Celebrating JOY during Advent

During the season of Advent, we await the celebration of Christ's birth and His coming again at the end of time. Over four weeks, we prepare our hearts for Christmas in penitential reflection. But in the middle of the season, Gaudete Sunday calls us to rejoice in hope!

What does Gaudete mean?

Gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin.

Why do we light a pink candle on Gaudete Sunday?

The Catholic Church uses the color rose to indicate a joyful feast day or holiday. Gaudete Sunday's counterpart in Lent is Laetare Sunday, another break in penance to rejoice in hope as we approach Easter. During both days, a priest will usually wear rose vestments.

Gaudete Sunday

Know:

Rejoice! While repentance is still a theme throughout Advent, as we are always called to conversion, the third Sunday of Advent is a transition point in our waiting—we look with joy toward the incarnation of God's Son. We are almost there, but not yet. We call this Sunday Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete, which means rejoice, is the first word said by the angel Gabriel when he visits Mary in today's Gospel. As you light the third candle, which is pink, symbolizing joy, remember to pray, in gratitude for all those who bring you happiness and joy.

Reflect:

On this Sunday of rejoicing, name all the reasons in your life that you have to be joyful. How often do you thank God for these great gifts? Do you spend more time thanking God for these gifts or complaining about the gifts you wished you had?

Pray:

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you, among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us, sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Saber:

¡Alégranse! Reflexionar:

En este domingo de regocijo, nombra todas las razones en tu vida por las que tienes que estar alegre. ¿Con qué frecuencia le das gracias a Dios por estos grandes regalos? ¿Pasas más tiempo agradeciendo a Dios por estos dones o quejándote de los dones que desearías tener?

Orar:

Dios te salve, María.Llena eres de gracia, el Señor es contigo. Bendita tú eres, entre todas las mujeres, y bendito es el fruto de tu vientre, Jesús. Santa María, Madre de Dios, ruega por nosotros, pecadores, ahora y en la hora de nuestra muerte. Amén

Archdiocese of Los Angeles Did You Know? December 14-15 || "No" is a complete sentence.

A critical boundary to learn for yourself and for your children is the word "no." Saying "no" to something you are uncomfortable with, or that you know is wrong, is sometimes the hardest thing to do, but it is so important. "No" is a complete sentence and should be honored by anyone listening. This is a great way to teach children how to listen to their friends and respect what they hear. This teaches children personal autonomy, which can extend to a child saying "no" to unwanted touches or behavior and potentially protect them from abuse and harm.
