst of the most perplexing of times. With Christ's peace in their hearts, Jesus entrusted his mission of forgiveness and love to disciples then and now.

New life. Filled with the Holy Spirit, the disciples opened their hearts and minds to the love of God in unexpected and powerful ways. In response, they shared with others: they told the stories of Jesus, gave their time and resources in care of those in need, and came together as people in community with one another. The same thing can happen to us: let us take this Easter season to open our minds and hearts to the love of God, and respond to this love by sharing: faith, time, prayer, talents, and resources, as Christ's people together.

How will you open yourself to new life this Easter season?

We hear how the early Christians lived in unity and holiness, bearing witness to Jesus, and living in community as friends. Which of these traits do you see at work in your faith community? (Acts 4:32-35)

Second Reading

John teaches his community that our faith in Jesus helps us "conquer the world." What struggles are you facing that you need to confront and defeat? (1 Jn 5:1-6)

Gospel Reading

The risen Jesus meets Thomas in the midst of his doubt and encourages him to believe. Who could you encourage this week to have faith in the resurrection of Jesus? (Jn 20:19-31)

We find unfathomable mercy and everlasting love in the wounds of Christ — even when we are skeptical, even when we carry doubt. God meets us there in the confusion. He reaches for our hand and places them at his side. We just have to call his name.

We are planning a wonderful evening Saturday, April 13, to celebrate the success of our collective effort on behalf of the poor in Haiti. It will be filled with the delightful company of generous people and all the first-class elements you have come to expect... a beautiful setting, music, great food and drinks, our presentation on the work of the foundation and moving testimonials from our volunteers, as well as our popular raffle and live auction.

It's a way of doing the most good where the need is greatest. Our dialysis center is the only such facility in the capital of Port au Prince, Haiti. Our patients depend on our services and risk their lives to come to us. The clinic can accommodate patients with three sessions per day on six machines. Our school of 189 students is thriving in the more peaceful rural region. Students have not missed a day of instruction. Our hospital in Marbial is also thriving. It provides the only local urgent care available to people who rarely see a doctor. Our maternity unit provides care during pregnancy, including sonograms, which enables us to schedule surgery elsewhere to save lives.

Normal labor and delivery is accommodated. We are trying to encourage people to address health issues at an earlier stage by offering a free open house three times a year.

We have close to 800 children and youth that are part of our School, Faith Formation and Youth Ministry Programs. Sometimes, in one single day, there are approximately 600 children and young people on our campus. We do everything we can to keep them safe. For example, all School and Parish staff and volunteers are certified in the VIRTUS: Protecting God's Children Program as well as being fingerprinted. There is always room to do more. Part of the solution is to make sure that we have enough safe adults that are sharing their faith and being a positive influence on these children and young people.


