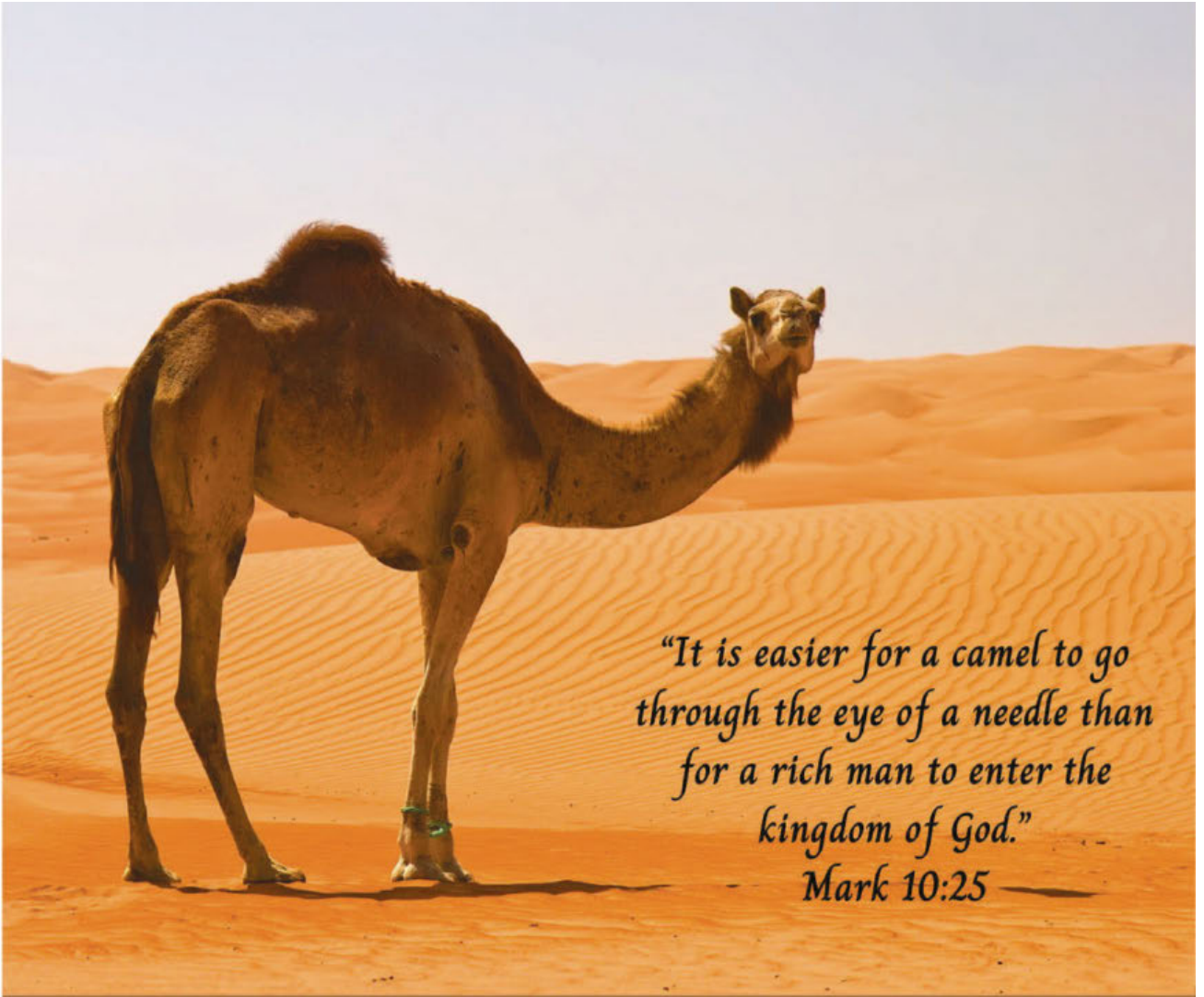

Roberto Roman retires from Lotería



Roberto Roman is the voice of our Spanish-speaking community, as director of the 1 p.m. Spanish Choir and also as chair of the Lotería Booth. "Lotería, lotería! Come, play Mexican Bingo," his cry has been welcoming guests to Fiesta since 2013. At 80 years of age, Roberto is ready to pass his Lotería microphone and other responsibilities to Felipe Pozos, his apprentice of eight years. Over the years, Roberto has seen it all – rain water flooding his booth one year, players insisting they won a prize, or others spending more than the value of a prize and walking away empty-handed. But the emphasis is always on fun and the irresistible draw of a large plaster saint or pet or piggy bank! By the way Roberto brought experience both as a choir director and as a Lotería Booth chair from St. Anthony Church in Rosemead in 1992. More recently he overcame a fall from his neighbor's roof and a stroke, which make him a "walking miracle!" We appreciate all he has done for the OLA community and recognize that there is really no "retiring" from ministry and the service of your fellow parishioners.


