Make a choice. Serve the Lord.

The disciples made a choice to remain with Jesus when others returned to their previous way of life. Joshua gathered the people together to renew their covenant with the Lord, asking them to declare their commitment to serve God rather than the idols of the nations that surrounded them. Joshua stated, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." (Jos 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b)



We, too, are called to declare and live our faith in God, boldly renouncing the idols that lure us away from God and God's ways and living abundantly in the Lord. Like the

people whom Joshua gathered, we too have a choice to make, once and for all and each and every day. Our daily decisions will bear out this great choice for Christ, knowing that the Lord will always be with us, strengthening us and offering us mercy when we fail.

Any time we think about our food sources, especially at this time of growing and harvest in North America, we have a beautiful analogy for abundance. What we put into our soil is what we see in our fruit. If we tend the soil of our lives with God's word, humility, love and attentiveness, our roots, stems and leaves will stay strong when the storms of life roll through. Furthermore, abundance is not always quantity, but quality. When a crop is well-rotated and soil is well-fertilized, its fruit will be sweet if not always plentiful. When we place our trust in the Lord our fruits are not always more time or more energy, but more patience and deeper understanding.

The people whom Joshua gathered had experienced the abundance of the Lord, from their escape from slavery in Egypt, water that flowed from the rock, manna that gave them daily nourishment, and entry into the promised land. In seeing the hand of God in the circumstances of their lives, they responded by putting their faith in the One whose goodness they had known, "Therefore we also will serve the Lord, for he is our God."

"Forsake foolishness that you may live; advance in the way of understanding," we hear from the book of Proverbs. Be rooted in Christ, the bread of life, who calls us to bring life to the world. See God's hand in the goodness that surrounds you. Let this recognition grow within you, draw you to the One who provides it, and respond by sharing and serving others with glad and generous hearts. Make a choice. Serve the Lord.

Virtus Training & Fingerprinting

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles mandates all clergy, staff and volunteers who work in any capacity with or around children, the elderly, or people with special needs to complete the Protecting God's Children training & to be fingerprinted through the Archdiocese. This training must be renewed every 4 years. All OLA Liturgical Ministers <u>must</u> have up to date certification in order to serve at Masses.

August 24-25 Teach children to evaluate sources

Your children will likely spend a significant amount of time online. All sources are not created equal, so teaching them to evaluate the information online is critical. Using concepts appropriate for their age, teach your children to consider the expertise, motive, and relevance of the information they consume. Being able to separate fact from fiction, and to evaluate the quality of the information received, will help your children assess truth. First Reading

Many followers of Jesus could not accept his teachings. To those that remained, he posed a simple question: "Do you also want to leave?" He asks us the same, every moment of every day. Let us answer with confidence, in all that we do: "Only you have the words of eternal life."

Domond Foundation Summer Report

Our own Deacon Joe Domond is the bearer of light and hope in Haiti, a country engulfed in darkness and violence. He is executive director of the Domond Foundation which sustains a hospital and Catholic school in the more peaceful countryside of Marbial. There students have not missed a day of school, and the hospital offers medical and dental services to people who have no other access to care. This is especially important for expectant mothers who receive prenatal care, access to a hospital for normal childbirth, and a way to anticipate the need



for specialized care at a larger hospital one hour away. The Foundation also operates a dialysis clinic in the more dangerous capital of Port Au Prince with 18 employees and 8 machines serving desperate patients. Deacon Joe will be returning to Haiti this month to supervise the programs and implement plans to add an operating room to the hospital. OLA parishioners



are invited to support this worthy mission with a contribution that goes directly to those in need. Donations may be brought to the parish office or mailed to The Domond Foundation, P.O.
